#### **Attention Dog Owners**

We have just had our second dog attack in as many weeks in our fields.

The first killed a Ewe pregnant with twins (so three lives lost) the second was a new born lamb that was attacked and has had its entire stomach removed by a dog - probably within seconds of birth as the lamb hadn't even been cleaned by its mother.

This is totally unacceptable. We have also found that a gate separating mothers and lambs from those sheep expecting lambs which is **NOT ON A DESIGNATED FOOTPATH** has been left open by a walker and now all sheep are muddled up together.

Two issues therefore need to be addressed

1) **ALL DOGS MUST BE KEPT ON LEADS** - we are in lambing season and no matter how well trained owners think their dogs are they MUST be on leads.

2) Trespassing off of footpaths. Walkers must stick to footpaths and not take their own short cuts across our land.

The Police have been informed about both incidents.

We have photos documenting these attacks but they are not suitable for publication.

#### Chairman's Monthly Report : Last Meeting – Monday 9 April 2018



Parish Council

The April meeting of Great Horwood Parish Council took place on 9 April. Before the start of the meeting the Lease to the Cricket Club of the field in Nash Road was signed. The field belongs to

the Great Horwood Recreation Ground charity whose trustees are the Parish Council. This charity was established by the Inclosure Award in 1842. It is good that this complex matter has at last been finalised. Long may the Cricket Club continue to flourish!

The Parish Council noted that some potholes in the parish have been repaired and others marked and identified for repair. Our County Councillor commented on the scale of pothole repairs throughout the county following the severe weather during this winter. Transport for Buckinghamshire are overwhelmed with the large numbers and are working flatout to remedy the worst. Main roads obviously have priority. A recent press release from the County Council noted that in the whole county 835 serious potholes were reported in January, 898 in February and 1,156 in March. The daily pothole repair average is 90. The County Council are due to vote for an additional programme of spending to repair roads before the end of April. Anyone can report potholes and other road defects by following the links at https://www.buckscc.gov.uk/ services/transport-and-roads/road-maintenance-andrepairs/potholes/

It was good to learn that the County Council have added to their work programme the provision of a handrail on the bridge over the ditch to the footpath from Pilch Lane going towards Adstock. They also intend to carry out some repairs to the bridge on the footpath from Church Lane to Singleborough and also to make access to the bridge easier.

The theme of many of the other items on the agenda this month was community activity :-

- The Parish Council considered resilience planning and noted what has already done by the WI through its involvement with the Buckinghamshire County Council and Milton Keynes emergency planning unit. The Parish Council hopes to be able to build on this work so that in the event of a major event - or even just being cut off by snow - there can be a co-ordinated response by and for the community.
- The Parish Council also noted that plans are afoot for the refurbishment of the Village Hall. Any work is likely to be done in phases depending on the availability of funds and grants. Roof repairs are likely to be the initial phase.
- Planning to mark the centenary of the end of WW1 in November continues.

Information about all these matters will be on hand at the Annual Parish Meeting on 30 April.

• County Councillor John Chilver advised the PC that there will be more money in the kitty for potholes this year so keep reporting them (http://www.transportforbucks.net/Report-It-Pothole.aspx). The B4033 is checked every 4 weeks by Transport for Bucks and the worst are marked with white paint but TfB have a huge backlog so cannot say when they will get to ours.

• Please keep dogs under close control around sheep and lambs. Two lambs have been killed this year so it is always a very good idea to be cautious around livestock. No doggie excrement in occupied fields please. It is very bad for the diners when mixed with their usual diet of lush green grass.

• One or two hedges around the village are getting out of hand, so I am afraid I will have to write some polite letters to request action. Please check your hedges. If they are encroaching on the pavement (bottom or top) it could be you. Thank you for your co-operation.

T'D LOVE to find my friend Barbara Matthews,' says Diane Lloyd, nee Coombs.

'We were teenagers in the village of Great Horwood, Buckinghamshire, between 1958 and 1963.

'We did everything together — we were Girl Guides, rang the church bells, sang in the choir and were confirmed at the same time.

'Barbara, who had two brothers Gerald and David, loved Tommy Steele and we'd sing his hit Little White Bull walking to the bus stop.

'I left the village to go to college in 1963, while she went to another school and then worked in a bank. After that we lost touch.

'I have been told she stayed in the village for a while, married a man called Ray Green and had a child, but attempts to find her over the years have been fruitless.

'I live in Exmouth, Devon, and am 71. I have only one picture of Barbara, taken at a






