

ST JAMES'S CHURCHYARD

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) of St James' Church in Great Horwood bears responsibility for the upkeep of the churchyards in the immediate vicinity of the church as well as the new burial site close to the allotments next to the school. We are very grateful to those who help to retain them as open and attractive spaces for reflection and recreation in addition to their being sacred spaces where former residents of the Great Horwood and Singleborough have been lovingly buried and their lives commemorated by their friends and family members for many generations.

In common with civic burial grounds, there are strict rules governing how churchyards are to be managed, and in the parish, these are provided by the Chancellor (a senior judge) of the Diocese in the Consistory Court of the Diocese of Oxford. The 'Churchyard Regulations' set out the responsibilities of the rector, the PCC, and the churchwardens (but especially the rector or 'incumbent') when maintaining these spaces, and we are legally obliged to ensure that our churchyards always comply with these rules.

The regulations are provided to ensure that the churchyards remain safe spaces not only for those who visit, but for those caring for the grounds as well. The limitations placed on the design, shape, and wording on ledger stones and gravestones, and the types of floral and other tributes placed on them are designed to ensure that they are consistent with the doctrines of the Church of England, do not offend or endanger others, and retain these spaces as tranquil oases of quiet reflection.

Increasingly, we are also being encouraged to consider how our churchyards can be used to foster biodiversity and provide safe environments for many of our rapidly disappearing indigenous species of butterflies, bees, newts, and insects. The regulations also ensure that within reason, the notion that we are all equal in death is not overshadowed by overly ostentatious or showy displays of 'one-upmanship', so that the equal dignity and worth of all the churchyard's permanent 'residents' is maintained; and no one monument or plot stands out over and above those around it. To that extent, the regulations forbid the planting of shrubs or trees, though the planting of a small number of bulbs by each plot is allowed subject to the permission of the rector. Plastic flowers and plastic wreaths are not allowed, except for artificial poppies to commemorate those who have died in the service of their country in time of war or other conflict. Fresh cut or silk flowers may be placed

upon the grave, as can other floral arrangements so long as these do not contain plastics or other non-biodegradable materials and are removed once they have decayed or become faded, or the season they are commemorating (e.g. Christmas, Easter etc.) has passed.

Up to three small toys or similar objects may be left on the grave of a small child or infant for a period of 12 months from the date of burial with the permission of the rector, but statues, vases, lights, and other solid objects should not be left on any graves whatsoever, as these have a tendency to break or shatter and may impede the use of lawn mowers and other machinery used by our contractors, as do stone and glass chippings, new boundary stones, wooden borders; and other materials used to delineate individual grave spaces. These materials pose a particular danger as they can cause significant injury if thrown up by a lawn mower (or similar) towards those using them.

Any visitor to our churchyards will be aware that many of these regulations have not been observed in the recent past, which is entirely understandable as the dangers posed may not immediately be apparent. It is my legal responsibility however, to ensure that our churchyards comply fully with 'The Churchyard Regulations of 2016 which are legally binding upon me and all other users of the churchyard including the families and friends of those buried there, so I am writing to advise you that any such items not removed by the end of June 2024 will need to be removed and disposed of after that date. I realise that this is likely to be a very emotive topic for some, but many of you will be aware that Winslow Town Council have recently had to enforce very similar regulations at Furze Lane Burial Ground. We do want to be as responsive and sensitive as possible about this, which is why we are giving everyone the opportunity to remove items of sentimental or monetary value before this time. We have also had a problem with fly tipping on the graves at the back of the church and would ask those responsible to respect the dignity and sanctity of this space by disposing of their garden waste properly. We have a small congregation, and it is not fair that they must bear the cost of cleaning up what others have left there.

Please do not hesitate to contact me if you would like to discuss further, or if you have any ideas as to how we might make the churchyards more attractive open spaces for the whole community to cherish and enjoy. Reverend Steve.

There was a special mention to Sarah Biswell who took over as Clerk to the Council on 1st September 2023 and to Mandy Cliffe who has continued to assist the council with its accounting activities.

A great community event, hearing about what our local clubs and societies have been up to for the last 12 months. Also attending were the recipients of the Worthy Causes Grants that were presented last year.

The Village Hall has been refurbished as a space for everyone in the village to use, and the Chairman encouraged any group that needs a place to meet to get in touch with those who run the Village Hall to enjoy the space that has been created.

Annual Council Meeting

At the Council meeting held on 13th May Cllr John Gilbey was re-elected as Chairman and Cllr. Cousins was re-elected as Vice Chairman.

MOBILE VEHICLE ACTIVATED SIGN

We need a new team of two volunteers to operate the Parish Council's Mobile Vehicle Activated Sign (MVAS). This is the device that records the volume and speed of traffic passing and can be used in discussion with Buckinghamshire Council and Thames Valley Police to prove the need for some form of traffic calming. There are 5 sites around the parish where it can be used - 2 In Nash Road and 1 each in Little Horwood Road, Winslow Road and Singleborough. The operators are responsible for moving it to the various sites, downloading and analysing the data and reporting to the Parish Council.

GOOD NEWS FROM NOOK PARK

It's been a while since you've heard from us, so now is the time to let you all know what's going on at Nook Park.

A second resident has won their Tribunal against Mr Burns. This is good news for us and although it's not 100% outright win as the resident will not be getting their garden back they will get compensation. The Judge ruled that the resident had lost a substantial amount of garden.

We have also seen the arrival of the first of the new homes. This is a semi-detached home and is 50 feet in length. Each home has 2 bedrooms, bathroom and open plan kitchen living space. All fitted with central heating, bathroom, kitchen and wardrobes. It came as usual in two halves and was expertly towed from the top of Willow Road down onto the site by a landrover. It was difficult for Dean Roberts and his team to get it into Nook Park so two days later when the second half arrived it had the chassis modified for it to move a lot easier. This proved the right thing to do as the first half took nearly 8 hours from the top of Willow Road to arrive near its pitch. Unfortunately, the contractors had laid all the paths around each pitch, the house weighs 14 tonnes, so the slabs have been broken. Dean will be keeping us all informed as a village when more are due to come. We have no lighting again as they have had to turn them off as some of the lights have to be moved while the houses are being brought to the site.

Mr Burns has appealed against the Council's decision that he is not a Fit and Proper Person to run the site. This went to Tribunal, and we are waiting for the decision from the Judge. It just so happens it's the same Judge who did the other 2 Tribunals. As soon as we hear we'll keep you updated. The perimeter hedge

has been replaced now it's waiting game for it to establish. This will take years as the other hedge was between 60 and 100 years old.


