

5th March Referendum

Neighbourhood Plan

The referendum on the Great Horwood Neighbourhood Development Plan takes place on Thursday 5th March, when all registered voters in the Parish can vote for or against the plan. Voting will take place in Great Horwood Village Hall, between 7am and 10pm.


and paper copies are available in the Village Hall, St James Church or with the Parish Clerk.

You will be asked to vote 'yes' or 'no' to this question:

'Do you want Aylesbury Vale District Council to use the neighbourhood plan for Great Horwood to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?'

A simple majority will decide the outcome: If more people vote 'yes' than 'no', then Aylesbury Vale District Council will use the Neighbourhood Development Plan to help it decide planning applications in Great Horwood. If more people vote 'no' than 'yes', then the plan will be ignored by AVDC in deciding planning applications.

The Plan covers the period from now until 2031 and at its heart are 3 housing development proposals on open land comprising up to 45 new houses (an 11% increase in the current housing stock in the parish), of which up to 1/3rd will be designated as 'affordable'. These 3 development areas are:



- 1.2 acres (approx.) of land south of Little Horwood Road for up to 15 houses. Open land of a little under 2 acres to the east of the new houses will be specifically designated as NOT for future development.
- 1.2 acres (approx.) of land north of Little Horwood Road for up to 15 houses and additional land of a similar size for a new village park.
- 1.2 acres (approx.) of land off Nash Road for up to 15 houses, with a landscaped gap between it and existing housing. Land to the north of the housing area will also be landscaped.

Over the past year residents have been widely consulted and involved in creating the plan. Issues, proposals and concerns have been debated at length and the plan has the support of The Parish Council. But now is the acid test: **WILL YOU, THE RESIDENTS OF GREAT HORWOOD AND SINGLEBOROUGH SUPPORT IT?**

You Decide. Your vote counts. I strongly urge you to vote on the 5th of March.



Footpaths - Two Requests Please

Thanks largely to the efforts of Robert Deuchar who lives in Singleborough, we now have some of the best footpaths in the whole of Bucks. As a result, they are now used more frequently and by more people, especially dog walkers.

Unfortunately, this increased usage has resulted in two problems for farmers in the area: Straying off the footpath and Dog faeces (poo).

- **1.Could all users of footpaths please stay on the designated path and not deviate from it** as this causes a number of problems for farmers (e.g. damages crops, makes planting difficult) and their livestock.
- **2. Please could owners/walkers pick up after their dogs.** This is really important because the presence on grazing land of

faeces from some dogs can cause two specific diseases in livestock.

- Neosporosis which can cause abortions in cattle.
- Sarcocystosis which can cause neurological disease and death in sheep.



On May 7th elections for the Parish Council will be taking place.

There are 7 Parish Councillor Positions to be filled and currently only 2 Councillors have confirmed they will be standing for re-election. Unless a minimum of three Councillors are elected and attend meetings, Parish Business cannot be carried out.

- Councillors represent the interests of the whole community and can contribute towards a wide variety of topics. In the past 4 years the PC has devised a neighbourhood plan, commented on over one hundred planning applications, installed the mobile speed signs, installed planters at the entrances to the village, sourced grants from the county and district thus enabling the provision of funds to assist village organisations, established allotments, contributed to the management of Horwode Pece and the Village Hall along with many other tasks.
- Parish Councillors also have many opportunities to join with Councillors from other parishes and together contribute to the development of district and county wide issues and policies.
- Councillors should have access to the internet in order to study planning applications online, respond to emails and to liaise with external bodies.
- Parish Council meetings are held in the Village Hall at 7.30pm on the 2nd Monday of every month except January and August.
- Councillors should be keen to attend and contribute to meetings and be prepared to spend some time outside of meetings on Parish Council business.

As long as you are at least 18 years old, and either a British, Commonwealth or EU citizen on the day of nomination you can apply providing you are on the electoral register as a local government elector for Great Horwood & Singleborough or have lived within 3 miles of the Parish for the whole of the 12 months prior to nomination.







Neighbourhood Plan - VOTE YES

The talk of development and where it should be has been incredibly emotive for the villagers of Great Horwood. It's been a difficult road, with meetings, open events, petitions, letters for and against in local media, posters on the lampposts and leaflets through your door. We're all different, some may not be bothered, maybe you don't feel you know enough, or you could have been following it from the very beginning. But make no mistake, this vote is a privilege that we should all embrace. As John Bercow has written in his recent supporting letter to the Parish Council: "The power is now in the hands of the Great Horwood people".

