

#### **GARDENING TIMES**

When you think about growing fruit, we usually think of their requirements being out in the full, baking in the heat, ripening, swelling and giving us the gorgeous, sumptuous, taste of summer.

Whilst this is true for some fruits, there are others that have evolved to grow on the fringes of woodlands and can handle a bit more in the way of shade, think of the currants, the raspberries, and this month's plant, the Gooseberry.

They often are amongst the most unloved of our garden plants, if you have ever owned one, you know just how lethal the spines can be, or seen them getting defoliated by sawfly caterpillars. However, they do deserve to be looked upon a little more fairly. They are the first of the soft fruit that will ripen in the year, just like apples they can be split into two categories. The early ripeners are cookers, the latter ones are dessert goosegogs, sweeter, larger, slightly trickier to grow but worth it. It always pays to thin out a bush if it is laden with fruit, by removing some fruit, you increase the sweetness of those left behind.

I have a gardening book dating back to 1817 that states, "The gooseberry is an especially British fruit... in no other country is so much attention paid to its cultivation." Britain used to have a proliferation of Gooseberry Societies, societies whose sole purpose was to exhibit, breed and compete over the size and sweetness of their gooseberries, I just love that in this country, that was a "thing", this sort of tomfoolery needs to be encouraged. The only one that I know of that still survives is the Egton Bridge Old Gooseberry Society near Whitby, maybe we should start one in Great Horwood!

Used by generations of embarrassed parents to explain where a new baby has come from, this plant used to be a much bigger part of our lives than it is now and it is a shame that it isn't seen for what it is, so often I see them lurking in some neglected corner of a garden, with nettles growing out through them and they really should be a little more front and centre, gooseberries grown in a standard (lollipop), can be striking additions to your plot..

In this, the time of the Platinum Jubilee, is there any other plant that describes us more perfectly? Tough, resilient, tolerant of poor conditions, can be a bit spikey, sometimes slightly sour, but with the ability to be sweet, delicious and generous given the right conditions.

I would encourage you to make more of them, hardwood cuttings at the beginning of winter is a great way to get them started, they are almost guaranteed to take root, don't be a Gooseberry fool. Rev'd Mark

#### Jobs to do in the garden in June

- Any spring flowering shrubs such as Forsythias, Weigelias and Philadelphus can be pruned now, remove some of the biggest, oldest branches
- Pinch out the side shoots of your tomatoes, you have the plants for the fruit, you don't need so much in the way of foliage
- Mow your lawn regularly, although you could think about leaving a part of it to grow to encourage wildlife in your garden
- If the weather is looking warm and dry for a day or two, grab your hoe and weed the beds, you can leave the tops where they lie if you like, the will quickly dry up and disappear.

In Great Horwood we charge £40 per girl per term and we can also get grants from Girlguiding Bucks to cover the fees of anyone who isn't able to pay that. The girls do all sorts of different things, including playing games, exploring the natural world, adventurous activities like climbing, cooking, learning life skills through fun activities and helping the environment. Two weeks into the Summer Term

and the Guides and Rangers have already had a murder, mystery evening and the Brownies and Rainbows have planned a jubilee celebration party. We're hoping for less rain on Monday evenings than we had last Summer but, whatever the weather, we'll be cooking over open fires, visiting the woods, learning new skills and having fun. ## GREATHORWOODANDSINGLEBOROUGH WI



Setup in 2011, the shop has since won many awards and has raised money for many worthy causes in the community. Alison explained the various grants they were able to tap into, the fundraising they did and how the shop is run by volunteers with the exception of the manager who is in a paid position.

Alongside staples much of the food is sourced locally including honey, meat, cheese, bread and fresh fruit and vegetables. It also stocks speciality foods and beers and wines from local breweries and estates. The shop has also become a destination for walkers and cyclists attracted by the coffee, sausage rolls and cakes. Alison was an inspiration in how to make a village shop a true success and has offered her help if anyone in Great Horwood is thinking of doing the same!

The week before our May meeting, we hosted the annual Chase meeting which is a combination of local WI groups. We were delighted to welcome members from Winslow, Mursley and Stewkley. Entertainment was provided by a local folk band known as Noah's Cape (a bit of a play on words, say it quickly) whose songs were delightful to listen to, and our brilliant Milton Keynes Poet Laureate Mark Niel. It was a very enjoyable evening and thanks to the generosity of guests we also raised £95 for the Ukraine appeal.

#### A SHORT HISTORY OF GREAT HORWOOD'S JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS

As we celebrate Queen Elizabeth II's platinum jubilee, it's interesting to look back at some of the earlier jubilees that the people of Great Horwood and Singleborough have celebrated.

The earliest jubilee we have much information about is Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee in June 1887. There aren't any photos from that event but the Buckingham and Winslow Advertiser published accounts of how local towns and villages marked the occasion. In Great Horwood, the celebrations were held on 22nd June and began at 5.00am when the church bells rang and royal salutes were fired from the blacksmith's anvil! Villagers had decorated their homes with flags. There was a church service, followed by a meat tea provided free of charge to all of the parishioners, mostly paid for by the Rector, Rev. Simon Adams, who was also celebrating his 80th birthday that day. There was music, dancing and sports competitions, including climbing a greasy pole to win a leg of mutton!

This photo of the organising committee of Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee in 1897 shows the celebratory arch that villagers traditionally built for major celebrations. This one was at the entrance to School End.

COO SAVE THE OPEN

Past jubilee celebrations have often included fancy dress competitions and parades. This is a photo of George Edmans in his prize-winning fancy dress costume on the occasion of King George V's Silver Jubilee in 1935. George and his motorbike are dressed as Sir Malcolm Campbell in the land speed recordbreaking car, Blue Bird.



Queen Elizabeth II's coronation celebrations in 1953 also included a pageant of past monarchs as well as a children's costume parade. This photo shows some of the village children leading the parade, dressed as various patriotic characters, including Britannia.


#### - NEARLY THERE

#### **VILLAGE LITTER PICK**


The group took part in the village litter pick on Sunday 8th May.




