Racing in the U14 category in Austria at the Ambition Championships and Team Evolution Speed Race Series, Zac skied to podium places in all the alpine events; Slalom, Giant Slalom, Super G and Alpine Combined.

He now moves across to Italy and then France to take part in the English and British Championships over the next few months before undertaking a punishing summer training programme.

His hard work on and off the slopes has been recognised with a place on the Snowsport England Alpine Development Squad.

The Akeley Wood pupil trains out in Austria with Team Evolution Alpine Race Academy and with Ski MK Race Team at Snozone MK. He regularly trains alongside Winter Olympic Team GBR athletes and is working hard to be selected to represent GBR.

It is a short reflective service of readings and prayer. All welcome.


Maundy Thursday Service







PARISH PUMP

2018 - 2019 PRECEPT - COUNCIL TAX

Great Horwood Parish Council has agreed a precept of £28, 590 for the 2018 - 2019 financial year and the precept is, therefore, unchanged from 2017 - 2018. You might like to know that central government have stopped all grants to local authorities and Parish spending is now completely funded by residents.



LAND SOUTH OF LITTLE HORWOOD ROAD

In correspondence with another local council, Cllr John Gilbey received the following endorsement of dealings with Croudace,



the developer responsible for the future Land South of Little Horwood Road development.

"After initial disapproval and dissent towards the development (45 houses), the company and contractors have operated to a high standard and been more than obliging over residential and transport problems that have arisen. The architecture and building practices that have been carried out, are to a pleasing conclusion, I think it will end up being one of the most sought-after sites in the village."

Additionally, a recent meeting with the developers confirmed that 10 of the 30 houses being built on this site will be affordable. Domestic heating will be fuelled by propane gas and each property will have an external electric socket to facilitate electric car charging. Properties should be available from early 2020.

GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION

The Parish Council is currently preparing for GDPR - the long and complex General Data

Protection Regulation. This is EU legislation that is not going to go away after Br*x*t. To make matters complicated, the British Government is "augmenting" GDPR with a Data Protection bill, which by 25th May 2018 will be an Act! Unless the Government see sense and take into account representations from Local Council bodies, this will mean having to appoint a Data Protection Officer, increasing costs for PCs. The Parish Council will be receiving guidance from district authorities but in the interim, preparation includes training and looking at the advice offered by the Information Commissioners Office.

Put very simply, there are two main categories of data

1. Personal Data

GHPC does not process a great deal of personal data and, sensibly, will be allowed by the legislation to keep names and addresses of those with whom we have a contract - e.g. for grass cutting, allotments etc. without asking for permission.

2. Sensitive Personal Data

This includes race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, trade union membership, biometrics and health data, but are things GHPC is highly unlikely to be involved with.

I think the main changes residents will see are data protection notices at the end of GHPC emails and requests for permission to pass any personal details to the appropriate authority in order to complete a task requested of us. However, I await developments.




We have a long way to go to catch up with Sweden (apparently

Chairman's Monthly Report: Last Meeting - Monday 12 February 2018



If we look beyond our parish boundaries, it seems that there are many things which are likely to have Great Horwood a significant impact on parishes in Parish Council North Buckinghamshire. However, at present they all appear to be

moving very, very slowly, if at all. The Local Plan (VALP) is due to be sent to Government by the end of this month. The proposals for local government reorganisation appear to be lost in the machinery at the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (formerly known as the Department for Communities and Local Government). Proposals for East West Rail are evolving with a further round of public consultation have been completed recently and studies are continuing to inform decisions about the route of the Oxford-Cambridge Expressway.

In the midst of this ongoing uncertainty, the Parish Council continues to deal with planning. footpaths and traffic issues but also tries to take a wider perspective. At the recent meeting our County Councillor, John Chilver, was asked about the fact that Buckinghamshire Children's Services had again failed an Ofsted Inspection. He conveyed a response from the Director of Children's Services that the council is determined to improve its children's services and accepts the findings of this inspection. Whilst the overall judgement remains inadequate, the report does acknowledge improvements since 2014. This includes the judgement of our adoption service as Good. An action plan was produced during the inspection to address issues raised by the inspectors. Ofsted were confident in both elected members and senior leaders of the council to prioritise children's services. We will work very hard with our staff to implement the recommendations made by Ofsted so that children and young people receive a better service. This in turn should improve the outcome of the next inspection.' Councillor Chilver also brought the meeting up-to-date on the County Council's Budget, noting that this will be the first year that there is no government funding available to the County any more. District Councillor, Sir Beville Stanier, who is the AVDC Cabinet Member for Environment and Waste, told the meeting about AVDC's new fleet of refuse vehicles which offer enhanced performance, improved fuel economy and greater safety, compared to the leased vehicles they are replacing.
