# DEVELOPMENT ANARCHY IN GREAT HORWOOD?

Is building development in Great Horwood going to be a free-forall with competing developers submitting independent proposals that, when put together, could alter the village beyond recognition? It's starting to look that way...



Firstly, *Taylor Wimpey* is planning to build 40-48 new homes on 6 acres of land off Weston Road of which, under current Government regulations, 35% would have to be 'affordable'.

*Taylor Wimpey* held a public consultation session in the Village Hall on the 30th of January. Feedback from that meeting was taken into account in drawing up further detailed plans which were presented at a second public meeting on the 27th of February. It is likely that a formal planning application will be submitted to AVDC in the near future. A petition has been sent to AVDC signed by over 80 residents, asking that they delay considering planning permission to *Taylor Wimpey* until Great Horwood's Neighbourhood Plan has been completed.



Secondly, a private developer in partnership with the *Vale of Aylesbury Housing Trust* – a not-for-profit Landlord providing affordable homes – is considering building 46 houses on land at Five Penny Farm (2 Little Horwood Road) with access via Willow Road. Again, under current legislation, 35% of these homes would need to be 'affordable'. They have made an initial approach to AVDC, though no public consultation has yet taken place.

In addition, *Gladman*'s, - a developer that submitted a proposal for inclusion in Aylesbury District's 'Local' plan for 1200 houses extending from Winslow into Great Horwood – has put in a legal challenge which has had the result of delaying the adoption of, and potentially nullifying, Winslow's Neighbourhood Plan. At the heart of the challenge is whether a Neighbourhood Plan can be adopted in the absence of a 'Local' Plan. For Great Horwood, the recent rejection of the 'Vale of Aylesbury Plan, means that there isn't a 'Local' Plan in place, so even if we were to complete our Neighbourhood Plan, it may not be possible for it to be legally be adopted.

All of this, the ad hoc planning applications and the uncertainty of the status of a 'Neighbourhood Plan' could well mean that development within Great Horwood becomes no more than a free-for-all. The result is likely to be housing developments far larger and more intensive than the local community have shown their support for in all recent consultations and surveys.

So can we do anything about this?

YES! We can do a number of things:

- Complete our Neighbourhood Plan. Despite the legal uncertainty, it is vital this is completed if Great Horwood is to be heard with one voice and carry weight with any of the planning bodies. A team is currently working on this. Please support them.
- Everyone in the village should complete the HOUSING NEEDS SURVEY that is included within this copy of 'Focus'. This is YOUR CHANCE to influence what development happens in our village. The more people who respond, the greater the chance of us collectively shaping the outcome.
- 3. Write/e-mail to our local MP, John Bercow, Speaker of The House: (e-mail → john.bercow.mp@parliament.uk) and to the Housing Minister, Nick Bowles: (e-mail → nick.boles@communities.gsi.gov.uk) to seek reassurances about the importance of Neighbourhood Plans so that local communities have a voice in the Development of their village.



### W.I News



In February, we welcomed John Stepney who gave us a very interesting talk on the role of 'Service by Emergency Rider Volunteers' (SERV), ably assisted by his daughter on the computer.

SERV works with the NHS providing a rapid response courier service carrying anything, bar pizzas, that is related to patient welfare, including blood and blood products, premature baby milk, tissue, x-rays, neural scans, medication, surgical tests and patient notes between medical establishments.

They are a national registered charity started by the NHS seven years ago funded by public donations and sponsorship. John and his team of 100+ volunteers work from 7pm to 6am, 365 days a year, covering the Bucks, Oxon and Northants area. In 2012 they answered 1,212 calls. When it's bad weather 4X4's are available.

A bike costs £13,000 with £3,000 annual running costs, though volunteers often pay for the petrol themselves. 'They are essentially bikers and enjoy the demands of the job'. Volunteers come from all walks of life but must be at least 30 years old and IAM, RoSPA or Police Advance Qualification trained.

They are in dialogue with the government concerning being able to drive through red traffic lights. Only police, ambulance and the fire brigade can do so at the moment, but new legislation will include 'blood' soon. Nationally, 262 hospitals call on this service, using 1,138 volunteers.

We were shown slides and short films of call outs and grateful hospital staff.

Our next meeting is on Tuesday 11th March at 7.30pm in the Village Hall, when Debbie Gibbs will be talking on Magistrates in the Community. There will be a quiz on TV Detectives.



Our Very Own Dornier Bomber Plane Lands at GHS!
A World War II Dornier Bomber has landed at Great
Horwood School and is currently hovering about three
metres above our sports field!

The Bomber is only visible when viewed using a specially developed Augmented Reality App called Apparition: Dornier17.

In June 2013, the RAF Museum successfully lifted the only known German Dornier Do17 bomber from the waters of the Goodwin Sands, three miles off the coast of England. The event was a media phenomenon with viewers across the globe tuned in to watch it happen live. Now, the RAF Museum is using cutting edge digital technology to share its newly acquired exhibit with the world, and Great Horwood is one of only a few locations around the world to have such an exhibit!

Thanks go to Mr Nash for organising this exciting addition to Great Horwood School, and for organising a visit from the RAF Museum to share the Dornier and related artefacts with our Year 3 class.

# Chairman's Monthly Report Last Meeting – Monday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2014

### Neighbourhood Plan

Since the last PC meeting the Neighbourhood Planning Team have held three meetings as well as a meeting with AVDC Forward Plans team and since my last report in the February edition of Focus events have moved at quite a pace.

The front page of this edition of Focus highlights very clearly the major issues now facing Great Horwood and many other rural areas in Aylesbury Vale. It makes quite clear the danger that future developments on a large scale could now be submitted for approval to AVDC. We need confirmation from the Department of Communities and Local Government that Neighbourhood Plans will still be used in planning for future development. This is as originally intended as a reflection of the wishes of the local community in line with the Governments promise of the importance of Localism. So please consider very carefully if you can spare the time to write to Nick Boles and John Bercow. There are European Elections coming up and it is only just over a year to the next General Election so if enough people express their views maybe that will be heard.

Also, please complete the Housing Needs Survey enclosed with this copy of Focus so that your views on future housing need in the parish and any specific housing needs that you may have for yourself or your family can be recorded and influence future development in the parish.

#### **Planning Committee**

Early last year AVDC introduced a revised procedure whereby an objection by the Parish Council to a Planning Application which is recommended for approval by the Case Officer will only be heard if the Parish Council attends and speaks at the AVDC Development Control Committee. At the end of the trial period this revised procedure has now been confirmed as a permanent change.

I have occasionally attended and spoken at such meetings and I wanted confirmation from the other members of the Planning Committee that they are also prepared to speak at a meeting of the AVDC Development Control Committee if it becomes necessary to make the views of the Parish Council heard. Those members of the Planning Committee present (Cllrs. Mayne, Scholtens and Lamberton) agreed that they would be willing to support the views of the Parish Council in this way.

#### **Recreation Committee**

The Parish Council agreed to the detailed budget request for 2014-15 submitted by the Recreation Committee for the maintenance and development of Horwode Pece and noted that if all the plans are realised some of the funding will need to be allocated from existing reserves.

# Mobile Vehicle Activated Sign (MVAS)

You will have noticed that the speed indicating sign was moved from the Winslow Road to the top of Nash Road. Also see a report from Cllr Mayne elsewhere in this edition of Focus highlighting data on speeds collected from a week of traffic coming into the village in Winslow Road. We will approach Thames valley Police with the information that we collect and ask them to carry out an official speed check and prosecute those that are caught speeding.





