

GARDENING TIMES

When I was a horticulture student, I worked on placement in Benmore Botanic Garden up in Argyll on the West Coast of Scotland. It was a huge place, filled with trees and ferns with very little, aside from the Ponticum Rhododendrons in way of colour. The only exception to this were the foxgloves, thousands of them spread across the hillsides. One of my jobs was, when needed, to dig them up, pop them in a pot and take them to the shop where they would slap on a price tag and flog them for a fiver, it must have been the easiest money that the garden ever made.

Foxgloves are a mesmerising plant, I doubt that there is anyone who hasn't sat entranced whilst the biggest, fattest bumblebee climbs inside the flower, eats her fill (and it is always a she), gets dusted in pollen, before backing out, flying to the next flower down and spreading her love all over (albeit accidentally). It is one of the sights and sounds of summer that lifts the heart. I remember sitting with my daughter when she was aged 3 and us both being spellbound by the dance of it, plant and animal in perfect synch. These are the little things that stick in the memory, those little glimpses of heaven.

The flower spikes tend to be quite short-lives, before long there will only be one or two lonely bell flowers at the top with the rest setting seed. With that in mind, we need to think of the future and for us to have wonderful blooms next year, (they are biennials, meaning that their lifecycle is spread over 2 years), now is the time that we need to be sowing our seeds, getting a little growth before autumn sets in and giving us and our pollinators a real treat next year. The seeds do require light to germinate however, so don't bury them in your compost, leave them lying on top but make sure there is enough contact between seed and soil.

The gorgeous displays that a group of them will give in that time between Spring and Summer that we call the "Hungry Gap" and our native *Digitalis purpurea*, has a penchant for lightly shady places that makes them wonderful additions to most situations. However, it has to be said that there needs to be a little caution with them as they are almost as famous for their toxicity as they are for their beauty. They featured a lot in folk medicine, despite the fact that they are very poisonous. They were used in the treatment of dropsy (accumulation of fluid in the tissues) and they would work dramatically if erratically and far too often fatally. *Digitalis* is still used in the treatment of theart complaints, it regulates the rhythm of the heart but personally speaking, I would leave that to the experts.

If you have any seeding foxgloves in your garden already (and why wouldn't you?), give them a little tap as you pass and this will disperse the tiny seeds so they can get on with the job of making babies. Sunnier spots would prefer to have some of their Mediterranean cousins instead such as *Digitalis* grandiflorum or *D. lutea* (when anything has the species name *lutea*, that tells us that the flowers will be yellow). Give the fairies a variety of colourful bonnets for next year. \mathbf{O}

Jobs to do in the gardenthis month

- It isn't just Foxgloves that can be sown now, Wallflowers , Sweet Williams, Evening Primrose and honesty can all be done now.
- Take cuttings of hydrangeas, they are usually really easy to do it, you can put the cuttings into a glass of water and you can watch them grow roots (change the water twice a week, otherwise it turns to soup).
- Start picking your courgettes, before they get to the size of Big Daddy's leg.

GREATHORWOODANDSINGLEBOROUGH WI

The Power of Plants was the theme of the presentation at the Great Horwood & Singleborough WI meeting in June, given by Maria Greenhill. Maria is a qualified aromatherapist and after a brief introduction on the history of essential oils she spoke about the health benefits when used individually or by combining several in a recipe.

Maria explained the many uses of essential oils from fragrancing rooms using a diffuser to using them for massage or to treat ailments. If applied to the skin she warned that the oils must be mixed with a carrier oil (such as almond, grapeseed or rosehip seed oil) – the only exception being lavender, which can be used neat. Described as a 'first-aid kit in a bottle', lavender oil is especially good for burns, cuts, bites, headaches and spots.

She said that eucalyptus is proven for its effectiveness against coughs, colds and flu but should not be used if diabetic or epileptic. It can be mixed with lemon and used in a room diffuser, spray or steam inhalation but is not advised for asthma sufferers. Other recipes

- Chop back Delphiniums, Geums and Hardy Geraniums and see if you get another flush of flower later on.
- WATER POTS!!!!! Preferably late in the evening or very early in the morning, otherwise it all just evaporates away.
- Pick your sweet peas, and bring them into the house, it is one of my favourite smells

And lastly

- Collect seeds, we are called to be abundant so let's share a little of God's beauty with each other through seed exchanges!!!!!

Maria also shared some natural cleaning recipes to freshen the home and kill bacteria. It was a fascinating, enlightening talk which only scratched the surface of how to harness the power of essential plant oils to relax the mind and body and relieve pain from minor ailments, naturally.




