PARISH COUNCIL SET PRIORITIES FOR 2016

At the well-attended Annual Parish meeting on the 11th of April, council chairman John Scholtens outlined the major issues and priorities for this coming year and beyond.

The biggest issue facing the parish and its council is to ensure the village is developed in accordance with the Neighbourhood Plan. One element of this is continuing to work with developers, landowners and AVDC to progress the 3 housing sites agreed in the plan. But the main challenge is to oppose several planning applications that directly contravene the plan. This includes not only the Taylor Wimpey/Weston Road application, but also the Willow Road proposal for 34 houses that is awaiting a decision, the Old Mill appeal and an expected submission from Gladman for 1,200 houses, over half of which will be within our parish boundary.

Other priorities, as determined by the emerging Great Horwood Parish Plan 2016, are:

- Safeguarding the Parish environment including maintenance of The Green, paths and lighting, as well the services recently taken over from Bucks County Council such as grass cutting
- Provision of recreational facilities for younger people and other groups
- Making the parish roads safer and provision of footpaths and cycle ways
- Supporting existing community facilities and developing new ones





Road issues

I pressed Transport for Bucks (TfB) for information about the proposed A421 road closures. TfB confirmed that a daytime road closure request had been made for 1st April until July, (Nash roundabout to Buckingham). This is a block booking to allow for programme



slippage and weather conditions. Minor repairs that can only be done in good weather are still required (including laying surface chippings). TfB have promised to advise the PC when the work will start and ensure access for local traffic. Residents have been in touch about Adstock Bulk Solutions lorries driving through the village (to avoid the failed road surface at the top of Pilch Lane). Pilch Lane is now suffering with evidence of new subsidence. The matter is being looked at but there appears to be little we can do. Pilch Lane is a public road and the "unsuitable for HGV" sign is only advisory. TfB can do nothing and Adstock Parish Council have not been helpful. Residents of the Lane are writing to the company to ask them to use the Adstock exit (they have 2). If you feel strongly enough, I suggest you do the same. Please contact Mr J Nicholson, Pilch Farm, Pilch Lane, Adstock, Milton Keynes, MK17 ONX or email fergus.okelly@ adstockbulk.com. Alternatively you can contact County Councillor John Chilver at jchilver@buckscc. gov.uk. Sadly, road repairs will not be made to the Lane once ABS have stopped using it, although it has been suggested they may help repair the verges. Mandy Cliffe - Parish Clark

Message from **PCSO Wendy Taylor**

Thefts from vehicles and outbuildings We are still experiencing thefts from vans where tools are the items of choice to be taken by offenders. Our recommendation to empty the van

of tools at the end of a working day still stands as the best advice, however inconvenient it is. If this is too inconvenient, then please take time look at your vehicle from an offender's viewpoint and reinforce all security to reduce opportunities for offenders to benefit from your loss. If you need help with this, please call the Neighbourhood team who will be happy to offer appropriate advice.

We will be arranging some marking days for people to bring tools, garden tools, saddlery, prams and bikes to us so we can add your postcode to the item. Information will be issued about this very soon. However, bear in mind that the Winslow Police Office is open to the public from 10:00-14:00 and if you would like to bring items to the office during this time we can mark them for you without you having to wait for an event.

Ever wondered if that second hand bargain is too good to be true?

Most second-hand items are sold by the rightful owners. Unfortunately, some goods for sale may have been stolen. If second-hand goods are offered at prices that appear too good to be true, carefully consider whether the item could have been stolen.

Most people do not want to buy stolen goods and do not choose to support burglary. When buying at a car boot sale or via an online auction site, the classified ads or elsewhere, it is important to consider if a bargain really is just too good to be true.

That bargain might just be stolen and, though cheap to you, will come at a cost to the victim. That could be an elderly victim of theft, a child who misses their bike or a member of the public just like you. Items found to be stolen can be seized by the police and so you could end up with nothing.

Please think carefully before buying expensive items from market stalls or car boot sales and be wary of people selling more than one expensive second hand item. Together we can protect victims and show thieves that crime doesn't pay by refusing to buy stolen items.

If you are not sure where an item you're considering buying has come from please do not buy it. Call 101 to let us know or Crimestoppers if you prefer to remain anonymous.

Rural Crime

Spring is on its way and it is the time of year when farmers are hard at work with lambing. We have already had several reports of dogs worrying sheep again to the point where one farmer had to shoot the dog - an action he is perfectly entitled to do.

This is a gentle reminder to all those who walk dogs. If the dog you are in charge of is not obedient to your voice, please ensure you keep it on a lead. Worrying

sheep can cause abortion/premature birth/death in sheep at huge commercial cost to the farmer.

Please also ensure you pick up after you dogs. The health hazard to sheep and cows is high and can again cause abortion. Please don't assume that you only need to pick up after your dogs in parks, footpaths and pavements. It is essential you pick up every time your dog leaves a mess.


Microchipping



Anne Robinson becomes ambassador to Medical Detection Dogs charity





Anne Robinson, the TV presenter and former *Weakest Link* and *Watchdog* host has become an ambassador to the Great Horwood-based charity Medical Detection Dogs.

Medical Detection Dogs trains dogs to use their remarkable olfactory powers to detect cancer in urine or breath samples. In training trials they have been shown to achieve a reliability of 93 per cent, much higher than many existing tests used by the NHS.

The charity also provides life-saving support to individuals with long-term serious conditions such as brittle type one diabetes, by training dogs to be alert to assist them. The dogs alert their diabetic partners to dangerous falls in their sugar levels and prompt them to take their medication before they suffer a hypoglycaemic attack.

