



The Bands Christmas engagements went very well. The concert in the United Reformed Church in Potterspury on December 2nd was well attended by an appreciative audience and the organisers have invited us to perform another Concert in December this year.

The Concert in the Great Horwood Village hall raised £175 for the Great Horwood Scout group.

The carol singing around the tree in Adstock was very well attended with Villagers singing with the band. Punch and mince pies were served and a collection was made for Willen Hospice.

The band used the new stand lights for the first time for this occasion. They proved outstandingly successful and very useful indeed. Photos of the lamps can be seen on our website home page.

We thank the Great Horwood Parish Council for so generously providing us with the grant to purchase the lights, as we will now be able to perform on occasions where there is poor or no lighting provided.

The band played Carols on three occasions at Tesco Buckingham in December and were very well received, with many complimentary comments from both Staff and Customers.

Rehearsals are now beginning for the Band's annual Concert in the Buckingham Community Centre in March.

We are already receiving requests for the band to play at various functions during the summer.

Last year the band raised £1859 for other charities, including Medical Detection Dogs, Great Horwood Youth Club, Diabetes UK, British Heart Foundation, Great Horwood Village Hall, Potterspury United Reformed Church and Alzheimer's UK.

We thank the volunteers who collected for us over the Christmas period and those who helped at the concerts, these volunteers are vital to the success of the band and we are very grateful to them.

Chairman's Monthly Report: Last Meeting - Monday 11 December 2017

The Parish Council was saddened and shocked at the beginning of December to learn of the untimely Great Horwood death of John Scholtens. John was Parish Council a member of the Parish Council for several years and Chairman for a

year. He was much involved in the early stages of the development of the Great Horwood Neighbourhood Plan. The December meeting marked his death with a minute's silence and sent its sincere condolences to his family.

At the December meeting it was good to be able to make grants to support various organisations which contribute to the life of the village - including the School, the Football Club, the Silver Band, the Scouts and the Winslow Community Bus. The Parish Council received reports on footpaths and Horwode Pece. The Council is very grateful for all the unsung work carried out keeping these facilities in such good order throughout the year for enjoyment by the community.

Planning matters take up a great deal of the Parish Council's time. At the December meeting it was noted that AVDC had approved the reserved matters application in relation to the redevelopment of the Horwode Mill site.

It is good that this derelict and dangerous building will be removed. The Neighbourhood Planning team initially considered including the former Mill site in the Neighbourhood Plan arguing that it was the only brownfield site in the parish and many residents wished it to be used for housing.

This did not meet with AVDC's approval at that stage, despite repeated requests. Nevertheless, a planning application to build seven houses on the site was made and was approved on appeal in 2016. Since then the proposal has been modified in respect of the size and design of the houses, the removal of a pedestrian access through Horwode Pece, the provision of a pedestrian access on to Spring Lane and the inclusion of restricted vehicle access for the residents to Spring Lane. The only remaining area of difference was the question of access.

Great Horwood Parish Council had argued strongly for access to be restricted to the road through Greenway Business Park - as proposed in the initial planning application. It is disappointing that AVDC were not persuaded by the Parish Council's detailed argument that access to these proposed properties should be through the Greenway Business Park rather than along Spring Lane and thus protect the residents of Spring Lane from additional traffic.

The Parish Council agreed to write to AVDC to propose that in the interests of safety of residents of Spring Lane and, in particular, users of Horwode Pece, that the Construction Management Plan should require access for the development of the site to be through Greenway Business Park.

Mick also downloads traffic speed statistics for the PC and you might like to know that the average speed of traffic (I have simplified the data) has reduced from 42 mph

Bucks County Council have sent the following press release about potholes.

It's pothole season

This winter's weather has been tough on Buckinghamshire's roads - while the heavy snowfall in December was the most remarkable weather event, the worst conditions for roads are actually when the ground temperature fluctuates constantly between just above and just below zero.

Pothole formation is accelerated by this 'freeze-thaw' effect, whereby moisture gets into small cracks in the road surface and expands when it freezes, then thaws out when the temperature rises. This process repeats until the road surface begins to break up and potholes are formed.

County Councillor Mark Shaw, Cabinet Member for Transportation, urges road users in Buckinghamshire to report potholes when they see them:

"Transport for Buckinghamshire will investigate every pothole reported to them, and react on a risk based prioritisation process – put simply, that means the worst ones will be attended to first, as a matter of urgency. But we're not mind readers, and the road network is far too vast for us to possibly know where all the potholes are.

Pothole FAQ:

•You fixed one pothole, why didn't you fix the one next to it while you were here?


Potholes are prioritised according to risk – if they are on very well used roads, they are more of a priority. Size and depth are also factors. Resources have to be used responsibly, and cannot be used up fixing a more minor road surface defect when there are more urgent defects needing attention just up the road.

- Why can I only report one pothole online at a time? Our online reporting system works on an interactive map, so that each individual defect can be risk assessed and dealt with on a case by case basis. The map allows for accurate pinpointing, which saves time when it comes to inspections.
- Why do you make temporary repairs that don't last? Temporary repairs, where the pothole is filled in with hot material and made smooth, are often carried out as a safety measure when a permanent repair cannot be carried out at that moment, likely due to the location of the defect.
 How do I report a pothole?

You can report potholes, as well as any other road issue, using the Report It forms on the county council website. In an emergency, for instance a severe road defect, a flooded road, or a tree in the road, you can always call Transport for Buckinghamshire on 01296 382416 or 486630 (out of hours). The online reporting tool is at www.buckscc.gov.uk/services/transport-and-roads/report-a-problem/report-a-pothole/






