Another Beast from the East!

This new 'Beast from the East' is Box Tree Moth which is a native to East Asia. It became established in Europe by 2007, the first adult moth being spotted in Britain the same year, and the following year several were found in moth light traps.

The R.H.S. have been undertaking surveys of this moth, which only attacks Box, and between 2015 and 2016 there were 800 sightings, this jumping to over 3,000 in 2017 and 6,000 in 2018, the worst area still in London and its surrounds. However, with a flight span of 10km it is now spreading widely and we now have the 'Beast' in Great Horwood, so anyone with Box in the garden needs to be vigilant at inspecting their plants. There is, of course, the other problem with Box, the fungal disease Box Blight, but although the end result from either will be defoliation and even death, the caterpillars' damage is very distinctive. At least with the Box Caterpillar, if this is caught before it has damaged the stems, the plant should recover.

After hatching from the flattish pale yellow eggs, which are laid on the underside of the leaves, the caterpillars emerge greenish-yellow with black heads. They feed on the leaves and grow to about 4cm (1.25ins) and their body develops a thick black and thin white stripes along the length of the body. Whilst eating they produce a white webbing which is clearly visible amongst the leaves. The pupae are concealed in this webbing. When hatched the moth has a wingspan of some 4cm (1.25ins) and the wings are usually white with a slightly iridescent brown boarder, but just to fool us, it sometimes has completely brown wings.

When this problem first became apparent no chemical control was recommended and the advice given was to remove the caterpillars by hand, or to use the nematode biological control for Fruit and Vegetables Protection as

this has some effect. Also, caterpillar feeding birds such as blue tits have been spotted eating the caterpillars even though they have a toxin which will make them less palatable.

The R.H.S. are now advising that contact insecticides containing pyrethrins (e.g. Bug Clear Gun for Fruit and Vegetables), but several applications will be necessary and penetrating the webbing is essential. Also, the more persistent contact insecticide containing synthetic pyrethrioid lamdacyhalothrin (Westland Resolva Pestkiller), cypermethrin (Py Bug Killer) or deltamethrin (Provado Ultimate Fruit & Vegetable Bug Killer).

Personally, I am making a very regular inspection of my variegated box hedge and intend to pick off and destroy any caterpillars if spotted.

Fair and Feast

The annual fair on The Green has been a fixture in the village calendar since the 15th century when New College Oxford was granted a charter for an annual fair to be held in Great Horwood on the patronal festival, the feast of St. James the Apostle. St. James's day is 25th July but, surprisingly, the fair always visits in August.

This disparity seems to date back to the mid-18th century when England and Wales adopted the Gregorian Calendar. Until that time, using the Julian Calendar, our dates hadn't matched those used on the continent. We didn't have the same system of leap years and our year began in March rather than January. September, October, November and December really were the seventh, eighth, ninth and tenth months of the year that their (Latin) names suggest. In September 1752, to bring in the new calendar, 11 days were skipped. For that year only, Wednesday 2nd September was immediately followed by Thursday 14th September. Thereafter, every date fell 11 days earlier than it had previously done. However, according to the Buckingham Advertiser, the Great Horwood villagers refused to have their feast day altered. They wanted it to be held when it would have been St. James's Day if the new calendar hadn't been introduced - not 11 days early!

They made the rule that the Feast of St. James must be celebrated no earlier than 6th August and no later than 12th August. In recent decades, the church of St James Great Horwood has observed 25th July as the patronal festival but the fun-fair still visits between in early August as demanded by the villagers over 260 years ago.

Until the 1890s, the celebrations lasted a whole week but had reduced to only two days by 1898. The fair was an opportunity for business as well as for entertainment. Visitors flocked to the village and the pubs and shops did a roaring trade. The Great Horwood Band always performed as the fair arrived and set up, a tradition that will be revived this year (Sunday, 4th August 5.00-6.00pm).

Before the advent of electrical power, the dancing booth was a popular attraction. A fiddler provided the music and couples paid to dance. Travelling showmen brought a variety of sideshows and rides, including peep shows, swing-boats and roundabouts. In 1949, Buckland & Smith's, who already had a long tradition of attending, brought the "dodge 'ems" to Great Horwood for the first time. Accompanied by 'radiogram music' and colourful lights, they were an immediate hit and have been the most popular attraction ever since.

