

New Year's Honour for Sheila Gurnett (MBE)

Sheila Gurnett, who lived in Great Horwood for many years and is still involved in village life, **has been awarded an MBE** (Member of the Order of the British Empire) for services to children and young people. The MBE is awarded for achievement or service in and to the community, which is outstanding in its field.

Sheila has worked tirelessly for over 50 years helping young people develop and fulfil their potential. A retired primary school teacher, lifelong Girlguider and youth worker, Sheila first opened a new Girlguiding group in Bletchley 1962. This was followed by various Guiding roles including running Rainbows in Great Horwood from 1996, and later, County Commissioner for Buckinghamshire. She is still actively involved with local Guiding groups and continues to train and mentor Guide leaders.

Alongside her Guiding work Sheila has also set up and run a Sunday school and spent many years as a youth worker. In 2001 she became a member of the Bucks Education Authority (12+) Appeals Committee and became involved with 'Family Group Conferencing', an organisation that helps families find solutions to problems they are experiencing.

Of her award, Sheila said: "I feel both humble and proud to be awarded such an honour, and receive it on behalf of so many volunteers in the community, in particular, Girlguiding leaders, who dedicate so much of their time and life year in and year out in order to prepare young people for the future"

February 1st is the feast day of the 5th Century St Brigid of Kildare, an important Irish saint, who with

"her white wand, is said to breathe life into the mouth of the dead Winter and to bring him to open his eyes to the tears and the smiles, the sighs and the laughter of Spring"

Alexander Carmichael (writer of the Celtic Carmina Gadelica).

In Christian history, St Brigid, inspired by her love of God, became a nun and an abbess and a recognised saint for the good works and miracles attributed to her. While like all saints there are myths and legends about her, the saintly attributes she is said to have portrayed include the gifts of the building up of community life, reconciliation and peace-making. She is also associated with weaving which the design of her cross shows (see above). She is known to be associated symbolically with the art of weaving together the vulnerable threads of community life so that peace and harmony can exist in the life of a city, town, village or hamlet. In Ireland, the making of a St Brigid's cross out of reeds is a traditional activity to mark the beginning of early spring.

As we go about our lives this month of February, let us be thankful for the signs of new life of early Spring such as the bright snowdrops that appear and the sense of hopefulness they can inspire; and be specially careful to contribute to the building up of good relationships with the people we come in touch with in this community of Winslow and wherever we find ourselves.

Lord God, creator of all things, who in your loving kindness and care meet our human needs: with the dawn of each day and the signs of new life in Spring, help us to go about daily lives with compassion and generosity that we may contribute in the building up of peace here on earth. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ. Amen



The Great Fire of Great Horwood In 1781 a terrible fire destroyed most of Great Horwood. I'm writing a piece about the fire for the village book and I'm trying

I'm writing a piece about the tire for the village book and I'm trying to find out what parts of the village were destroyed/damaged by the fire.

The parts of Great Horwood that hadn't been built on by 1781 obviously weren't hit by the fire, including, Greenway, much of Spring Lane and the cul-de-sacs that come off Little Horwood Road.

So far, we know that most of the High Street on the south side was burnt and some of the Green, including where The Crown now stands and Church Lane but some of the south side of The Green and most of Little Horwood Road seem to have escaped the fire.

What I don't know is whether the fire spread round the corner from the High Street to where The Swan is, Winslow Road or the top of Spring Lane or across the road to where the Village Hall now stands and that area. Nor do I know whether the fire spread from the north side of The Green to Nash Road or across the road to the east side of The Green or the end of Little Horwood Road where the old Methodist Chapel stands.

If you have any possible information about the fire please let me know. I'd particularly like to hear from the following:

anyone whose house dates back before 1781 and has burnt timbers, probably in the attic, or other fire damage;

anyone whose house was built in the 1780s or 1790s;

anyone whose house deeds mention a previous dwelling or barn on their plot being destroyed in the fire;

or anyone who knows any stories about the fire that might have been passed down to them from previous generations.



