



Winslow & District Community Bus Needs Volunteer Drivers

The Winslow & District Community Bus relies on volunteer drivers to run all our services, excursions and hires.

We are always in need of volunteer drivers, especially at the moment! So, if you have a D1 on your licence, and have some spare time, please consider becoming a driver for your local Community Bus.

All of our scheduled routes start at around 9.00am and finish around 1.30pm. We pay out-of-pocket expenses. We also run our own outings visiting all kinds of places, including garden centres, stately homes, shopping centres and countryside drives. The use of the bus is also available to local non-profit groups

We offer certificated training to MiDAS standard

MiDAS is the Minibus Driver Awareness Scheme and is administered by the Community Transport Association. The scheme provides a nationally recognised standard for the assessment and training of minibus drivers and has been designed to enhance minibus driving standards and promote the safer operation of minibuses.

WDCB provide free training to "MiDAS "standards for all our drivers. A certificate is awarded after successful completion of the course, which is valid for four years and is recognised UK-wide. Candidates must be aged over 21 and have category 'D1' on their licence. The course is usually completed in a day, the time being divided between classroom and practical work. The latter comprises coaching and assessment of driving skills plus a briefing on the use of the minibus wheelchair lift.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN REVIEW -STEERING GROUP

Thank you to those residents that have contacted the Parish Council to volunteer their time to being part of the Steering Group - it is greatly appreciated. The first meeting will be arranged shortly.

The Parish Council has received information from Buckinghamshire Council that the "indicative" figure for additional housing required in the parish is an average of 9 per annum. This has been calculated using the government's guide to councils called the "Housing and economic needs assessment" and includes an upwards adjustment to take account the affordability of housing in Buckinghamshire.

PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS

On 1st May 2025, Parish Council Elections will be taking place. There are 7 Parish Councillor positions to be filled in Great Horwood. The Parish Council oversees many aspects of the running of the Village as diverse as grass cutting, street lamp maintenance and the allotments, as well as managing the budget and setting the Precept. It considers and comments on many planning applications and contributes to the running of Horwode Pece and the Village Hall.

Parish Councillors must have access to the internet in order to study planning applications online, respond to emails and to liaise with external bodies. Parish Council meetings are usually held in the Village Hall at 7.30pm on the 2nd Monday of every month except for January and August.

Councillors are expected to attend and contribute to meetings and be prepared to spend some time outside of meetings on Parish Council business.

As long as you are at least 18 years old, and either a British, Commonwealth or EU citizen on the day of nomination, you can apply providing you are on the Electoral Register as a local government elector for Great Horwood and Singleborough.

Nominations need to be with Buckinghamshire Council by Wednesday 2nd April 2025 so if you want to help shape your community and get involved, speak to any of the current Councillors, their contact details are in Focus, or contact the Parish Clerk, Sarah Biswell at clerk@ greathorwoodpc.org.uk at the earliest opportunity.

RECTORS VOICE



It never rains but it pours!

Many of you will be aware that part of churchvard the wall collapsed into adjoining garden last September in the very aftermath of and high winds month in which north Buckinghamshire received more three times its average

monthly rainfall within a few short weeks (Met Office, 09/10/24).

We have been so grateful for the patience, forbearance, and good neighbourliness of the homeowner, who has been so understanding of the situation we face; but that generosity of spirit has not, so far, been shared by our insurers, whose initial response to our claim has been to reject it on the basis that the damage is unlikely to be due to the prevailing weather conditions, but the wall's age.

I am not sure that they thought very hard about the insurance risks they were taking on when agreeing to insure our grade II listed early medieval building and its churchyard, but it seems that nothing is ever as simple as it should be, and we are now involved in more expense and delay to appeal their decision for the £4,000 - £5,000 cost of repairing the wall and removing the offending tree.

It seems that a great many more institutions will do whatever they can to avoid meeting their social, moral, or contractual obligations these days: whether it is call centres that do not answer our calls, delivery companies which fail to deliver the goods we order, or indeed, those leading a church who fail to heed the very expertise they commissioned by failing once again to put safeguarding into the hands of an external, independent body as recommended by Baroness Alexis Jay last year. It is a decision I abhor, but may explain why the Old Testament prophet Jeremiah said 'cursed are those who trust in mere mortals and make mere flesh their strength'. It is an abject lesson that those we look to in a crisis so often let us down, but God knows, and 'blessed are those who trust in the Lord, for they shall be like a tree planted by water, sending out its roots by the stream'.... just so long as there aren't any walls about!