The charity is currently running two clinical trials: one in partnership with the NHS Milton Keynes University Hospital into prostate, kidney and bladder cancer using urine samples, and another into breast cancer using breath samples.

CEO and co-founder of Medical Detection Dogs, Dr Claire Guest commented: "With help from Anne and others, we can step up our fundraising efforts. We receive no government funding and rely entirely on kind donations from the public. So with a boost to our resources, we can turn our research into reality and to begin saving thousands of lives as soon as possible."

<u>Grass Cutting</u> in Great Horwood and Singleborough



As I reported last month the Parish Council has taken over the responsibility for cutting the grass on the verges in the parish within the 30/40 mph limits (known as urban grass cutting). This includes the verges within the 30mph limits in Singleborough.

Ian Walker of Walker Grounds and his partner did the first cut within the 30mph zones in Great Horwood village and also in Singleborough on Tuesday 12th April and the verges in Nash Road within the 40mph zone soon after.

Ian had already done the first cut of the grass on Horwode Pece the week before and so he will be a regular visitor to the parish from April through to October each year.

As well as cutting our verges he is also carrying out the same role for Winslow Town Council and for Little Horwood and Nash Parish Councils. Where Buckinghamshire County Council have retained the cutting of urban verges it has confirmed that they will only be done on 4 occasions in the current year.

Please note that the cutting of the grass on the verges outside the 30/40mph limits (known as rural grass cutting) remains the responsibility of Bucks CC and it seems that it is likely these will be cut once or twice during the coming season.

looking forward to making progress with our Parish Plan 2016.

Parish Updates

Planning

Consultee comments for the Weston Road Planning Inquiry have been made and the Planning Inspector, in early May, is due to make his report and recommendations

to Greg Clark the Secretary of State.

Elsewhere, AVDC decisions on planning matters remain slow and we still have no decision concerning the Nash Park traveller site for which the temporary permission expired in November 2015 or on the Willow Road largescale development proposal.

Speedwatch

The Speed Watch Campaign has begun but we would like some more local volunteers particularly from Singleborough where we also wish to perform some traffic monitoring. If you are able to help, please contact the Parish Clerk on clerk@greathorwoodpc.org.uk or telephone 715829. Cars have been monitored travelling at up to 43 mph on the Winslow Road so we know there is a problem. On the plus side we have noticed that just having the camera in place has made drivers more aware of the speed limit.

Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting took place on Monday 11th April at 7.30pm in the Village Hall with some 40 attendees. My full Chairman's Report is lodged on our parish council website (http://www.bucksvoice.net/greathorwoodpc/).

An important part of the evening was the presentations by representatives of our parish organisations who described their memories, achievements, issues and plans. It was pleasing that this was well attended by so many people and particularly the volunteers, reflecting the kind and generous spirit of many in our community: Monica Gilbey and 6 youngsters (Youth Club), Peter Brooker (Medical Detection Dogs), Paul Hodson (BCC Localities and Communities Manager), John Chilver (our County Councillor), Wendy Taylor (our local PCSO), David Saunders (from our Neighbourhood Planning Team), Becky Porter (Rainbows), Gill Wood (Village Hall), Karen Wilkinson (WI), John Huskinson (School, PTA, School Crossing Patrol and Speedwatch), Roy Lack (Silver Band), Vyv Rudd (Football Club), John Nicholls (Great Horwood & Singleborough Recreation Trust), David Brazier (St James' Church) and a written report from John Goodger (Cricket Club).

It was also the chance for me to review the issues dominating the last year for our council and outline the priorities and key issues for the coming year. In summary, the Parish Council had a large changeover and for the first time in many years has a full complement of councillors! We also bid farewell to our fabulous clerk of many years Karen Francis and greeted her new and extremely enthusiastic successor Mandy Cliffe.

During the last year, following our questionnaire survey and consultation event, we have made considerable progress with the Great Horwood Parish Plan 2016. Of special note, we have taken over from Buckinghamshire County Council the devolved services of grass cutting, chasing up landowners for hedge trimming if necessary, right of way maintaining of accessibility, signage supervision and minor maintenance, footway weeding/monitoring and maintaining the Risk Assessments and Register. We have

continued our enthusiastic support of the Horwode Pece recreation facility and play area.

During the coming year and indeed beyond, GH PC priorities will be driven by the emerging Great Horwood Parish Plan 2016 and its attendant Action Plan. In broad terms this means:

- Influence making sure that the Parish voice is heard through Parish Council representation especially around housing provision for the Parish.
- Recreation supporting facilities for younger people in particular at Horwode Pece but also facilities for other groups.
- Road Traffic Impact making the Parish roads safer including endeavouring to provide new footpaths and cycle ways.
- Environment safeguarding the Parish environment including maintenance of The Green, paths and street lights.
- **Community** supporting valued community facilities and developing new ones.

The biggest issue confronting the parish is the large planning applications that are or will be submitted in direct contravention of the Great Horwood Parish Neighbourhood Plan. Apart from Weston Road, we still have the Willow Road application awaiting determination, we have the Old Mill application waiting for the result of the appeal and we are expecting an application from Gladman for 1,200 homes north of Winslow which will include 650 within our parish boundary. Clearly these potential developments would have a major effect on the future character of the parish. The Parish Council will of course oppose these unwelcome proposals and keep you all aware of progress and any related issues.

With respect to the Great Horwood Parish Neighbourhood Plan, we have already had consultations with developers/ architects for the 3 housing development sites identified in the Plan and will continue to work with them , AVDC, and local landowners, to see the successful implementation of the developments.

Additionally, we will endeavour to get the School Crossing Patrol preliminary work done including the marking of lines outside St James' Church and fixing of warning lights. Also, we're currently seeking to recruit a Lollipop Lady/Man.




