Rural Crime

It appears that the Land Rover Defender is still the vehicle of choice for stealing, whether it be parts or the whole vehicle. Please be mindful of this if you



own one. There are plenty of measures you can put place to protect your vehicle. Thames Valley Police has an offer for those who choose to use the Datatag marking system. Call 01784 778310, quote ref TVPDef2016 and you will sent your kit. It is a self-fit. Price is £60 inc VAT plus postage.

We have also had a report of a Horsebox 7.5 tonne being stolen. Also in the report it mentions it contained a lot of equestrian equipment. I know it is a real hassle but don't leave equipment in your horseboxes when they are parked up. Empty it of all equipment after a show. Do not be tempted to 'get everything in there' in prep for an early departure to a show the following day. If the lorry gets taken all you have left is the horse and the yard equipment, no tack, no show gear, the list goes on. It is so distressing particularly if that show was an important qualifier

Neighbourhood Watch Make sure you don't invite opportunist criminals

As the weather is warming up please take a moment to ensure opportunist criminals don't have easy access to your belongings:-

- If you are in your back garden make sure that all windows and doors at the front of your home are secured. It only takes a moment someone to reach in, or climb in and steal easily accessible items.
- Make sure you don't leave handbags, mobiles, keys etc near to an open window.
- When you go to bed take a moment to double check all your doors and windows are secure, especially easily accessed ones.
- Make sure your garden tools and equipment are locked away in a shed and are marked as belonging to you.
- Don't leave out ladders that could be used to access a first floor window. Chain them up.
- Lock bicycles away.
- If you are going away, tell a trusted neighbour and ask them to keep an eye on your property.
- Report anyone acting suspiciously to the police on 101, or if you think a crime is in progress dial on 999

Following some of these simple precautions will reduce the opportunities for thieves.

Action Fraud The first reports of Tech-Support scammers claiming to be from Microsoft who are taking advantage of the global WannaCry ransomware attack.

One victim fell for the scam after calling a 'help' number advertised on a pop up window. The window which wouldn't close said the victim had been affected by WannaCry Ransomware.

The victim granted the fraudsters remote access to their PC after being convinced there wasn't sufficient anti-virus protection. The fraudsters then installed Windows Malicious Software Removal Tool, which is actually free and took £320 as payment.

It is important to remember that Microsoft's error and warning messages on your PC will never include a phone number.

Additionally Microsoft will never proactively reach out to you to provide unsolicited PC or technical support. Any communication they have with you must be initiated by you.

How to protect yourself

- Don't call numbers from pop-up messages.
- Never allow remote access to your computer.
- Always be wary of unsolicited calls. If you're unsure of a caller's identity, hang up.
- Never divulge passwords or pin numbers.
- Microsoft or someone on their behalf will never call you.

If you believe you have already been a victim

- Get your computer checked for any additional programmes or software that may have been installed.
- Contact your bank to stop any further payments being taken.

Phone box on The Green

You may have missed it. No one used it in years. Finally British Telecom have now removed the 1990s style glass and aluminium call box on Great Horwood Village Green.



It has no plans to replace it. This modern, rather ugly public call box replaced a traditional K6 telephone box that used to stand next to what was once the village shop. So what to do with the empty plinth?

Recently a small group of villagers from both Great Horwood and Singleborough came together over a pint or two in The Crown and hatched the idea of enhancing the environment of the village Green, by seeing what interest there might be in installing a traditional red K6 telephone box.

Not only would it add to the area – and give the village a jump start for any future attempts to win village Green awards, we thought that a slice of practicality could be added to improving the local environment. The idea that we took to a recent meeting of the Parish Council included the following arguments in favour of raising funds to erect a K6 telephone box.

1) To provide a drop-by, free village public library (I realise there is another one in the village hall).

2) To enhance the village Green with a traditional K6 telephone box.

3) To ensure that an otherwise empty space and concrete base are made use of.

The K6 red telephone box is a popular feature in many towns and village. Some have been preserved.

Others that have been removed can be acquired or restored.

There is a local connection with the creator of the originalK2 red telephone box in one of our neighbouring villages, Gawcott.

One man went to mow and many turned up a few can be seen above!

The Churchyard is maintained by volunteers and the PCC would like to thank everyone in the village who contributes in this way.



Chairman's Monthly Report : Last Meeting - Monday 12 June 2017



This will be a report on two meetings which have taken place recently. First the Annual Parish Meeting which

Great Horwood was held on 18 May and secondly the Parish Council meeting of Great Horwood Parish Council on 12 June.

The Annual Parish Meeting is an opportunity for all residents to hear about what has been going on in the parish during the last year. We tried a different format this year. Instead of lengthy presentations the formalities were kept to a minimum. The displays by village organisations provided an opportunity for people to speak directly to the groups and people concerned. In general this was well-received and we have certainly picked up some points for next year.

The Parish Council is grateful to all who presented displays and to the WI for providing the refreshments. It would have been nice if more residents had been present but it was good to see - and hear - the buzz of conversation.

The formal report to the Annual Parish Meeting highlighted different areas which the Parish Council has been trying to deal with during the past year. Four areas were highlighted –

(1) traffic matters, including speeding and parking, (2) maintenance matters such as grass cutting, footpaths and possible refurbishment of The Green, (3) planning matters and in particular the refusal of the Secretary of State to grant planning permission for the proposed Weston Road development, and (4) the wider context and the great uncertainty the parish faces in relation to the Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan and the extent of housing development in the area, concerns over what form any changes to local government may take and the potential impact of the Oxford Cambridge Expressway. We certainly live in interesting times.

The Chairman's report thanked parish councillors for their hard work and fellowship and the Clerk for all that she has done over the year to ensure the smooth running of the Parish Council. Thanks were also expressed to all the village organisations for all that they to contribute to the life of our community.

The full text of the Chairman's report will be available on the Parish Council website.

The Parish Council meeting on 12 June heard updates on footpaths, Horwode Pece and village maintenance as well as feedback on the Annual Parish Meeting. The Annual Accounts of the Parish Council for the year 2016/17 were reviewed and approved and revised financial reserves were agreed.

We are particularly grateful to the Clerk for all the hard work she has put in to keeping the accounts in order. The Parish Council co-opted Gavin Laird as a parish councillor and looks forward to working with him as part of the team.

The Parish Council commented on several planning applications and noted with concern that there appears to have been no movement on the outstanding applications, despite earlier questions to the District Council.




