
At the foundry, the children were given the opportunity to learn all about bells and how they are made. They discovered what metals go into the bells and how the moulds for these are manufactured. We also visited the casting hall and saw the workers in action preparing a mould for the next stage

in its journey. Next, we crossed over to the workshop on the other side of the road where the children were able to hear some large bells being rung. They discovered lots of interesting facts about bells and how the John Taylor foundry is the last in the country.

The children were all in awe of the work that Taylor and Co do and were fascinated to find out that they created 'Great Paul', the bell that is in situ in St Paul's Cathedral in London!

To highlight the information the children learnt on our trip, they have written their own recount of the day to retell all of the fantastic things we saw and experienced at The Bell Foundry.



#### GARDENING TIMES

Well done! We've done it, we have managed to make it through the Winter, with all of its storms, all of its rain and cold, and are now (even though it may not always feel like it) into Spring. The month of March is the beginning of the meteorological season of Spring and things will starting to pick up pace soon and, as such, we need to get going with working out what we are going to do in the garden.

March is a strange one, sometimes Winter just doesn't want to let go but with the extending days and those extra hours of daylight in the soil, it all starts warming up, so we need to get ourselves prepared.

Across the country, there will be potatoes chitting (no, that isn't a badly spelled rude word) in egg boxes in places around people's houses. The idea is that chitting gives the potatoes a head start with growth and it always fills me with joy when I see the little stubby shoots starting to sprout.

There is a bit of a knack to doing it properly though. Potatoes don't grow from the roots of the plant but actually from the base of the stem. So if you want tatties that are big size, it is best to limit the number of stems that the tubers produce. The higher number of stems that you have, the greater number of spuds there will be, but they will be smaller. Like so many things in life, it is a trade off.

Where they are stored is also vital for their chances, you don't want them next to the radiator, they should be kept cool as a big difference in temperature will send them into shock and will stop dead any momentum that they have managed to acquire. You want them

somewhere that is light but not in direct sunlight and the chits should be around an inch long when they are planted.

Potatoes have a fascinating history, coming from the shores of Lake Titicaca around Bolivia and Peru, they were considered sacred by the Incas, who were the first potato eaters.

They came to this country in the late 16th Century but were immediately viewed with suspicion by the British who refused to eat them, they were said to, "encrease seed and provoke lust, causing fruitfulness in both sexes" and were seen by early Scottish Presbyterians as being a food that was, "thoroughly unbiblical". Eating too many of them was thought to lead to leprosy and was even blamed for preventing people from wanting revolution by making them sluggish.

They are now so ubiquitous that it is hard to imagine our lives without them. If you have a difficult patch in the garden you can grow them there, they break up the soil and smother weeds and are traditionally planted out on Good Friday so of course, good things are bound to come from that.

#### Jobs to do this month

- Take the time to enjoy your garden, work out what you want to do, where you want to do and just enjoy the first signs of life emerging.
- Lift and divide overgrown clumps of perennials, if possible use 2 garden forks not spades, they do much less damage to the roots.
- Cut down any shrubs that are grown for winter interest such as brightly coloured Dogwoods or Willows.
- Give all of your beds a quick hoe to stunt any emerging weeds but be careful of any bulbs or soft succulent growth of your plants. Your hoe can't tell the difference between the good plants and the bad.
- If you have any strawberries then cover them with a cloche, this will give them a great head start.
- Get sowing those seeds! (and take time to enjoy your garden).



This term, Maples class have enjoyed reading *The Matchbox Diary* by Paul Fleischman.

The book thoughtfully introduces the concept of immigration, using a matchbox full of memo. Although the children were able to research the subject via the internet, they were also extremely lucky to hear about it first hand from a willing parent who came to share his own experiences. Mr Ronsisvalle spoke sensitively about his journey, as a child, from his homeland of Italy to the United Kingdom, mentioning both the highs and lows of such a move.



The children used their newfound knowledge of the subject, to question Salvatore not only about the reasons, and logistics of such a move, but also the emotional implications for a boy of his age leaving family members and friends behind. Although Salvatore mentioned his apprehension at attending school in a new country which spoke a different language, Maples were impressed to hear how Salvatore managed to overcome these difficulties and has since enjoyed a successful career as a Chef. He even shared his favourite Italian dish of Arancini (Italian fried rice balls,) which they all agreed sounded delicious. Maples were a little disgusted however, to discover that, due to the language barrier, it was not uncommon for immigrants to mistake dog food for human food. Not so delicious!

Maples thoroughly enjoyed discussing Migration with Mr Ronsisvalle and, comparing his story to that of their learning support assistant's experiences of emigrating more recently from India. This week, the children have completed their own research and are looking forward to writing their non-chronological reports on the subject next week.