Farewell and New Beginnings

After five great and eventful years with the Winslow Benefice, serving in the parishes of Winslow, Great Horwood with Singleborough, and Addington as your associate priest, I have decided it is time to move on. This wasn't a quick or easy decision, but it feels like the right moment to explore new opportunities and to see where God might be calling me next.

I don't have another church role lined up yet, but since my paid work is outside the church, I have the freedom to take my time. I want to keep an open mind

and discover more about what the church is doing in different places. So, over the next few months, I will visit all sorts of churches, meet new people and learn what's happening elsewhere.

I have loved being part of this community, but my whole ministry has been in market towns and nearby villages, and now I feel ready for a change - something different, something that challenges and refreshes the way I serve. I won't be moving far, as I still live and work nearby, but I may start looking at churches in larger towns or cities. I will miss our three parishes a lot, but it's good to see that Steve and the churches in our benefice are planning new ways of engaging with our communities in future, the village library in church being one such example. In the meantime, I'll continue helping local churches in other parts of the diocese, supporting communities that need ministry as vacancies arise.

I hope this short article is not too self-absorbed, but I couldn't leave without saying goodbye and thank you. Thank you for making me feel so welcome; and thank you for sharing in this extraordinary journey of faith. Thank you too, for the wonderful send-off on my last Sunday with you (see below), and who knows, maybe God will cause our paths to cross again sometime soon! *Didier*

Women's Refuge. It is a charity that we will continue to collect for.

Despite the weather our two walking groups (Mondays and Wednesdays) have continued throughout the winter and for the most part have avoided the heavy downpours. Last week the Monday group enjoyed a trip to Stowe to see the magnificent snowdrop displays.

We've got a number of outings ahead as well as some craft days this quarter which we are looking forward to. Our meeting in March will be a talk by Marie Biswell on learning hand talking to communicate and in April we have a presentation on the importance of foot care by a local podiatrist who will be giving lots of hints and tips on looking after feet.

CPR Training

One of the suggested WI resolutions discussed by members at our January meeting, was how training bystanders in CPR and defibrillation can help save lives. Since then we've noticed that there has been a lot of publicity on television about the importance of learning CPR skills. Apparently, there are over 30,000 out-of-hospital cardiac arrests a year in the UK, and fewer than one in ten people survive. Women have a lower chance of surviving than men. Early CPR and defibrillation can more than double the chances of survival. For anyone interested, you can learn CPR for free online at the British Heart Foundation (BHF) website.

Great Horwood & Singleborough WI meet every second Tuesday each month in the Village Hall, with doors opening at 7.15pm. As well as our monthly meetings with a varied programme of interesting speakers, we organise visits to places of interest and practical craft days. GOOD NEWS ONCE AGAIN FROM NOOK PARK

Well, it's been a while since you have heard from us. The reason being, Joe Burns and some of our Residents Association had a meeting in December with quite a positive outcome.

Joe agreed to relay the paths between some of the homes which means that we no longer must walk on the road to get out of the park on foot. This was dangerous as when deliveries arrive, we are not taking our life in our hands.

The new homes one is a show home, and the other was for rental. This has now been rented to a gentleman who moves on 1st March. We look forward to meeting him and hope he will be happy in his new home.

You may remember that we have been waiting for someone to be appointed as the Fit and Proper Person for the site. Bucks Council has now appointed someone for this role. We have been informed that we will meet him soon.

We have also been informed that a new home will be arriving in April. We look forward to that also. It will be interesting to see if it's different to the other one.

Did you know that when a site owner buys a home to put on the site, they would pay for instance say £75K. They then sell it to a buyer when its on site and say they sell it for £150K they make a 100% profit. The buyers live in it for a few years and then decide to sell for about £250K the next owner then must pay 10% of the purchase price to the site owner. So that means the site owner gets £25K for doing absolutely nothing. This is on top of the pitch fees that we all pay every month. Over a few years they have made £100K profit. When you think this is the average price for a park home can you imagine the kind of profit they make on the homes that cost £500K. Yes, you read it right! More about this and other park home facts soon.
