So, after a quick breakfast at 7.00 we set off from base camp (the Crown in Horton -in-Ribblesdale) to tackle the first peak Pen-Y-Gent. The sun was shining, there was a cold wind and we immediately began to climb out of the village with the peak looming in front of us. A steady climb, but the last 100m are very steep, partially scrambling up the rocks, nevertheless we made the summit in an hour and 8 minutes.

Feeling elated we enjoyed the best part of the walk, nearly 3 hours across the Yorkshire dales to the Ribblehead viaduct, carrying the Settle to Carlisle railway. After a quick refreshment stop with the support team (June and Sue) we set off again. The weather was now very close and the next peak Whernside is a long, slow ascent that took us a further couple of hours, followed by a very steep descent to meet the team once more. The weather had now closed in and it was threatening rain, undeterred we set off for Ingleborough and climbed gradually, until we discovered another almost vertical climb, up towards the summit... not that we could see where the summit was at this point!

Indeed, when we got there you could hardly see 20 metres, let alone views of Morecambe Bay as would have been on a clear day, just mist and an eyrie, almost lunar, landscape but we knew we would complete the challenge with just a couple of hours walk back to Horton to go.

We arrived back into Horton at 18.00 giving a total time of 10 hours and 40 minutes, well within the challenge of 12 hours.

The first pint of Black Sheep has never tasted so good as we toasted our success in the Crown, although Andrew had a soft drink having been unable to source a pot of tea!

Many thanks to all who have donated, so far, we have raised £1900 for the Church redecoration and Focus.



The Meeting of Great Horwood Parish Council on 11 June continued with annual tasks and approved the report Great Horwood and accounts for auditing. Councillors

Parish Council are grateful to the Clerk for keeping the finances in good order throughout the year - and particularly since the TSB meltdown which has created additional difficulties.

The Parish Council was pleased to learn that the Horwode Pece equipment had passed its annual inspection by RoSPA. Only very minor matters were raised in the report and this excellent result is a great tribute to the Horwode Pece Management Committee who spend many hours ensuring that the Pece is in good condition and the equipment is safe. It is thanks to them that Horwode Pece is such an asset for the Incidentally, it was good to be able community. to celebrate this at the 'Picnic on the Pece' the day before the meeting. The weather was fine and Giocoso provided musical entertainment for the picnickers. All in all, it was a good occasion.

There was the usual round of planning related matters to consider at the meeting. In addition the Parish

Council gave preliminary consideration to the survey of the junction of Spring Lane with Winslow Road. Other day-to-day matters relating to roads and maintenance around the village were also considered. The uncertainty about the future of this area (caused by issues relating to the Local Plan (VALP) and the reorganisation of local government and the route of the Oxford Cambridge Expressway), however, continues and makes it difficult to put in hand many plans for the future.

As the Parish Council, like FOCUS, takes a break in August, may I take this opportunity to wish you all enjoyable and restful holidays.

If you have any items that you would like to bring to the Council's attention at any time please contact the Clerk or any Councillor. We are always pleased to welcome residents to our monthly meeting during which there is always a public participation period. PILCH LANE

Our thanks go to Bucks County Council for patching Pilch Lane. The large potholes on Singleborough Lane have gone and the worst part was "jet patched" in time for the North Bucks Show. The operation was reasonably painless compared to previous roadworks and the village was not blighted with extra lorry traffic. It has been a delight on a sunny day to walk the lane and see all ages enjoying the countryside. Watching the wild life can be very rewarding and I recently found a buzzard's nest. Our footpaths are very well kept thanks to Robert Deuchar and easy to walk at this time of year. My husband walked a neighbouring village footpath recently and came back drenched due to the long grass. Great Horwood is very lucky to have such a dedicated volunteer as Robert.

BUCKS COUNTY COUNCIL

I often find myself having a moan to our local and district councils so I thought it was time to balance the scales a little with some BCC factoids. In 2017,

BCC repaired over 30,000 serious road defects and 5899 street lights, signs and bollards. 35,823 gullies were cleared and 99 gritting runs completed over the winter. They maintain 6000 signs and bollards, 3200 km of carriageway, 2480 km of footway, 79,000 gullies, 335 traffic installations including traffic lights, 28,000 street lights, 112 pedestrian crossings and 500 structures including bridges. In April they repaired 5646 road defects, 376 lights and signs and cut 600,701 sq metres of urban grass. This doesn't get them off the hook but it does give some perspective. Devolution is not without its problems but it has brought the village fortnightly grass cutting between April and September. Non devolved council grasses are cut 4 times a year by BCC.

WEEDS IN GUTTERS

The Parish Council is looking into the best ways of tidying the local gutters by weed killing in the village. One of our councillors is very experienced

in the use of these chemicals which is reassuring. Modern sprayers keep the amount of chemicals to a minimum but the operation still needs care, consideration and some nice weather.



DUSTBIN COLLECTION DAY

Our dustbin collection day could change in September. Letters will be sent to householders lin July and/or August to confirm. AVDC Dist. Cllr.

Sir Beville Stanier told the Parish Council that new dustcarts had been purchased that have larger fuel tanks and the capacity to take food waste in the same cart. As a result, fewer vehicles will be needed, making fewer returns to the depot for refuelling. There will be no change to the current pattern of alternate waste/recycling or to the garden waste collection.

SPEEDING



The sentinel camera has been deployed on the Winslow Road recently in an early morning session (7.30 to 9.00 am) with Trevor and Graham. Over 50 cars were captured on video although not all could be identified. Successful captures were passed to Thames Valley Police for further action. More volunteers are still needed.

PARKING

. PLEASE KEEP GREAT HORWOOD A SAFE PLACE FOR ALL.

Parking remains a problem and no real progress has really been made. The High St at school drop off and collection times is tricky and Little Horwood Road could be a problem in the future, especially with construction traffic for new developments. We do appreciate the efforts made by residents in Spring Lane to park outside the white lines when they can. The Spring Lane junction survey report has been received and is being given careful thought. A copy has been passed to Winslow for consideration with respect to the 598 houses planned by AVDC for the Great Horwood Road below the Washbrook bridge (as part of the Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan). We hope that Bucks County Council and AVDC will take note of the report when considering the effects on traffic through the village.

Please remember to park thoughtfully in the village. Thank you.


