

GARDENING TIMES

There are only 3 conifers that can truly be called native to these islands. The ones that we can call our own are the Scots Pine (Pinus sylvestris), the Common Juniper (Juniperus communis) and finally there is the mighty Yew tree (Taxus baccata), all the others are interlopers. The Yew is possibly second only to the Oak in writing the history of this country and its people.

They are particularly associated with churchyards in our collective consciousness, (and the y feature HEAVILY in ours). One of the reasons for this are that they are poisonous to browsing livestock and churchyards are places where cattle were never encouraged to graze. However, there is always more to that story than just greedy cows. There are at least 500 cases in Britain where the Yew trees that surround our churches are older than the buildings themselves. This suggests a relationship that goes back much further than at first seems obvious. We know that our Pagan forebearers thought of them as being particularly sacred, as having power and status amongst trees. The early church builders would have recognised this and may have deliberately positioned their place of worship in a place that was already venerated.

In Ankerwycke, next to Runnymede in Berkshire there is a Yew tree that is 2,500 years old. It is a wonder to behold. The National Trust, who owns it, says that it is the oldest tree under their stewardship. Its great age and presence has led it to being a place of pilgrimage for centuries.

Their dark, mysterious character has inevitably led us to create all sorts of folklore and stories about them. They were planted on the graves of plague victims to purify them, they are seen as a symbol of immortality because of their longevity. The wood has a very distinctive colouring, it is reddish and white so it inevitably became associated with the body and the blood of Christ. In Fortingall, Perthshire close to where I grew up there is a Yew where the local folklore states that "Pontius Pilate was suckled under when his father was a legionary during an early Roman expedition". I'm not entirely convinced that is true but boy, it is a great story.

And their greatness carries on, the autumn clippings of Yew trees make Taxol, an anti-cancer drug, this tree is not just a legacy of the past but continues to help us and the rest of God's creation. The "berries" are a rich source of winter food for our birds and small mammals.

This Christmas, when it seems that all of the trees are bare, everything is dead or hiding from the cold and the wet, spare a thought for the Yew tree, carrying on the work that it has done for millennia. Quietly, slowly but relentlessly doing its thing. There is a lesson in there somewhere.

Jobs to do in the Garden in December

- Choose a Christmas tree, not one of those plastic ones, a REAL one, locally grown.

- Now is the perfect time to be planting trees and shrubs, before the ground gets frozen and giving them time to get established before the growth of spring comes (it will come sooner than you think, I promise).

- Prune apples and pears, get them into some sort of shape. Also prune maples and birches now, if you do it in December you will avoid bleeding and losing any sap.

- Reduce the watering of houseplants, they get less sun, so they don't lose as much water. Don't leave them to swim around in a sodden pot!


- Take hardwood cuttings, they are the easiest. A cutting should ideally be the length and thickness of a pencil, bundle them all together and stick them in a pot, or the ground. Make sure that the exposed ends are in good contact with the soil and hopefully you'll have lots of babies in the spring.



play areas. We will put a note on the village Facebook page when we have a date. John Nicholls Tel:715331




Great Horwood St James 10th December 2 pm




