Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan new consultation

AVDC have been working on their new local plan (the "VALP") for over two years, and last autumn they held a consultation on a number of options for development in the Vale. These all proposed quite a high level of housing growth in Great Horwood, with 100-120 new houses, as we were classified as a "large village".

Following the consultation, a draft version of the VALP has now been produced, and there will be another consultation over the summer. Great Horwood has been reclassified as a "medium village", and the proposal is now specifically for us to have an additional 81 new houses, still rather more than in our Neighbourhood Plan, but within reach when account is taken of houses already built or agreed, and the Neighbourhood Plan's reserve site. Clearly the comments sent in last autumn have been taken into account.

Another point from the draft VALP relevant for us is that, to avoid over-expansion of villages, AVDC plan to build a brand new town, eventually with 6,000 houses and with its own employment areas, shops, schools, and so on. Two possible sites are being considered, near Haddenham or near Winslow, with a preference for Haddenham as it already has a railway station, it is near the M40 motorway, and is better placed to satisfy housing need from areas in the Chilterns where building is constrained.

http://www.aylesburyvaledc.gov.uk/ (click on the VALP link near the bottom of the page) and there will be drop-in consultation events over the summer, including one in Buckingham Community Centre on 13th of July (11am to 8pm) and another in Winslow Public Hall, Elmfields Gate on 10th of August (10am to 6pm). The consultation itself is open from 7th July to 5th September for residents to send in their comments. If you can't attend a drop in session, the web site above will have details from the 7th of July on how you can comment on the plan.







<u>Try Aikido</u>

You're invited to come along and try the Japanese martial art of Aikido with **Milton Keynes Aikido Club,** who practise from **7.15 pm – 8.30 pm on Wednesdays at Hazeley Academy** in Milton Keynes (Emperor Drive, Hazeley MK8 OPT). All ages



and levels of fitness (or unfitness!) are most welcome, and you'll find that we're a relaxed and friendly bunch. And, at the moment, 40% of our members are female, so we're definitely not a boys-only sport!

There are lots of videos and photos on our public Facebook page *www.facebook.com/mkaikido*, and the following Q&A answers some of the questions we hear most frequently:

What is Aikido? Aikido is a system of self-defence against single or multiple attackers which uses arm and wrist locks and throws to neutralise the attack without causing death or serious injury to the assailant. Aikido is a fusion of several earlier martial arts in Japan.

Do I need to be physically fit? No. You'll find that our training sessions are very relaxed and very much pitched at the level of each student. But if you have a medical condition or disability which you think might affect your training we suggest that you have a word with your GP first.

What are the benefits of Aikido? You'll quickly find that your health, well-being and general fitness will improve, and you'll also become rather more flexible and agile. And, because you're learning a system of self-defence, your confidence and self esteem will also increase. Plus, we actually enjoy each other's company, so we arrange social events too!

Are there any age limits? No. We welcome schoolage youngsters and there is no upper age limit. **Could I get hurt?** It's unlikely. Aikido is not a fullcontact combat sport and you and your training partner work together – you're not fighting each other. We also work on mats which absorb the impact of our breakfalls and we also use crash mats to build confidence.

What will I need to wear? For your first session or two, you just wear something comfortable that you can move in. A tee shirt and track suit or jog bottoms are fine, and no need to worry about footwear, as we work on the mat in bare feet. If you decide to sign up with us, we'll ask you to choose a "gi" (martial arts training uniform).

Is it expensive? Good news – Aikido is NOT an expensive sport to get involved in. Your first session with us is completely FREE, with no strings attached. If, after the first session, you decide you'd like to sign up with us, for just £15/month (adults) or £10/month (juniors/concessions) you get four – occasionally five – weekly sessions. At that stage you also pay your first annual membership fee to the British Aikido Association (BAA), which is £30 (adults) or £20 (juniors/concessions), and includes BAA insurance cover for your training. The only other "up front" cost is for your gi (training uniform) at £15-£25. If you'd like to find out more, please have a look at our club Facebook page www.facebook.com/mkaikido

Domestic theft

At this time of the year we are all spending more time in the garden. Make sure front windows and doors are locked while you are out at

the back. Don't leave your garage door open for everyone to see what you own, particularly if there is a door from the garage into the house. Thieves will remember such things if they see it and could access your house from a less secure garage.

