My husband Simon was diagnosed with terminal Cholangiocarcinoma (Bile Duct Cancer) in July 2014, at the age of 41. Simon approached his diagnosis with determination and strength, he made it his mission to create as many happy memories as he could for his girls, which he certainly succeeded at.

It has been a year since Simon died and there were many people and organisations that helped Simon throughout his illness, none more so than Willen Hospice. Simon spent the last week of his life at Willen and the care and kindness he received was second to none. Until I started training for this I hadn't run further than my usual 6k, so I for one am slightly nervous!

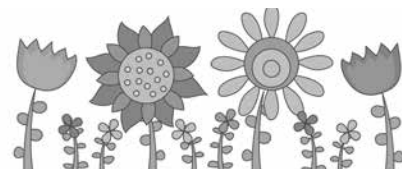

The woodchip top up has been carried out and those that have been to the Rec recently may be interested as to how the day/s unfolded!



Firstly, thanks to Jane Holland and Mike Hobday for turning up promptly to welcome the truck which was due at 8am. Dave the Digger was in place, too, from 08:00. Mike stayed for the handover at 08.50, when Steve Brigden arrived (shortly after Jane had to go). Finally, we got through on the phone to Giffords. 09:35 - the truck was just leaving Birmingham. ETA 11:30!

Steve left. Dave the Digger left sometime later. Steve returned at 11:20, spoke with the driver who was twenty minutes away. 11:40 - a 16 ton truck with 12 metre trailer arrives with 80 cubic feet of woodchip. The tarp would not be enough. He tipped, then, half load on and half load off of his truck, he is stuck in the mud. No forward movement, no backward movement, only down. Digger Dave is now busy elsewhere but will return tomorrow at 08.00. Fifty minutes later, more tarp, shovels, rakes and man-power (they were all male) the truck moves. The rest of the load is lowered onto the spare tarp; big sigh of relief. Moments later the second large trailer is hauled in and tipped on the second pile...on the gate...on the hard standing and almost onto the road. There was so much, there was no containing it. The driver did his best.'

This gives you an idea of the work our intrepid three were overseeing and involved in. At 08.00 on the 1st, David Spooner with tipper truck moved this heap of woodchip and spread it to all play areas - it filled them, bulging - all the play areas had a good covering.

Steve and others visited at the weekend, the grass areas around the teenage and toddler play areas have some deep furrows - left by Digger Dave's dump truck in the water logged soil. The ground by the gate has a covering of chippings, that will need a working party with brooms, rakes, shovels and barrows to move it; a task for the Spring working party. Some work has started; thanks to some of the Committee.

We believe it is worth buying some mixed gravel to mix with the soil that will be lifted, plus a generous handful of woodchip, which can be used to fill the furrows and should also improve drainage. This material can be used to fill the many furrows created by the digger so that they do not scar the Recreation ground for the rest of the year. Some of the excess has also been used as a mulch around the roses.

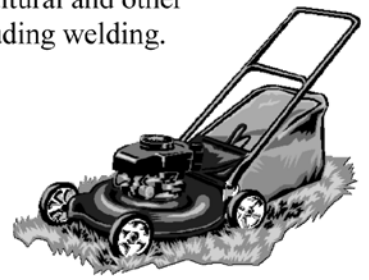

New Thames Valley Alert App launched

Thames Valley Police is delighted to announce that the Thames Valley Alert App has been launched and is free to download now.

The app, which is available on iPhone and Android, can be downloaded from the App Store and Google Play and allows you to receive instant notifications to your phone on the latest policing alerts in your area (please note that you must enable push notifications to receive these).

The app can use GPS data to send you targeted messages according to your current geographical location and messaging preferences, sending you instant notifications to your mobile phone about specific information, warnings and advice relevant to that location.

The app offers a number of other features, including allowing you to quickly locate your closest police station, and also provides a feed of the latest Thames Valley-wide news on Twitter, so you'll never miss those important Force-wide updates and breaking news. This facility is available on the app even if you do not have a Twitter account.

Please note that you do not have to download the app to get alerts; you can still choose to receive alerts via email, text or voicemail.

To download the app, visit the Apple store or Google Play and search 'Thames Valley Alert'.

