RECTORS THOUGHTS

One of the best and most enjoyable parts of my role as parish priest for Winslow, Addington, and Great Horwood with Singleborough is my involvement in the activities of the local schools, where the resilience, creativity, and openness of the students to spiritual things never fails to surprise and impress me. I am often asked more prescient, interesting, and challenging questions about God and the important moral and ethical issues of our day by them than by many adults. Not, I suspect, because the adults are older and have managed to sort the answers out for themselves, but because they probably seldom think as deeply about these issues as most children do, encouraged by a series of school curricula which really do seek to prepare them for life in a rapidly changing, and at times, a difficult and challenging world. There has been much interest in the media lately about the openness of young people to spiritual things, by which I do not necessarily mean formal religious observance, but a willingness to engage with the big questions in life: who am I?, why am I here?, what is my life's purpose? and, where do I find the resources to meet my full potential as a citizen of the world and leave it in a better state than I found it? Their sense of responsibility and genuine desire to make the world a better place is no mere idealism, and my school visits often do more to affirm my faith in the future of our communities, our nation, and our planet than almost any other meetings I have to attend. I always leave feeling refreshed and encouraged by their openness, and at times, the alarming honesty of their questions, which help keep me on my toes, and force me to regularly consider those questions for myself as well.

In June I attended the three-day diocesan clergy conference in Swanwick where a number of children from schools all over the diocese (which covers Oxfordshire, Buckinghamshire and Berkshire) came to lead us in our worship one day, and joined us in small groups afterwards so that we, as clergy, could listen and learn from them what kind of support they wanted from their local churches, and what their hopes and fears for the future were. True to form, they were alarmingly honest and deeply insightful about the way in which much which passes for religion and religious observation these days passes them by, or worse still, steadfastly ignores both they and their needs completely. They spoke about feeling alienated from institutions they perceive to be deeply racist, homophobic, lacking in social conscience and conservative with a small 'c'. They also talked about their social isolation and boredom in communities where services for children and young adults have been completely denuded by cuts to local government spending, and yes, they talked about cyber bullying and the other problems they experience too, and above all, they wanted safe spaces where they could share their concerns, feel supported, and be helped by others. I do hope that the Church and those responsible for leading local communities will listen increasingly to their words, because without a vision the people perish, and what greater vision can there be, but to create a better world for our children and grandchildren? It was a salutary lesson, and one which I am mindful to think and reflect upon further. It is one of the reasons why the rainbow flag flew over St Laurence's last month, because more than one of them asked, 'how can we know that the Church is a safe place for those of our friends who are gay or trans, or neurodivergent, or different in some other way?' and their question was an apt and appropriate one. The Church is often perceived to be a cold and unwelcoming place for young people, but it should not be. Young people are not tomorrow's Church or even tomorrow's local community. They are a part of today's Church and of our local communities right now, and should be able to play a full and active role in them, and have their voices heard. And more than that, they should be respected and listened to when they have the courage to speak, because they have a lesson to teach us all!

On a similar note, I would like to express my sincere appreciation to everyone who helped make a successful application to Variety,the Children's Charity, for one of their 'Sunshine Coaches' on behalf of Furze Lane School. The application was successful, and the school will be taking proud possession of a new minibus to help support their truly inspiring work with children and young adults with special educational needs. I am proud to be associated with the school and the work they do with children and young adults who are often excluded in the mainstream, or whose needs are poorly understood and inadequately met elsewhere. I am sure that they will put the minibus to good use in the months and years ahead ,and cannot wait to hear all about it from the students themselves. The school is an



integral part of our community and probably the largest employer in the town, so I am delighted to learn that members of the Lions Club will be hosting a charity event to support its work there on Sunday the 13th of July. See https://www.northbucksbikeride.info/ for more information, and if you would like to contribute cakes and other home-baked goods for the day, contact Tara on torme@furzedownschool.org.uk There will be space aplenty for families to bring along their picnic blankets and baskets, and there will also be a BBQ and other stalls available. Aylesbury Market Bus - runs every Friday and Saturday morning — from Winslow, through Gt Horwood, Little Horwood, Mursley and Swanbourne, arriving in Aylesbury just after 10am and departing 12.15pm. FREE with a bus pass, otherwise only £4.50 return. Drop offs at Sainsburys and Broadfields on request.

Winslow Market Service 54abc - runs every Wednesday morning.

This service picks up in the surrounding villages and then into Winslow, (Swanbourne, Mursley, Great Horwood, Whaddon, Nash and The Claydons). Pick up times vary according to village. Bus passes accepted, otherwise £3.00 return.

Buckingham Bus Service – Picking up in Winslow and surrounding villages. 1 hour in town then 1 hour in Tesco, or 2 hours in Tesco. Door to door service. Bus passes accepted, otherwise £4.50 return.

The Winslow & District Community Bus relies on volunteer drivers to run all our services, excursions and hires.

We are always in need of volunteer drivers, especially at the moment! So, if you have a D1 on your licence, and have some spare time, please consider becoming a driver for your local Community Bus.

All of our scheduled routes start at around 9.00am and finish around 1.30pm. We pay out-of-pocket expenses.

We also run our own outings visiting all kinds of places, including garden centres, stately homes, shopping centres and countryside drives. The use of the bus is also available to local non-profit groups

We offer certificated training to MiDAS standard

MiDAS is the Minibus Driver Awareness Scheme and is administered by the Community Transport Association. The scheme provides a nationally recognised standard for the assessment and training of minibus drivers and has been designed to enhance minibus driving standards and promote the safer operation of minibuses.

WDCB provide free training to "MiDAS" standards for all our drivers. A certificate is awarded after successful completion of the course, which is valid for four years and is recognised UK-wide. Candidates must be aged over 21 and have category 'D1' on their licence. The course is usually completed in a day, the time being divided between classroom and practical work. The latter comprises coaching and assessment of driving skills plus a briefing on the use of the minibus wheelchair lift.

It was a fascinating talk and listening to Andy, prompted many memories for WI members of what they knew about their parents' experiences of the terrible WW2 years.