The Neighbourhood Planning Team have worked hard to take on the large scale developers to protect the village the best they can, and at times this could not have been easy. So the 'Vote YES 4 the plan' campaigners ask you to take note of the polling cards recently sent through the post (these are not for the General Election!) to vote YES for the Great Horwood Neighbourhood Plan on Thursday 5th March in the village hall between 7am and 10pm, and follow the lead of Winslow, who have successfully voted in their plan, thereby stopping mass building between them and us.

The choices if you're still not clear are:

YES

We expect that The Great Horwood Neighbourhood Plan will deliver over the next fifteen to twenty years 45 new homes on three sites: two on the Little Horwood Road and one on the Nash Road. They will have their own access, each with 15 homes, of which roughly 5 will be 'affordable', meaning rental or shared ownership via a Housing Association. In case AVDC in years to come, insist on more housing, the independent inspector who passed the plan for referendum, has suggested a reserve site. Hopefully this will never happen. If there is any proof of locals needing social housing, (if you know of someone it may be worth letting the Parish Council know), there may be a possibility of negotiating for this with the developers, although this can't be guaranteed. Also, there may be an opportunity to form a committee to work with the Parish Council, who can support the kind of housing the villagers feel is needed.

Or

NO

Two large-scale developers want to build up to 80 homes NOW, mostly 4 and 5 beds, with the possibility of 30% affordable which are unlikely to be directed towards our own locals. And there is a great possibility there could be more development to follow. because building houses is their job; it's what they do.

So let's not give them the opportunity. Please....Vote YES. And remember that Voting NO doesn't mean no to development.

Chairman's Monthly Report Last Meeting – Monday 9th February 2015

Neighbourhood Plan

I reported at the meeting on the very positive comments made by the examiner on the way that the plan had been produced and confirmed that the changes that the examiner had proposed had been accepted by AVDC and have now been incorporated in the Referendum version of the plan. This version is now available on the AVDC website and on the Great Horwood Parish Council website. Paper copies are available for inspection in the village hall, St James Church and with the Clerk to the Council at 2, Spring Close.

I confirmed that the Parish Council is not allowed to canvas or campaign for a particular outcome for the referendum but a leaflet which had been prepared and which sets out the facts of the plan and urges everybody to cast their vote on 5th March was unanimously approved for printing and distribution on behalf of the Parish Council.

Planning Matters

An application has been made to build 1855 homes on the South side of the A421 and to the East of Whaddon Road and extending South to the currently disused railway line. (15/00314/AOP). I confirmed that although the development is entitled South West Milton Keynes it does in fact lie wholly within Aylesbury Vale. It was agreed that we should ask AVDC Planning Department for a copy of the traffic impact assessment that should have been submitted with the planning application.

We also agreed to join with other affected local councils so that we can make a joint study of the issues and work together to ensure the best outcome for all those parishes that will be affected if the proposal goes ahead.

A defibrillator for the village

The defibrillator has arrived and we are awaiting the box which will contain it and then the installation on the wall of the village hall can go ahead. Our County Councillor Cllr. John Chilver has very kindly agreed to contribute £360 to the cost of the project from his discretionary fund.

Devolved Services from Bucks County Council

It appears that approximately 60 of the 166 local councils in the County have agreed to take on the cutting of grass verges and hedges within the 30/40mph boundaries of their parishes. Recent information from BCC is that in future the offer that is available in the current year to encourage councils to take over this responsibility may not be repeated in the following years. It is my opinion that in 2 to 3 years' time Bucks County Council will have completely stopped providing this service and local parish councils will be forced to take it on.

Closure of Winslow Police Office

It was agreed that we would write a letter to the Crime Commissioner and to the Chief Constable of Thames Valley Police expressing our concerns about the plan to close the police office in Winslow. This decision has been made without consultation and along with other changes in police procedures, raises concerns about the future of Neighbourhood Policing in the area.

Annual Parish Meeting

This will take place on Monday 13th April from 7.30pm in the village hall and all residents are very welcome to attend. The Parish Council will as usual be inviting spokespersons from the various voluntary organisations to tell us about their past and future activities. This will, of course, be the final Annual Parish Meeting of the current Parish Council and so if you are planning to stand as a candidate for the Parish Council in May then this is an ideal opportunity to see what goes on in the village and to

meet a wide range of people representing different groups within the parish.

Parish Council Elections

These will be held on 7th May at the same time and place as the general election and the election for members of Aylesbury Vale District Council.