Ensure your garden shed is locked after every use. Yes, it is pain to have to do it but it is even more hassle to replace a stolen item, repair the damage caused and be restricted in what you want to do because the item has been taken.

Rural Crime

Note to all equestrians: The show season has begun; for some it never stops. However, when attending an event please be security-wise. There will be a time when no-one is at your trailer/car or horsebox. Please put your equipment into the lorry/car and lock it. Recently at a showjumping event 2 Devoucoux saddles were stolen from the lorry. At £3,500 each, these are high value thefts. Incidents like this happen frequently just because lorries and cars are left insecure. Remember – apathy is the thief's best friend. Please do not become a victim this season. Talk to your local neighbourhood policing teams who will be happy to help with crime prevention ideas and tack marking. There is a lot of information on www. thamesvalleyhorsewatch.org.uk so check it out.

Again, there has also been recent thefts of horse medication. It is not abating so I remind everyone, do not be a victim, do not leave packets of drugs on the stable yard. Just take the doses required for the day to the yard and leave the rest at home.

We have not been receiving many Dogwatch

messages recently and I have been told that there has been a general decrease in the numbers of dogs being taken. Not sure if this ties in with the legal requirement to have all dogs microchipped but it could be an influencing factor. However, do not be complacent and ensure you are always aware of where your dog is.

Warning - bogus tradesmen fixing tumble dryers

Recently, there has been a lot of press coverage regarding tumble dryers which could burst into flames. Manufacturers have identified the machines and advised owners to get remedial work done. This, as you can imagine, has paved the way for bogus tradesmen to jump onto the bandwagon and call you to make an appointment to sort out your tumble dryer.

I would suggest that you call the manufacturer who will advise you on your best course of action In a recent incident the 'tradesman' who called mentioned the name 'KnowHow'. An appointment was made but the customer had to change it. She called 'KnowHow' and that is when she discovered the tradesman had nothing to do with 'KnowHow'.

Chairman's Monthly Report : Last Meeting – Monday 13 June 2016



The walkers amongst you will have seen that footpaths in the parish have recently been cleared of overgrowth. The Council thanked

Great Horwood Robert Deuchar, our Footpaths Monitor, Parish Council for this and for all that he does to keep our

footpaths in such good order and to such a high standard. I am sure that our footpaths are the best in the locality.

The Council noted the report of the Horwode Pece This Committee and its Management Committee. volunteers have been working hard to keep the Rec in good order. We are very grateful for all that they do. Let's hope that the weather is kind for 'Picnic on the Pece' so that we can see and enjoy it at its best.

The Council encouraged householders with hedges to keep them cut so that they do not overhang pavements. Like parking on pavements, this is a matter of good neighbourliness and consideration for those who use the pavements.

The Council began to consider how it might respond to the draft Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan when the formal consultation begins in July. There is an article about this process on the front page.

The successful appeal by the owner of Horwood Mill against the refusal of outline planning permission was noted. This gives permission in principle for the development of seven houses with vehicular access through Greenway Business Estate. We shall now await the submission of a detailed planning application upon which the Council and parishioners will have an opportunity to comment. So far

as the sites proposed for housing by the Neighbourhood Plan are concerned, discussions are continuing about the Nash Road application and the Council was given a preliminary view of proposals for south of Little Horwood Road. There is to be a consultation open to all residents on 21st June.

The Council dealt with a number of necessary financial matters and questions relating to property belonging to the Council or in which it has an interest. We owe a great debt of thanks to the Clerk, Mandy Cliffe, for all that she does in relation to these complex matters, the smooth running of the Council and also keeping the web page up-to-date.






