## Medical Detection Dogs - local Charity in Great Horwood

This local charity in Great Horwood trains Medical Alert Dogs to assist children and adults to manage complex health conditions such as a serious form of Type 1 diabetes. The dogs identify the odour changes that are associated with these life-threatening conditions, alert their owners and so prevent medical emergencies.

The charity also trains Cancer Detection Dogs to detect human cancer from urine and breath samples. The hope is that this will lead to an early accurate, non-invasive screening tool and we plan to complete a breast and prostate cancer study in the near future.

#### Puppy Socialisers and Dog Fosterers Needed

The charity needs caring homes in this area to look after and socialise their puppies and young adult dogs up to around 16 months old .We are looking for people with time and commitment to provide the puppy with basic training, exercise and socialisation. The puppies need to visit lots of different environments and become familiar with children, animals and various forms of travel. They will also need to be taken to puppy training classes. You would need to be at home for most of the day and not leave the puppy for more than 3-4 hours so we cannot consider people who work full time. If you have your own animals or children this does not preclude you and can be discussed at application. Puppy socialisers receive regular support from one of the charity trainers and all veterinary costs, insurance, food and equipment is provided by the charity. In return there is the general reward and enjoyment of looking after a special dog. 



## Update from PCSO Alex Trivino and the Winslow & District Neighbourhood Team.

#### Parking Issues in Great Horwood.

The Great Horwood Parish Council has raised issues in relation to parking within the village: the issues raised are;



- Parking on Pavements
  - When parking your vehicle it is important that we remind you that obstructing the footpath and highway isn't best practice. The footpaths within the village are used regularly by local residents and school pupils, particularly during school arrival and leaving hours. By leaving the footpaths clear, we present a safer environment for children and parents to walk on. If vehicles are found to be obstructing the footpath, they will be dealt with by way of a £30 fixed penalty notice.
- Parking within the confines of a junction
  Drivers are reminded that parking within the confines of a junction can be dealt with by way of £30 fixed penalty notice. Vehicles parked within the junctions, on pavements or in the road can cause a danger to other road users and pedestrians. Keeping junctions open for drivers will increase the amount of visibility for that driver, therefore making pedestrians on foot more visible. This will reduce the likelihood of an accident occurring.

Please make every effort to keep the footpaths and junctions as clear as possible; together, we can make Great Horwood a safer village for all of its residents.

#### 'Thames Valley Alert' - formerly known as Ringmaster

Thames Valley Police has changed its service provider for the Community Messaging Service formerly known as Ringmaster.

The new messaging system will be known as 'Thames Valley Alert' and your details will automatically be transferred over to the new system, so there is no need to re-register if you receive your messages by email or telephone.

The new system does not offer a FAX option for sending messages, so if you currently receive messages by FAX and wish to continue to receive Community Messages, please contact your Community Messaging Administrator on the non-emergency telephone number 101 or re-register online: www.thamesvalleyalert.co.uk after Tuesday 3rd April.

Thames Valley Alert will enable you to receive messages via voice, email or text. You will be pleased to see that in response to the suggestion that texts would be more useful to you Thames Valley Police has now included this facility in the new messaging system.

#### Neighbourhood Watch

Once again Community Safety Officers are warning that as evenings are darker, burglars will be on the prowl for valuables and cash. Repeating advice given last year by The Aylesbury Vale Community Safety Partnership:



- Make your home appear occupied with a light timer switch. These switches can be set to come on at a specific time when you are still at work and can be used on all sorts of appliances such as lamps and TV's.
- Lockup your home. Make sure you lock all doors and windows securely, this is especially important with UPVC doors: lift the handle and turn the key.
- Make sure your shed or garage is secure so entry cannot

- be gained and your tools used to break into your home.
- Properly mark your household valuables with a UV pen (mark house number and postcode). You should also properly mark tools in your shed or garage.
- Do not display items in your home. Keep mobile phones, money and keys out of sight and away from entry points in the home. Keys can be hooked through letterboxes so make sure they are stored away securely.
- If you are going away, cancel milk and newspaper deliveries, set your timer switch.
- Be vigilant of your neighbours' property, if you spot something suspicious call the police on the non-emergency number 101. If you believe a crime is in progress call 999.





## CHAIRMAN'S MONTHLY REPORT LAST MEETING - MONDAY 14TH JANUARY 2013

#### Parish Council Budget 2013/14

We had to have a brief meeting in January in order to set our budget and precept for 2013/14 as in December the Government announced that the replacement scheme for Council Tax benefits called Localised Council Tax Support, would affect Parish Councils whereas it had previously been expected that we would be excluded. What this meant is that AVDC had to issue lower Council Tax Base numbers for our parish and this would have meant that we would receive 10% less in our precept. However the Government also announced that it would provide a grant to make up 90% of this shortfall and AVDC has agreed to make up the difference for this first year of this change. This means that our income from these sources for 2013/14 will be £17992.31 from Great Horwood Parish Council Tax payers, £1794.26 from the government grant and £94.43 from AVDC. This also means that there will be no change in the amount of Council Tax that residents of the parish will pay for the parish council tax part of the overall council tax bill. It is not clear what will happen with these additional grants for future years when we may find that we get less money from our precept or that we have to raise the level of Council Tax to keep our income at the same level.

#### Planning Matters

AVDC have granted approval to the retrospective Planning Application (12/00862/APP) for 'The Hedgerows' which is the very large farm house and associated facilities that were built on the other side of the A421 more or less opposite Great Horwood Football Club.

At the time of writing this report AVDC had not determined the latest in a number of applications to build a detached property in the garden of 11 The Green (12/02584/APP). Your Parish Council and a number of occupants of adjacent properties have lodged objections to the proposal which is, of course, within the village Conservation Area. If the AVDC officers are minded to give permission for the development then as the Parish Council have objected the application will have to be considered by the AVDC Development Control Committee for a decision.

The appeal against AVDC's refusal to grant planning consent for the "Erection of dwelling house with detached garage on Land at School End" has been dismissed. (11/02449/APP)

#### Road Closure B4033

We have received notification that the B4033 will be completely closed at the Washbrook Bridge to carry out waterproofing over the bridge. The planned closure is from 4th March to 1st April and there will be no access even for emergency vehicles. The proposed diversion route is via the A421 to Thornborough and then via Padbury and the A413. A copy of the Temporary Traffic Regulation Order is lodged on the Parish Council website and posted on the notice boards in the High Street and the Village Hall.

#### Movable Vehicle Activated Signs

The necessary surveys to confirm the positions of the sites for the Movable Vehicle Activated Speed Signs (MVAS's) is due to be carried out shortly to ensure that the equipment can be provided and installed during the current financial year which ends in March.

#### Footway at the top of Nash Road

Transport for Buckinghamshire is still confirming that the footway from the Cricket Ground towards the A421 to meet the existing cycle path will be completed before the end of March.

#### Paving on The Green.

The short muddy pathway that led from the top of Nash Road on to The Green has now been paved. Another small improvement to the village by your Parish Council.

#### Conservation Area Review

The final revised 2 Conservation Areas for Great Horwood and Singleborough were approved by the AVDC Cabinet on 18th December and are now as shown on page 12.

The maps and a copy of the appraisal documents, which describe in detail the appearance and characteristics of the Conservation Areas that

make them special and worthy of designation, are available on the Parish Council and the Aylesbury Vale District Council websites.
