
I have just signed on again for 2021 and would like to encourage anyone reading this to take part in this years Country Walking Challenge.

VALENTINE'S DAY RECIPES

for your loved one.

Both easy, no fuss with minimal preparation time.



TOP TIP: Always read the entire recipe and method before you begin, that way you avoid any hiccups.

Steak with sticky shallot sauce.

Ingredients

8 shallots peeled and quartered but left whole at the root.

2 sirloin/ rump steaks about 175g/6oz each

1tsp crushed black peppercorns

25g butter

4tbsp balsamic vinegar

large glass red wine,

150ml beef stock

1tsp honey or brown sugar

Method

Step 1

Simmer the shallots in a pan of water for 2-3 mins, then drain and set aside.

Season the steaks with a little salt and plenty of crushed peppercorns.

Heat half the butter in a pan until sizzling, then cook the steaks for 3-4 mins on each side for medium or until done to your liking.

Step 2

Remove the steaks and keep warm.

While they rest, add the remaining butter to the pan, throw in the shallots, then sizzle in the sticky pan until starting to brown.

Add the balsamic vinegar and bubble for a few mins.

Add the wine and boil down until sticky, add the beef stock with the honey and reduce until everything comes together and slightly thickened.

Spoon the shallots sauce over the steaks and serve with green beans and chips.

Baked sea bass with a lemon caper dressing

Ingredients

2 Sea bass fillets

Plus Olive oil for brushing

For the dressing.

2 tbs extra virgin olive oil

Grated zest 1/2 lemon plus 1 tbsp juice.

1 tbsp small capers

1 tsp Dijon mustard.

1 tbsp chopped parsley.

Method

Step 1

To make the dressing, mix the oil with the zest, juice, capers, mustard and season. Don't add the parsley yet (unless serving straight away) as the acid in the lemon will discolour the parsley if left together too long.

Step 2

Heat the oven to 220c/ 200c fan/ gas 7.

Line a baking tray with baking parchment and lightly brush with oil. Place fish skin side up onto the parchment, brush with oil and season. Bake for 7 mins or until the flesh flakes when tested with a knife.

Arrange the fish on a warm plate and spoon over the dressing.

Serve with new potatoes and wilted spinach.

THE GREAT HORWOOD SCHOOL **EDUCATION SYSTEM BY ELIZA GUNN**

This new method of learning may have a fault with the struggling internet and Wi-Fi, but other than that it is almost better than attending school, as the teachers still have to access to help all of their students.

The lessons we can do.

We can do Maths, English, Science and even PE. When in school, we all have separate headphone and chrome books to use in class. We may use the headphones on the Google Meet calls so we can join in and answer questions from the teacher, even though they are in the same room.

What we may need help with

There are many fun things about Google Classroom that are educational. However, we do sometimes run into difficulties with French or Maths when the boxes created do not work and we have to learn how to add in our own to complete our work.

TRANSPORT QUESTIONNAIRE

In the December issue of Focus was a printed questionnaire in which I asked all households some questions about their use of bus services in the village, I received 48 responses, 26 used the paper copy and 22 filled in the online version. This represents only about 12 % of the households in the parish.

Four of the households had no access to a car and 2 others only had access to a car sometimes. 42 of the 48 households never or rarely used a bus service.

In response to the question Is there anywhere you would like to go by bus but currently cannot get there?

18 of the responses indicated that they would not use a bus service.

The most popular destinations for those who would consider using a bus service were MK – 13, Buckingham 12, followed by Aylesbury 5, Winslow 4, and Stony Stratford 3.

I have discussed the results with representatives of Buckinghamshire Council and they have advised that based on our survey it is very unlikely that we will be able to get any significant improvement in the commercial bus services for the village.

However, I am aware that for a small number of residents the use of a bus is very important and even vital.

So I am going to have further discussions with the Chairman of Trustees of the Winslow and District Community Bus to see if we can find a way of providing a more regular service by the bus, when the pandemic subsides, which may enable us to link in with the much more regular bus services that go through Winslow to Aylesbury, Buckingham and MK.

However, there is always a need for more volunteer drivers for the bus and so if have even a few spare hours a month you might want to consider signing up.







