Hedgehogs hibernate during the

usually from late October/November until March/April, with specific times on when the weather becomes cold enough. Hedgehogs do occasionally awake from hibernation during periods of milder weather in order to forage for food. It can be dangerous for them to wake up unexpectedly though, so please make sure to be careful of any disturbance like loose pets or gardening. When they start to appear around Springtime, this is the time when they are most hungry, and will need to be provided with lots of nutritious food and plenty of fresh water. Hedgehogs will relish any combination of meat-based wet dog or cat foods, or dry cat/kitten food, as these are high in protein that they need. Just remember, they will be getting most of their food from insects and worms in the wild, and this food is only supplementary. You can expect to see more hedgehogs appearing in your garden in Springtime, so please make sure you prepare your garden for these very cute, spiky visitors. more information please check





GREAT HORWOOD & SINGLEBOROUGH WI

At our Great Horwood and Singleborough WI February meeting, representatives from the Medical Detection Dogs gave a fascinating talk about how the charity began and how the dogs are trained to detect diseases such as cancer, neurological conditions, malaria and bacterial infections, often before symptoms appear. Robin Galvin and Christiana also explained the ground-breaking research that is done in Great Horwood and the success the centre has had in finding non-invasive and accurate detection for diseases such as prostrate cancer. The highly trained dogs can also detect Covid a metre away and are even being used to sniff out newts in the East West Rail project. The work that would take a couple of months for a human to do can be done in hours by these dogs.

The centre also trains Medical Alert Assistance dogs to help individuals with complex health conditions. Using their amazing sense of smell, the dogs can identify minute odour changes emitted prior to an emergency and alert the person to take preventative action. For people suffering from Type 1 diabetes or Postural Orthostatic Tachycardia Syndrome (PoTS) it enables them to live a more independent life. Frances is a very knowledgeable and accomplished speaker and uses vintage Art Deco buckles combined with pearls and antique beads to create necklaces and statement pieces that are stunning to wear. Some of the jewellery made by Frances will be available to buy at around half the price of its retail value.

Update from nook park

We have at last seen some action from Buckinghamshire council.

Joe Burns decided in September 2022 to take away the hedges around the boundary. The one on the western Rd side belongs to a local farmer. The other two by the park. The hedges we're about 60 years old and we therefore are to believe were protected.

It's just taken until February for the council to take any action. As you can see, we are getting some response as they have issued the above direction.

The direction means the site owner cannot do anything with a boundary while this direction is in force. The direction is in force until the 31st July 2023. Representations can be made up until 10th June 2023, and then the council will decide if they confirm the order. There is an investigation ongoing with the council regarding the removal of the hedges. We wait to see!

Again, many thanks for all your support and we are delighted to see so many of Great Horwood and Singleborough taking a walk down to the site.

GREAT HORWOOD SCHOOL This half term Hawthorn Class have been exploring all things space!

In English, we have been studying the text 'Hidden Figures' by Margot Shetterly and have explored the interesting yet challenging lives of the four incredible, African-American women: Mary Jackson, Dorothy Vaughan, Katherine Johnson and Christine Darden. Within this unit of work, the children have had the opportunity to write a non-chronological report about 'The Women who helped create NASA', an informal letter and a heartfelt diary entry detailing the segregation and discrimination these women faced.

In Science, our space theme has been studied through forces and the children have planned, conducted and evaluated a number of investigations. These have involved looking at water resistance on hand-crafted boats, air resistance on parachute size and friction when looking at vehicle movement.

Space playgrounds have been popping up in Hawthorns class this half term, with the children bringing in recycling from home to use as building materials for their apparatus. The children planned, designed and have now created their own space playgrounds in small groups using string, tape, rubber bands and glue guns to secure their work.

Finally, as musicians we have been recreating the opening music for the Superman film (originally by John Williams) to create atmosphere and suspense. Working in small groups, the children composed their own short piece of music, matching it to the visuals in the opening credits.

Overall, Hawthorns have had a half term that is 'out of this world' and relished the various opportunities to showcase their practical, artistic, musical and problem-solving skills!

Derek is on the case here and we will shortly be popping-in to see the young allotmenteers with some samples for approval. We've got thirty boxes in total to make so plenty of

manpower will be needed - we might even have to cut down on tea-breaks!


