Great Horwood Parish Council

PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS

I mentioned in December that the Parish Council elections were postponed until 2020/21 due to the handover from AVDC to a unitary authority. It has now been confirmed that the next District, Town and Parish Council elections will take place in 2020.

OXFORD CAMBRIDGE EXPRESSWAY

The Parish Council has attended its first meeting on the new expressway. As expected this meeting yielded little information as planning is in its very early stages and decisions still have to be taken, amongst other things, on the exact route. We received our second "newsletter" which can do little more than touch base at the present time but it does give the PC the opportunity to raise questions. There will be a public consultation phase in the future but if any resident would like us to ask a question before then, please contact the Clerk.

ICE CARDS

At the time of writing, we have begun delivery of ICE cards (in case of emergency) to all households in Great Horwood, one for each registered voter. Extra cards can be obtained from the Clerk. Things always happen when we least expect them. Please consider using the tear off cards to record



your emergency contact details and emergency medical information. It could help in an emergency and enable your next of kin to be contacted quickly.

Since thanks to those who helped to deliver the cards.

ELECTRICITY SUBSTATION

Western Power Distribution have advised us that they will be building an electricity substation on the verge between The Close and Western Road. Affected residents living close to the site have been informed. This is an unwelcome development but we have been informed that WPD have "permitted rights to site equipment on Highway land (i.e. land owned by Bucks County Council). We have asked them to consider siting it on the new development but they have refused to do this as they say that the substation is also required to provide extra demand from existing properties. We are grateful for the advice given by Mr David Saunders on this matter. The maximum permitted size is 29 cubic metres which is difficult to visualise but I have pinned them down to agreeing that it will be the same size as the existing box on Winslow Road. Sadly, it will not be so easy to camouflage.

BUDGET 2019/2020

Residents might like to know that a Parish Council budget has been passed for 2019/2020. The amount of money available to the Council is slightly higher than last year due to additional housing, however, Great Horwood council tax payers may be pleased to know that once again there will be no rise in the Parish Council element of your council tax bill. We cannot promise that this will be true in 2020/21 as there are projects that might need to be considered. Obviously I cannot tie the Parish Council to any commitments but the sort of things that might arise are extra funding for Horwode Pece as regulations require higher and higher standards, traffic calming surveys/ measures, street light upgrading to LED (the street lighting loan will finally be paid for in 2022) and extra funding for the Neighbourhood Plan revision.

SPEEDING

Mick Wood is our much valued MVAS (Mobile Vehicle Activated (speed) System) caretaker. Thankfully, his wife Gill has also been seen acting as safety officer when moving the box from the less than safe Winslow Rd. He recharges the box every couple of weeks and downloads the data. Whilst monitoring the



speed of drivers on Winslow Rd he has noted a reduction in average speed from almost 42 mph to about 39 mph (12/11/2018). It is still too high but is good news. The factors that could be affecting this are the MVAS, Speed Watch and the newly painted 30 mph roundel and yellow rumble (ish) strips on the approach to the village. To keep up the momentum we still require more Speed Watch volunteers. Please volunteer and speak to Jane Holland.

SCHOOL CROSSING PATROL

A great deal of effort was put in by Bucks County Council in previous years to recruit a village school crossing patrol officer, including extensive publicity, visits to events, cut out cardboard officers and



adverts on beer mats. However, there is a county wide shortage of people willing to undertake this task. Great Horwood did set the money aside to pay an officer but as it wasn't being used, reallocated it for contingency. If anyone were to offer to fill the post, the plan could easily be resurrected. All you have to do is contact the Parish Clerk.






