Fruity Toast

Ingredients

- 4 large slices of crusty bread
- 4 teaspoons salted butter

50gms white sugar

1 tsp cinnamon plus some to sprinkle

75gms ricotta cheese or mascarpone

8 large strawberries sliced or your preferred soft fruit (banana, blueberries, raspberries)

Method

- 1-Preheat the grill.
- 2- In a small bowl mix together the cinnamon and sugar, leave to one side.
- 3- Place the bread on a baking sheet.
- 4-Toast the bread under the grill for about 90 seconds per side OR until the toast is golden brown. Keep watch the whole time to make sure it does not burn. Grills will vary.
- 5- Remove from the grill and butter the toast with 1 teaspoon of butter per slice.
- 6- Sprinkle the toast generously with cinnamon sugar (about 1/2 tsp teaspoons per slice). Return to grill for 1 minute to melt the sugar. The kitchen will smell delicious and the cinnamon sugar will be lovely and caramelized. Cool the toast slightly.
- 7- Mix 2 tsp of cinnamon sugar with the ricotta and stir to combine. Divide the ricotta among the toasts and spread to cover.
- 8- Arrange the sliced strawberries on top of the ricotta toasts. Sprinkle with a little cinnamon.
 Place on plates and serve.

Sausage and apple tray bake 🖋

Serves 4

Ingredients

8 pork sausages,

1 tbsp vegetable oil

2 red onions, cut into wedges

4 garlic cloves, peeled and crushed

3 carrots cut into 2cm slices

3 Gala Apples, cut into wedges

1 bunch of fresh sage or 2 level tsp of dried

For the dressing

- 3 tbsps olive oil
- 2 tbsps honey
- 2 tbsps whole grain mustard

Method

- 1-Preheat the oven to 180°C/Fan 160°C/Gas 4.
- 2-Whisk together the dressing -olive oil, honey and whole grain mustard in a small bowl, put aside.
- 3-Add the onion, garlic and carrots to a large baking tray and scatter over the sage leaves and the tbsp of vegetable oil. Mix until everything is coated. Place in the oven cook for 10 mins.
- 4- Remove the tray from the oven add the sausages and apple quarters. Drizzle over the oil and honey dressing. Season with salt and pepper. Mix all ingredients until coated, return the tray to the oven.
- 5-Roast for 35-40 minutes or until golden brown and sticky. If it looks too sticky add a couple of table spoons of water and stir.

Serve with creamy mashed potato and broccoli.

Vegetarian sausages can be a substituted, you may to reduce the final cooking time according to the instructions on the packet.

COVID Vaccine Update – 3rd February 2021

Our vaccine efforts have continued in earnest over the last few weeks and we are making good progress, having administered over 6000 vaccine doses to patients of 3W Health, Waddesdon and Ashcroft Surgeries.

For 3W our current position is:

72% of Group 1 (residential care home patients) have been vaccinated

90% of Group 2 (80+ and known Health & Social Care Workers) have been vaccinated

94% of Group 3 (75-79 year olds) have been vaccinated

87% of Group 4 (70-74 year olds and the Clinically Extremely Vulnerable) have been vaccinated

This week we are focusing on our housebound patients and ensuring they receive their first vaccinations as well as revisiting those residents of care homes who were unable to have the vaccine previously. Our nurses are out on the road and are making contact with each patient / nominated carer prior to our visit.

In terms of further on-site clinics at Winslow Health Centre, we are currently awaiting further information with regard to our next delivery of vaccines and will be in contact with eligible patients once we have further clinic dates to offer. Those of you with existing invitations can continue to check the booking link in your text message as clinics will show as soon as we publish them.

Understandably patients who have received their first vaccine dose have also been asking when their second will be. We continue to be advised that this should be within 12 weeks of the first dose and we will be in contact as soon as we are able to book these appointments.

If you are a healthcare worker and patient of 3W Health who has yet to receive an invitation for vaccination please contact us via our website and we will get back to you.

On 6th May, Parish Council Elections will be taking place. There are 7 Parish Councillor positions to be filled in Great Horwood.

The Parish Council oversees many aspects of the running of the Village as diverse as grass cutting, street lamp maintenance and the allotments, as well as managing the budget and setting the Precept. It considers and comments on many planning applications and contributes to the running of Horwode Pece and the Village Hall. The Village is also looking forward to a second playground in Little Horwood Road within a year and the installation later this year of the LED street lamps it is funding.

Parish Councillors also have the opportunity to raise concerns or ideas with the Winslow and Villages Community Board who represent and act for the interests in the local community. The Parish Council are looking into the possibility of obtaining an improved bus service to the village. We are also working with Winslow Town Council to investigate the possibility of getting a cycle way from Great Horwood to Winslow, although this is a long-term project and is unlikely to come to fruition for about five years.

Parish Councillors must have access to the internet in order to study planning applications online, respond to emails and to liaise with external bodies.


Parish Council meetings are usually held in the Village Hall at 7.30pm on the 2nd Monday of every month except for January and August. At the current time, meetings are held virtually via Zoom, although it is expected that we will revert to our usual practice once Government guidelines allow this. Councillors are expected to attend and contribute to meetings and be prepared to spend some time outside of meetings on Parish Council business.

As long as you are at least 18 years old, and either a British, Commonwealth or EU citizen on the day of nomination, you can apply providing



you are on the Electoral Register as a local government elector for Great Horwood and Singleborough, or have lived within 3 miles of the Parish for the whole of the 12 months prior to nomination.

Nominations need to be with AVDC by Thursday 8th April so if you want to help shape your community and get involved, speak to any of the current Councillors, their contact details are in Focus, or contact the Parish Clerk, Sue Brazier at clerk@greathorwoodpc.org.uk at the earliest opportunity.



The Parish Council are very pleased to let you know that installation of the new LED lamps will start early in April. We are glad that the village can 'do their bit' to reduce our carbon footprint.






