

From Rev Belinda Searle-Barnes

It seems almost incredible that we have reached the month of March already and the first quarter of the year will have passed by the end of the month. Of course this means we are well on the way to Spring and Summer which has to be good news! As I write this, the snowdrops are beginning to bloom which is always a hopeful sign.

This March we have some very important days to mark and celebrate and at St James' Church we will be doing that in different ways according to the occasion. I do hope to see you at some of them.

Great Horwood and Singleborough are very fortunate to have such a beautiful church with such a rich history outlined in the village book, 'Great Horwood, Past And Present'. The building of St James' encompasses all kinds of worship, and during Lent and Holy Week there will be a number of services all contributing to the sense of pilgrimage and spiritual journey associated with this significant time through Lent to Holy Week and Easter. These services offer an opportunity to gather together with a focus directed beyond the constraints and tensions of contemporary life. While private prayer is very important and builds up a personal relationship with God, it is also very important that we as people, gather together to listen, sing and meditate on the word of God so that the refreshing and ever creative spiritual presence of God can be experienced in a shared way. This shared experience of God is life giving and can take us way beyond our personal concerns and plans to see with new vision.

Some of these services include **Mothering Sunday** which this year falls on **March 10th**. We are having a **special Come and Praise service at 11 am** (preceded by breakfast in St James at 10.30am), in which we will celebrate the gift of motherhood both in the divine and human sense through joyful music and worship. Flowers will be given out to celebrate the variety and beauty of God's love. God is only too aware that some people's experience of motherhood is wonderful while for others this is not the case and much healing is needed. Also, God is aware that for some there is a longing for a child that has never come to fruition, and sorrow and a sense of loss prevails. Mothering Sunday encompasses all these human experiences and coming together with others can be enlightening and comforting.

'As a mother comforts her children, so I will comfort you; you shall see and your heart shall rejoice, you shall flourish like the grass of the fields' Isaiah 66

On Palm Sunday, 24th March you can meet at the bottom of Willow Road at 10.15am for the annual traditional Palm Sunday procession through the Village finishing with a service in St James Church. At this service the palm crosses are blessed and such words as 'Hosanna to the King of David' are sung. Palm Sunday marks the decision of Jesus to choose to enter the city of Jerusalem knowing he was likely to meet his death as the prophets had foretold....He could have slipped away into the hills to lead a quiet life well into old age.....he did not for the sake of the world.

On Good Friday this year we are having a 'Village Service for Good Friday' with traditional hymns such as 'There Is A Green hill Far Away' and 'The Old Rugged Cross' together with Gospel readings about the Passion of Christ. There will

also be an opportunity for everyone who wishes to bring a lighted candle to place on the large wooden cross in the Church and to silently offer prayer about people and places in the world where there is suffering today.

On Easter Day there is a said Holy Communion at 8am (BCP) and then a wonderful Family celebration at 11 am when we sing the joyful hymns of Easter as we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ, new beginnings and the promise of eternal life. It is a wonderful and spiritual time when we can look forward in hopefulness and expectancy. Following the Service there is an Easter Egg hunt for the children.... although some years I have witnessed those of a greater age joining in with great energy!!!

I DO HOPE YOU WILL COME AND JOIN IN THE PILGRIMAGE OF LENT AND HOLY WEEK.

Neighbourhood Watch

'Have your say' meetings are your opportunity to speak with your neighbourhood officers to discuss any local issues of concern you may have. If you wish to have your say, the next meeting is at Henry's, High Street, Winslow at 10am – 12 noon on the 5th of March and the 30th of April 2013, The contact is PCSO Wendy Taylor.



There are a number of issues in our district concerning speeding, crime and crime in the countryside. Thames Valley Police are committed to a series of enforcement operations with the assistance of the Road Policing Unit across the South of Buckingham area. Community Speedwatch initiatives have also been set up across the area in conjunction with their partners. Do not Speed!

Crime Priorities: Over recent months there has been an increase in burglary and vehicle crimes across the South of Buckingham area. There has also been an increase in the number of break-ins to business premises and sheds across the area. Thames Valley Police are taking part in a crime operation specifically aimed at tackling such issues across the area. They will target key offenders and patrol these areas subject to such crimes.

