For local residents and newcomers to the village who aren't lucky enough to own a copy of our village book I thought a bit of information about the hall might be interesting. The hall was built in 1923 and funded by residents buying a brick at the cost of £1 a brick a considerable sum of money in those days. The indenture shows the land was bought in 1921 for £100 by David Cymmer Owen the then Rector, Fredrick Mason a local farmer and Samuel Thomas Moxhay (otherwise known as Fred Carey a comedian and local resident). The hall later became a Charity as it still is today. Nowadays the upkeep for the hall is funded by the hirers of the hall and donations. So a big thank you to everyone who hires the hall and to the generous people who donate to the hall. To hire the hall call Gill on 01296712165.



Terry died suddenly from a heart attack on 6th April in his beloved garden in Grainge Chase after a normal morning of gardening and mowing the lawn.

He and his family moved into the family home in Great Horwood when Grainge Chase was built in 1990 and Terry's wife Tonina, son Joe and daughter Natalie and extended families are very grateful for all the cards, calls and messages of sympathy and support they have received from so many people since.

Terry lived a full and a fulfilled life throughout his 72 years. An accountant by profession he ultimately became Group Finance Director of Sen-ior Engineering, a FTSE 250 business, for 11 years until his retirement at 55, which coincided with the family's move to Great Horwood. #### Granny Goes Skydiving

as a fundraiser for the Florence Nightingale Hospice. This charity has provided wonderful end-of-life care for several of my friends. However the more I think about my sons' present the more I'm wondering if they have an ulterior motive!

The 15,000 ft tandem skydive they have chosen is the highest one you can do without oxygen! After exiting the aircraft, strapped to my instructor, I'll have nearly two vertical miles of free fall before a controlled canopy descent of another mile - and a landing. I'm scheduled to do this at Dunkeswell Airfield, near Honiton, East Devon on Sunday 9th June, weather permitting. This is the only UK venue that provides such high skydives.

I'm ever so slightly apprehensive, but the knowledge that I'm doing it for such a good cause will spur me on. I'm also buying several pairs of incontinence pants "just in case"! Perhaps if I buy extra-large ones they could act as a reserve parachute.

I will be so grateful for any sponsorship, however small, in order to benefit Florence Nightingale Hospice. Obviously the skydive is weather-dependent and if, on the day, the weather is bad it will have to be postponed. Therefore any sponsorship money will only be collected after I've actually done the jump.

Fingers crossed for good weather in Devon on Sunday 9th June! If any Focus reader happens to be in East Devon that day, you'd be most welcome to come and watch. Photos and video will be available after the event.

#### 10 YEARS OF PECE!

The 15th May this year marked ten years of the Pece officially being open. We would love as many villagers as possible to come and celebrate with us at the annual Picnic on the Pece (see poster in Focus) on Sunday 9th June from 12 noon onwards. Giocoso will be entertaining us with their wonderful music and we are hoping to build some 'Bug Hotels' to place around the Rec.

We are in the final stages of getting quotes in for the Parish Councils' approval for landscaping around the play areas as our first stage of transition from woodchip to rubber chippings. We have had 3 lorry loads of topsoil donated by the Little Horwood Development site at only the cost of delivery to us. This soil will then be used as a graduated support around the play areas which replaces the wood surround that, after ten years, is starting to rot and become a weekly maintenance chore. Once this has been done, we will be looking for some volunteers for our delayed Spring Working Party. We need to be painting the woodwork with wood preservative, cutting view holes in the front hedgerow and moving the woodchip from the toddler area to the teenage area. All help will be gratefully appreciated.

We have an ongoing problem with one particular dog owner and his dog chewing (nay ripping large parts of wood) off primarily the shelter, but also other wood structures. This is regarded as vandalism as the owner cannot be unaware that his dog is doing this. The owner/dog walker is a young male, dark haired and constantly on his phone. Please if you see this happening and know who the person is, would you let one of the committee members know.

#### Men In Sheds

#### A friendly workshop where men can gather, work together, share skills and knowledge or just have a chat over coffee.

A lot of our projects use donated second-hand material and, in these ecologically aware times, this is something we are more than happy to do. There is an extra sense of satisfaction to be had when a pile of scruffy pallets are transformed into flooring for a summer house or, with Peter Reimer's recent project, the better panels of an old garden shed emerge as a tiered plant display. We thought it best to show off Peter's masterpiece before it disappears under a profusion of summer flowers!

But why use 'old' wood for new projects?