Neighbourhood Watch

Here are a number of items of interest from the January Neighbourhood Policing Newsletter for our area:

Crime in general is up by 9%, the main areas affected are Mursley, Newton Longville, Winslow, North Marston and Whitchurch.

A neighbouring area has had a number of burglaries where homes with uPVC doors have been targeted by criminals. It is important that residents ensure their uPVC doors are 'double-locked'. Doors are double locked by pulling up the internal handle and then turning the key - this ensures the door is held by the five point locking system.

Finally:- HAVE YOUR SAY

If you have anything that has annoyed, irritated or worried you, go to :- Henry's in the High Street, Winslow on the 14th of Feb or 13th of March between 10:00 -12:00 where you can have your say to local police Officers or PCSOs about local issues. No appointment is necessary.

Do remember this number:- 101

Use it to report a crime, contact a police officer - all police officers have mobile phones so you can leave a message for them to respond to when next on duty - or contact your local police station. 999 can also be used and will connect you to the emergency services, namely fire ambulance and the police. If you have information about crime but do not want to speak to the police, you can call Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111.

This research has taken her all over the UK including the Scottish boarders and the Welsh hills. The trail isn't completely cold and she hopes to continue following her ancestral line.

At our next monthly meeting on 14th February the subject is "Palmistry – character reading from your hand." Sylvia Kidby will be interpreting all those lines, bumps and creases enabling us to discover all sorts of things about ourselves.

CHAIRMAN'S MONTHLY REPORT LAST MEETING - MONDAY 6TH DECEMBER 2011

Community Consultation on the Neighbourhood Plan

The Parish Council's formal response to answer the questions that are being asked by AVDC Forward Plans Department about the level of development in homes and businesses that you would like to see in the parish during the next 20 years was confirmed at our meeting and was subsequently submitted to AVDC. A copy of the submission is available from our website or you can ask our Clerk for a copy. Also included in this copy of Focus you will find an insert giving a detailed analysis of all of your responses to the questionnaire.

Planning Matters

The Village Green on The Green is now registered in the ownership of the Parish Council.

In my article in the December issue of Focus I reported that the applicants had withdrawn the application for the proposed development of a detached single storey building and car park on Land at School End (11/00411/APP). Shortly afterwards, however, they submitted a new application for the "Erection of dwelling house with detached garage" (11/02449/APP)

Grit/Salt Bins

It was agreed a new grit bin would be installed at the village end of Nash Road near to the parking area. It was also agreed that a further grit bin would be installed at the end of Singleborough Lane at the junction with the A421.

New Speed Limits

In early December the long awaited new speed limits around village were finally introduced and I am pleased to say that they incorporated the additions requested by the Parish Council back in June 2009.

Footpaths Report

Robert Deuchar provided the following written report to the Council:

"A new metal pedestrian gate has been installed replacing one of the two difficult stiles on Footpath 4 between Pilch Lane and Singleborough. I am waiting to hear from Bucks County Council whether the other stile, at the same hedge/fence boundary can also be removed. All of the Parish's Footpaths and the bridleway have been inspected within the last five weeks and I am not aware of any problems".

Second Bus Shelter to be installed

As the cost of the replacement bus shelter in Little Horwood Road near The Green had been funded by a delegated budget allocation from Bucks CC it was agreed that the funds set aside by the Parish Council for this purpose could now be used to provide a new bus shelter in Little Horwood Road at the bus stop close to Townsend Cottages.

Allotments

All allotment holders have been sent letters asking if they would be interested in having a water supply installed on the site and how much they would be prepared to pay annually for the facility.

Diamond Jubilee

An independent committee has started work on the organisation of the village's celebration of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee and you can read a separate article on how things are progressing. We are hoping to be able to close off the High Street for the event which will take place during the afternoon and evening of the

Bank Holiday on Monday 4th June.

Also, see my other article earlier in the magazine about the availability of reduced price bunting.

Next Years Budget

We finalised our budget at the meeting and decided to keep the precept at the same level as in the current financial year so there will be no increase in the Parish Council's part of your Council tax hill