Countryside crime: This is a concern and something that the Police are monitoring closely. They have received reports about thefts of saddlery - generators, diesel oil, also horseboxes and trailers, large plant and machinery. This is a national problem it is not confined to the Thames Valley Police area but they are specifically focussing on it. Please pay attention to your security. Any problems ring:-

Mark Thomas from ISP (Integrated Services Programme) Foster Care was the speaker for our February meeting. In a quiet, relaxed manner he gave a brief resume of his career which has been dedicated to helping vulnerable children in care. He then went on to tell us of the documented history of fostering, how it had first been recorded in the 14th century, how the church in the 1850s took children from workhouses and placed them with families of their congregations, to the evacuees of WWII. The lessons of the Second World War helped to put in place the foundations of modern fostering but it is continually changing under the influence of political and public scrutiny.

He explained how IPS works alongside local authorities providing fostering, childcare, education and therapy for young people. Mark then outlined what they expect from a foster parent by asking us to draw one. Our portrait skills left much to be desired but all were quite similar, an all encompassing, loving, understanding human being! Mark then told us the long process to becoming a foster parent, how much they are needed and appreciated.

This month on the **12th March** our speaker will be **Linda Davies** from the **Waterside Theatre, Aylesbury**. She will be giving us insight as to how the theatre was built, how it is run and what goes on behind the scenes of a show.



CHAIRMAN'S MONTHLY REPORT

LAST MEETING – MONDAY 11TH FEBRUARY 2013

Planning Matters

AVDC has once again refused permission for the latest in a number of applications to build a detached property in the garden of 11 The Green (12/02584/APP).

The Council decided that it could not support an outline proposal for a development on the site of the Old Mill at the bottom of Spring Lane, with access from Winslow Road via the Greenway Industrial Park, as it was too far outside of the current residential built up area of the village.

Road Closure B4033

This is to remind everybody that we are still being advised by Bucks CC that the B4033 will be completely closed at the Washbrook Bridge to carry out waterproofing on the bridge. The planned closure is from 4th March to 1st April (although they have indicated that they hope to complete the work in a shorter time) and there will be no access even for emergency vehicles. The proposed diversion route is via the A421 to Thornborough and then via Padbury and the A413. A copy of the Temporary Traffic Regulation Order is lodged on the Parish Council website and posted on the notice boards in the High Street and the Village Hall.

Movable Vehicle Activated Signs

Bucks CC has advised that it has placed the order for the equipment which is to be installed in a number of parishes in the area but the necessary survey to confirm the exact position of the sites in Great Horwood for the Movable Vehicle Activated Speed Signs (MVAS's) has not yet been carried out.

Footway at the top of Nash Road

As I am writing this (on the 14th February), Transport for Buckinghamshire are in the process of installing the footway at the top end of Nash Road from the Cricket Ground towards the A421 to meet the existing cycle path and so by the time you are reading this it should all be completed and in place. This footway was installed at the suggestion of Derek and Sylvia Whitehall and represents another improvement to the village environment from your Parish Council.

Footpaths Report

Robert Deuchar submitted his usual monthly report which advised that:

"All the footpaths in the Parish have been inspected and pruned between 8th December and 31st January."

Funding from the Winslow and District Local Area Forum

The Parish Council has made a number of applications for funding from the delegated budget which will be available in 2013/14 from the Bucks CC Winslow and District Local Area Forum. An application for £1000 which has been made with the Great Horwood and Singleborough Youth Club is very likely to be successful and due to the scrapping of another 2012/13 project it is possible that further funding will be available to the club. The request for funding to go towards the provision a 2nd world war memorial has been refused and the funding for the extended footway in Nash Road has been referred to Transport for Buckinghamshire.

New Homes Bonus

AVDC have agreed that 15% of its allocation of the Government's grant paid for each new home built and called the New Homes Bonus will be allocated to schemes proposed and delivered by parish and town councils. Parish and town councils will be invited

to submit proposals for spending money in their individual areas and a panel of 3 district councillors and 2 parish council representatives will be set up to consider the applications and their views will be passed to the AVDC Cabinet for final decision. Aylesbury Vale Association of Local Councils (AVALC) will be asked to nominate the parish representatives on the panel.

Conservation Area Review

As advised in my report last month the final revised 2 Conservation Areas for Great Horwood and Singleborough were approved by the AVDC Cabinet on 18th December. Access to the appraisal documents can be made on the AVDC website using one of the links below or there is a direct link available from the Parish Council website on the page labelled "Conservation Area and Footpaths map"