Neighbourhood Watch

Datetag also has a full range of kits for marking just about everything. This includes their Home Marking kit which is used to mark all your personal belongings such as phones, computers, laptops, jewellery, expensive ornaments and possessions with sentimental value more than monetary value. You will, no doubt, already be aware of Smartwater and SelectaDNA. All three systems use forensic marking as their base but Datetag also use Datadots® which is a superior microdot identification system developed to securely mark property and can be applied to all parts of your property making them virtually impossible for the criminals to locate and remove them all.

The Home Marking kit which is a self-fit system, with a TVP discount, is £29.99 per system (normal RRP is £39.99). However, if a group of residents purchasing 20+ systems at one time, further discounts will become applicable. If anyone wants more information and/or Neighbourhood

Chairman's Monthly Report : Last Meeting - Monday 13 March 2017



Great Horwood Parish Council

One of the things I notice in Great Horwood and Singleborough is the community spirit. Most of us are happy to help our neighbours and want our village to be a nice place to live in. Sometimes we need the help of other agencies, but you might not be sure how to get in touch with the service you need.

Whilst the Parish Council is always willing to help, in many cases you can be just as successful making contact directly. Indeed, often the more people who report a problem, the sooner it gets fixed. Here are some ways you can get in touch.

Buckinghamshire County Council:

Problems with roads and rights of way are the responsibility of Buckinghamshire County Council. To report a fault you can use the Transport for Bucks to submit an online report at <http://www.transportforbucks.net/report-it-general.aspx>. If you consider the matter is dangerous or an emergency, please call TFB on 01296 382416 (9am-5.30pm Mon-Thurs 9am-5pm Friday) or 01296 486630 (out of hours and weekends). Alternatively you can use the 'Fix My Street' smartphone app.

The County Council is responsible for dealing with fly-tipping and provides the Household Recycling Centres (often known as the tip!) - The nearest is at Yonder Slade, Buckingham. See <http://www.buckscc.gov.uk/services/waste-and-recycling/>. More details of the County Council's services can be found on their website <http://www.buckscc.gov.uk/>

Police:

The non-emergency phone number for the Police is 101. This can be used to report a crime not currently in progress (e.g. a stolen car, burglary or damaged property), give information to the police about crime in the area or to speak to the police about a general enquiry.

Aylesbury Vale District Council:

Many of the service we get here in Great Horwood and Singleborough are provided by Aylesbury Vale District Council. For all enquiries/problems the phone number is 01296 585858 and details of how to contact the Council on line can be found at <https://www.aylesburyvaledc.gov.uk/section/ways-contact-us>

Things that Aylesbury Vale District Council is responsible for include refuse collection, litter and dogbins, homelessness, environmental health (including noise nuisance) and road closures for e.g. street parties.

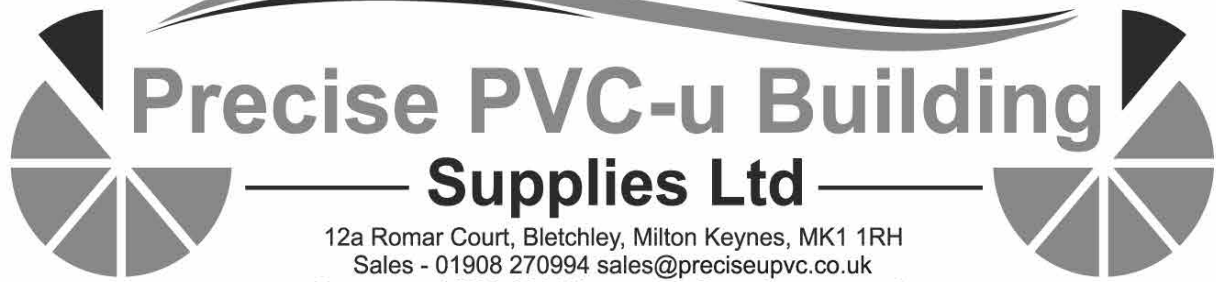

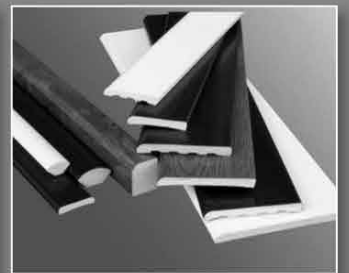
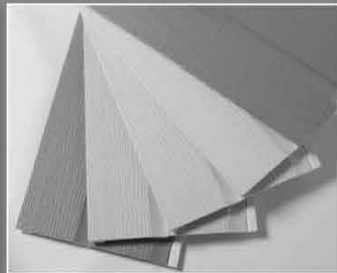
