

London Marathon 2018

On April 22nd, I completed the hottest London Marathon ever, in 6 hours 49:33! Because of the difficult conditions, I wasn't able to run as much of it as I'd hoped but it was a fantastic day. I couldn't believe how



many people there were out on the streets supporting us all, making an amazing amount of noise! Hundreds of people were calling my name and spurring me on. It was quite overwhelming at times. And there was loads of uplifting music going on.

Time flew by as I felt very busy, looking out for my supporters (who just about managed to keep ahead of me so that I saw them several times) and heavily engaged in self preservation, deciding what I needed next - eg, water, sugar, salt, sun lotion, loo stop. I was running well until about 10 and a half miles, when I felt forced to start walking to conserve energy as there had been 2 consecutive water stations that had run out of water! I texted my husband, Stuart: 'No water!' and started telling the crowd that we hadn't had any water, until some lovely person gave me a pint in a plastic 'glass' which I then had to try and not slop everywhere. The next time I saw Stuart he gave me a bottle and then, thankfully, normal service was resumed. Lots of people were giving out sweets and a wonderful Domino's Pizza man gave me the most welcome slice of pizza I've ever eaten, at about 23 miles! I'd started to feel sick but that really revived me. I was very

relieved to finally run across the finish line.

You may have seen me plodding up and down Pilch Lane during the last two winters in preparation for this day. (I had to defer my entry from last year due to injury and illness.) Chairman's Monthly Report: Last Meeting - Monday 14 May 2018



Great Horwood Parish Council

The Meeting of Great Horwood Parish Council on 14 May was the Annual Parish Council Meeting. This is the occasion when several formal items of business and appointments have to be considered.

The Councillors have to elect a chairman and vicechairman for the coming year and they agreed to elect me as chairman and John Gilbey as vice-chairman. The Parish Council also appointed representatives to a number of bodies which represent the wider community in the district. In addition, representatives were appointed to the Village Hall Committee and to the Castlefields Charity. This does not sound very exciting, and it was not, but it is all stuff which has to

There were reports on footpaths and Horwode Pece. We are very fortunate to have such hard-working volunteers who look after our footpaths and Horwode Pece on behalf of the community. We are also grateful to Bucks CC who have provided a handrail to the footbridge over the ditch on the path from Pilch Lane towards Adstock. Bucks County Council have also said that they will repair the worn bridge on the footpath going towards Singleborough and make the steps up to the bridge easier. The timing of this work is not known but we hope this it will not be delayed too long. There are new picnic tables at Horwode Pece so, if the weather is good why not take a walk on our parish footpaths or have a picnic. Please note that 'Picnic on the Pece' will be held on Sunday 10 June. This is usually a good occasion with games and entertainment.

The Parish Council noted that repairs are being carried out to Pilch Lane. Whilst it is understood that all the available resources are being used to deal with the enormous backlog of potholes throughout the County, we hope that the promised repainting of whitelines along the B4033 through the village will not be delayed for too much longer. Renewed whitelines will surely contribute to safer road use. The MVAS is continuing to record excessive speeding and it was particularly interesting and horrifying to note the excessive speeds of vehicles driving up the hill from Winslow into the village. Speedwatch has also been operating and having a deterrent effect!

There was the usual round of planning related matters to consider. In addition the Parish Council agreed to write to the Secretary of State asking him to review his predecessor's 'minded' view that there should be a single unitary authority for the whole County. It is the Council's view that the interests of our communities will be best served in the uncertain times we face by having two unitary authorities, one for the north of the county and one for the south.

Just a word about the Annual Parish Meeting held on 30 April. It was good to hear from our District and County Councillors with their perspective on life in North Bucks. The presence of several village

organisations who were able to show those present what they do was very good and we are grateful for all that they contribute towards the life of the community. A special thanks to the WI for the delicious cakes and tea and coffee!

If you have any items that you would like to bring to the Council's attention at any time please contact the Clerk or any Councillor. We are always pleased to welcome residents to our monthly meeting during which there is always a public participation period. The next meeting is to be held at 7.30 pm on Monday 11 June 2018 in the Village Hall.

PARISH PUMP

NORTH BUCKS SHOW

The North Bucks County Show will be held on 2nd June at Pilch Farm, Pilch Lane, Great Horwood. Bucks County Council have been



working on the road surface of Pilch Lane for a few days now and aim to have the worst part "jet patched" in time for the show. (Thank you BCC) The show is on between 0900 and 1700 so be prepared for heavier traffic than usual entering and leaving the village. The able bodied amongst us will be thinking of walking to the show so please take extra care on the roads.

ACCIDENT

Questions have been raised about traffic calming after the terrible fatal accident on Great Horwood Road. As the accident took place within Winslow's boundaries they will be taking the lead on suggesting measures to Bucks County Council. Great Horwood has offered its support, although as this was a fairly straight piece of road measures available are likely to be limited. A 50 mph speed limit has been suggested but one wonders how this could be successfully enforced.



PARKING

PLEASE KEEP GREAT HORWOOD A SAFE PLACE FOR ALL.

I was walking towards the exit of the footpath leading from Spring Lane onto the High Street when a car

mounted the pavement, drove past me and parked. Whilst I was in no immediate danger, its proximity shocked me momentarily and made me wonder what would happen if a child had run out of the passageway onto the pavement. One or two mum's have commented about this before.

Please remember to park thoughtfully in the village. Thank you.

SPEEDING



The sentinel camera has been deployed in the village recently. On both occasions, no drivers were recorded on the camera as there was sufficient line of site to slow down in good time. Hopefully, as we increase our use of the camera - with more volunteers - the message will get through. Winslow Road remains a problem area with 10, 285 vehicle movements (over a period of 5 days) recorded by the MVAS and downloaded by Mick Wood - 4382 were recorded at 35 mph, 2297 at 40 mph, 788 at 45 mph, 186 at 50 mph and 43 vehicles travelling between 55 and 65 mph! We are pleased that the police camera is being deployed on the hill and hope to have the sentinel there too. If speeding through the village worries you volunteering for speed watch is practical and positive. Many thanks to Mick, ably assisted by Gill, for all the hard work he puts into manhandling, moving and charging the MVAS and for downloading and analysing the statistics.



NOTICEBOARD

I have been researching a new general notice/information board for the village to replace the well-used one on the High St.

My brief was to obtain a similar sized weatherproof one with doors, like the picture on the left but in brown or black. As it is metal, notices can be attached using magnets and, as long as everyone remembers to keep the doors shut, notices should stay neat and tidy for longer. If all goes to plan it will be in place sometime over the summer.