Cost is a reason but not so much when you factor in the time it takes to clean and de-nail the wood and if the saw or planer finds a rogue nail then damage to the blade is likely to make it very expensive material indeed. How about saving trees? There is a point here but most of the wood we use is softwood: timber from coniferous forests grown as a crop and harvested like any other. Probably the most powerful reason for us goes back to the point about satisfaction - creating something useful and (hopefully) beautiful from what was otherwise waste. I've just listened to some news reporting a university study into creativity and mental health and the findings were clear but unsurprising: engaging in creative activity gives our minds a context, outlet and focus to deal with all the other stuff that life throws at us. If you add in a social dimension then so much the better. Our Shed offers quite a range of creative things to do and plenty of help and encouragement so - if you're at a loose end - just pop in. We've all got a creative urge so why not scratch it? It's good for you (and that's official!)

#### **COUNCIL MATTERS**

At the Annual Parish Council meeting held on 13th May 2019, Cllr John Gilbey was elected Chairman and Cllr Caroline Cousin was elected as Vice Chairman. The Parish Council is hoping to welcome a new councillor in June which will bring the council to its full complement - very good news.

Cllr Dave Taylor is already proving his worth by volunteering to refurbish the wooden Parish Council Noticeboard and volunteering his talented wife to paint the millennium waste bin on The Green. It is currently in a sorry state. Many thanks Dave and Aly!

#### NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN REVIEW

A committee has been set up to review the Great Horwood Neighbourhood Plan. Cllr Caroline Cousin has volunteered to chair it and Mr David Saunders has kindly offered to be the secretary. This will involve a considerable amount of work and details will be given when available.

#### DEVELOPMENT ON HORWODE PECE

In the near future 36 tonnes of soil will arrive at Horwode Pece. A huge thank you goes to Croudace, developers of Land South of Little Horwood Road for this very generous gift. What is it for? The Horwode Pece Management team are responsible for a new development on the Pece! New homes? Offices? Only joking - the team are building an earth bank around both the teenage and toddler areas. These will be grass seeded and when complete will provide a gentle, sloped access to each of the areas. The village is jolly lucky to have such a dedicated and hard working group of volunteers to look after and improve this amazing facility. Don't forget to join them for their 10th anniversary Picnic on The Pece on 9th June to the accompaniment of Giocoso.

#### NEW FOOTPATH BRIDGE

The unsafe bridge on footpath 4 (Pilch Lane to Adstock) where it meets the Adstock Parish Boundary has been replaced. There is now a footbridge with metal handrails. Mr Robert Deuchar organised this with Bucks County Council and asks us to thank BCC and the Adstock Fields Estate. Robert has walked, pruned and inspected roughly half the Parish's footpaths this month will do the rest by next month's PC meeting. In return, the Parish Council thanks Robert for his amazing and entirely voluntary contribution to the village keeping the local footpath network accessible.

#### PCSO ANDY PIOTROWSKI

PCSO Andy Piotrowski is the PCSO for villages from Great Horwood to Newton Longville. He attended the Parish Council meeting on 13th May together with PC Ian Carter. In brief, Andy covered the following

- future tool marking and crime prevention events
- funding for an automated number plate recognition camera (ANPR) for Winslow (a yellow speed camera) and TVP success in catching speeding motorists in the area.
- farm visits to advise on security
- plans for safe driving and rural crime presentations •
- support to AVDC for enforcement at Nash Park

- no reports of burglaries or thefts in Great Horwood this . month and only 2 reports of criminal damage.

Sadly, only two residents turned out to help Jane Holland and if it had not been for the Scouts and Guides ((who did a great job clearing the alleyway from The High Street to Spring Lane), it would have been a complete failure. YOU CAN **STILL HELP** by borrowing a litter picker and taking a black bag from the Clerk when you do a walk anywhere around the village. Just contact me using the details below. I have more than one litter picker if you would like to take family and friends at any time of the year. Let's keep our village clean! #### COMMUNICATION

Communicating information to residents can be difficult for the Parish Council and I wonder how best to address this issue? The PC posts notes through doors if really necessary and uses Focus for future events. Facebook is good for short notice issues but not everyone uses Facebook. Not everyone uses the Internet either but I would like to run a trial to see if enough residents would sign up to an email information line (with protected email addresses for data privacy).

If sufficient interest was expressed (and to make it worthwhile this would have to be at least 150 households). an email list could be used to circulate routine info such as PC agendas and Minutes, information from meetings, details of any road works, news and scam warnings from Thames Valley Police, tool marking and crime prevention sessions, public consultations, major planning applications, Western Power tree cutting, new electricity substations etc. I agree that some of this is not terribly scintillating but and more importantly - the Parish Council would be able to communicate emergency information such as a fallen tree or storm warnings as received from the met office. Additionally, I receive notifications of events such as Armed Forces day, the Whizz Fizz Fest, and other things that I currently delete. 


