



Taylor Wimpey Planning Application to build 42 houses on land off Weston Road

Planning Enquiry set for 15th - 18th March

This planning application was approved by Aylesbury Vale District Council (AVDC) in September last year. However, the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government, Greg Clark, 'called in' the application, meaning that the AVDC approval is void and he will make the decision on the application.

The first step to 'calling in' the application is that a Planning Inquiry is to be held over 4 days, 15th -18th March starting at 10am. The location has not been confirmed but is likely to be in AVDC's offices in Aylesbury.

The Inquiry will be led by an inspector from the 'Planning Inspectorate', a government agency. Evidence will be heard from the three parties involved in the application, namely:

- Taylor Wimpey
- AVDC
- Great Horwood Parish Council

Written submissions will be made in advance of the hearing and each of the three parties will be represented by Legal Counsel who will present their case. Witnesses will be called and cross examined. The main witness for Great Horwood will be Neil Homer, the planning consultant who helped create our neighbourhood plan. Local resident David Saunders will also be a witness, having been involved with the preparation of the plan from the beginning, and played a lead role in opposing the planning application and the subsequent fight to overturn the AVDC approval.

Once the hearing is over the inspector will write a report for Secretary of State Greg Clark, who will make the final decision on the application.

The Inquiry is open to the public, so residents are welcome to attend (just turn up). Residents can speak at it too, even if they are not formal witnesses - the procedure for this will be outlined by the inspector on the first day.







Message from PCSO Wendy Taylor

Driving in the winter monthsWhilst the weather has been unseasonally warm, the sharp drop in temperature has,

hopefully, stirred us from a false sense of security and encouraged us all to think about our vehicle's preparation for the winter weather.

- Please ensure your brakes, wipers and tyres are in good condition and the tyres are inflated to the correct pressure
- ensure the coolant has the correct amount of antifreeze
- Buy de-icer/scraper for windows and clear all windows before you drive anywhere. It is dangerous to start your journey with a small peephole to peer through until the heater clears the rest of the screen. Clearing the screens with de-icer/scrapers also prevents the temptation to leave the car on your driveway, with engine running, warming up. Doing that will mean your car is then ready, warm with screens clear, for an offender to get in and drive away. And your insurance company will certainly not support you.
- Finally, ensure all your lights and indicators are working correctly. Remember that fog lights are only needed in fog and it is an offence to use them when there is 100m or more visibility. Check, too that dipped and full beam work properly. We see so many vehicles where this is not so and it can simply be that the headlight bulb has been inserted upside down.

Please also ensure you are driving to the road conditions and not the road's speed limit. We have already had a lot of call outs for vehicles ending up in ditches because they have hit black ice too fast. The clue is your windscreen – if you have scraped ice from the windscreen, chances are there is ice on the road. Take heed!

Elderly targeted by fake police officers

There has been a recent series of incidents whereby fraudsters either phone or attend the home address of elderly members of the public, claiming to be police officers.

The fake officer/s will claim that they are investigating a fraud which they believe the elderly person to be a victim of. The fake officer/s will then request the bank cards and personal identification numbers (PIN) of the victim and claim these are needed for investigation purposes. If the first contact was made by a phone call, the fake officer/s will tell the victim that someone will be over to collect the evidence. In one case the victim was instructed to attend their local bank and withdraw all of the money from their account. The suspect was left alone in the victim's house whilst the victim carried out the instructions.

Protect yourself:

- Before letting anyone into your home who claims to be from any law enforcement agency, ask to see their identity card and check it by calling 101
- Ask if they can attend at a pre-arranged time when a family member or friend can also be present
- If you receive a phone call from a police officer, ask for their name and force and tell them you will call them back. Wait a few minutes and then use 101 to call them back through their force's switchboard and verify their identity
- The Police will never ask for your PIN or passwords. Do not give this information to anyone
- The Police will never request that you withdraw/ transfer any money to them.

A PLEA TO DOG WALKERS...

We have many excellent footpaths in the area, most of which go through Farmers fields.

Sadly, in the past few months there have been two occasions where Sheep in these fields have contracted diseases and, as a result, had to be put down. There has also been at least one occasion where Sheep have been frightened and injured by a dog.

These diseases were most likely caused by the sheep eating dog faeces (poo), which causes sarcocystosis – a neurological disease. (Dog faeces can also cause abortions in cattle).

So the request to dog owners is:

- 1. Please keep your dog on its lead as you go through fields with livestock in them
- 2. Please pick up after your dog do not leave your dog's faeces in the field

Tara takes steps towards £10k target for children's charity CANTELLS GIG IN GREAT HORWOOD ON SATURDAY 6th FEB 7.30PM



Little Horwood resident Tara Garritt is putting her best foot forward to help sick and disabled babies and children by tackling a five-day hike in India **in aid of Action Medical Research.**

Action Medical Research has been funding medical breakthroughs since it began in 1952, including helping to introduce the first polio vaccines in the UK, developing the use of ultrasound in pregnancy and testing the rubella vaccine. It is currently funding research into meningitis, Down syndrome, epilepsy and premature birth, as well as some rare and distressing conditions that severely affect children.

The 43-year-old is heading to the Himalayas as part of her mission to raise £10,000 for the UK-wide children's charity in 2016. In October she will walk from Dharamsala, the spiritual home of the Dalai Lama, through spectacular mountain landscapes and sleep under the stars in remote mountain camps before finishing the challenge at Laka Got, 3550m above sea level and well above the Himalayan snowline.

She's no stranger to extreme outdoor adventures, having already trekked through Jordan from the Dead Sea to Petra in April last year in temperatures up to 40C.