MY 15,000ft TANDEM SKYDIVE SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED

On Friday 7 June Rod drove me down to Devon in torrential rain and appalling visibility. I was full of trepidation but hoping to do my tandem skydive on the Saturday. Unfortunately early the next morning I received an e-mail to say that there would be no parachute jumps at all that day due to the rain and high winds! This was not a very propitious start to my already nerve-racking challenge.

However I managed to re-arrange my jump for the Sunday morning when I had originally booked to do it.

Feeling very nervous I turned up at Dunkeswell Aerodrome, near Honiton, East Devon and was immediately put at ease by all the very professional staff there. Two of the other lady jumpers had had several of their previous attempts to jump cancelled due to the weather which was not a good omen! One of them had even waited therefor over 5 hours before being told there would be no more jumps that day!

We were then all given a very comprehensive briefing demonstrating the harness we would be wearing, how to exit the plane when we got the green light together with the various postures we had to adopt on both exiting the plane and landing. Unfortunately at that stage I discovered that we had to be on our knees with our instructor behind us. This was not a good position to adopt for a 74-year-old with a knee replacement!!

We then trekked over to get kitted out with our banana suits, so-called because they were yellow and we had to adopt a curved posture in flight. Getting one small enough for me was tricky as was putting on the harness as I'm very short. Once suitably kitted out it was very difficult to walk, let alone climb the steps into the plane!

Many friends had joked that I'd probably be attached to a hunky young man but I was delighted, as well as reassured, to be allocated Chris as my instructor. He was the extremely experienced parachutist who had done the briefing and knew all about my knee replacement.

Very quickly my harness was tightened, my instructor made sure I knew what to do and then suddenly we got the green light to go. We slid across the bench towards the exit and then the very nerve-racking experience of having to get down on my knees, something I can do but it takes time which I did not have. However no need to worry as my instructor basically threw me out and we were off!

The freefall of nearly 2 vertical miles was amazing, exhilarating, and terrifying in equal measure! The instructor then opened the parachute and we glided down to earth. We just missed the neatly mown landing strip but luckily avoided the pool!!

All in all it was a brilliant, very enjoyable day with very supportive fellow jumpers and other

instructors. Would I do it again? Probably not...

COMMUNICATION

Communicating information to residents can be difficult for the Parish Council and I wonder how best to address this issue? The PC posts notes through doors if really necessary and uses Focus for future events. Facebook is good for short notice issues but not everyone uses Facebook. Not everyone uses the Internet either but I would like to run a trial to see if enough residents would sign up to an email information line (with protected email addresses for data privacy).

If sufficient interest was expressed (and to make it worthwhile this would have to be at least 150 households), an email list could be used to circulate routine info such as PC agendas and Minutes, information from meetings, details of any road works, news and scam warnings from Thames Valley Police, tool marking and crime prevention sessions, public consultations, major planning applications, Western Power tree cutting, new electricity substations etc. I agree that some of this is not terribly scintillating but and more importantly - the Parish Council would be able to communicate emergency information such as a fallen tree or storm warnings as received from the met office. Additionally, I receive notifications of events such as Armed Forces day, the Whizz Fizz Fest, and other things that I currently delete. WORTHY CAUSES

The Parish Council is offering another round of grants to local causes for 2019. Applications forms have been emailed to previous applicants and can also be downloaded from the GHPC website.

THIS YEARS CUT-OFF DATE - 31ST OCTOBER 2019 -IS FINAL. NO APPLICATIONS WILL BE CONSIDERED AFTER THIS DATE.

Awards will be made to local groups and organisations through their Committee, Governing Body, Head, Trustees etc. but not to individuals. Up to £3000 will be available to help local projects.

ELECTRICITY SUBSTATION

Western Power needs to build a new electricity substation on Little Horwood Road. The substation is needed to meet extra energy requirements from all properties east of Willow Road and to supply the new housing development. The site selected is on the grass verge on the south side of Little Horwood Road to the east of Weston Road. Other locations were considered including siting it on the new development (which was turned down as the site is too far away from connecting substations) and on private land but an alternative could not be found. 




