Former professions cover many sectors of business and industry and it's fair to say that most of us were more than happy to leave the 'corporate world' behind. As with any organisation, some formality is needed to Get Stuff Done. So we do have a committee, that meet monthly and we held our AGM back in February. In a wellattended and cake-enhanced gathering, Dave Saunders reflected on another successful year for MISW. Membership now stands at over 60 and continues to rise. Numerous projects for community benefit have been completed and, despite being busy, we have been steadfast in maintaining the Shed as a place of warmth and friendship with a great atmosphere and no pressure to become a production shop. Our training programme continues to run every Thursday, attendance has been very healthy and even our Old-Hands admit to learning something new about things they thought they knew all about already.

Great Horwood Cricket Club

We are rapidly approaching the start of the 2019 cricket season. Whilst, we only play cricket in the late Spring/ Summer months, activity and work at the club continues from September to April each year.

The club has yet again, contracted Wormsley Estates to undertake radical repairs and improvements to the cricket square. In addition, they have continued to tend to the square, prior to handing the square back over to the club and its groundsmen (Alan Sirett and Gary Lee) to pick up the reins and start the onerous task of getting the outfield cut and in good order, as well as preparing the wickets for the upcoming matches.

Since the close of last season, we have unfortunately suffered with an infestation of rabbits and moles, which have caused major damage to the outfield. We are currently striving to eradicate this problem, but this will be costly to achieve, as will the repairs to the hundreds of holes all across the field.

All of this work is extremely expensive and demands that as a club, we are constantly working hard to raise funds through events or grants to enable us to maintain the excellent facilities that we currently enjoy. To do this, we do need the help and support of everyone in Great Horwood; we thank those people who already support us and look to others to help us retain what is an excellent facility within the village.

Particular thanks go to Sean and Sara Walsh, who were the club sponsors, as well as great supporters of the club for several years. Unfortunately, the closure of the Crown was a blow to us and them. Whilst we will still gladly see them around the village, we wish them both well in their future ventures.

Also, throughout the closed season, the clubhouse has been regularly used for darts and domino matches, as well as filling the sad period when the village was without a public house. We were glad to be able to provide facilities to the Crown teams and the football club during this period. Glad to see that the Swan is now open again; having a village pub is such an integral part of village life and we hope that the new tenants are successful in their aspirations going forward.

Cricket nets have taken place for several weeks and we are now looking forward to being able to start weekly net sessions on the ground. All of this leads us towards the start of the 2019 season, where we will again be entering 2 teams in the Four Counties Cricket League. Last year, saw a major upward movement in the club's playing strength/ numbers and we look forward this season to seeing some of the younger players now with us making further great strides. Certainly, the performances at individual levels last season, fill me with great optimism.

Prior to the league season starting in late April/early May, we have a couple of pre-season friendlies, including one against Buckingham Town Cricket Club on the last Saturday in April.

We will again be running Youth Cricket Sessions at the club every week under the expert support of Sam Willett. Having a strong youth set-up is fundamental to the future of the club and, as ever, we welcome anyone between the ages of 8 to 16 to come along to the sessions and learn about the game of cricket.

Great Horwood Parish Council

WELCOME TO YOUR NEW COUNCILLOR

The Annual Parish Council Meeting was held on Monday 15th April in the village hall, with a record attendance of 59 including councillors and speakers. It was chaired by Acting Chairman John Gilbey who opened proceedings with the PC annual report. Disappointingly two speakers were unable to attend and we look forward to a future update from PCSO Andy Piotrowski on local crime issues. Croudace (Little Horwood Rd) Site Manager, Richard Veitch hurt his back and had to pull out at the last minute but he kindly offered an open afternoon at his site offices on 25th April for residents to look at house plans.

GREAT HORWOOD PARISH COUNCIL

The programme continued with Mr Robert Webb, representing the development site Land North of Little Horwood Road. He said that the landowners were looking for a construction company to develop the site. Nothing detailed would be available until a developer is found (and planning permissions are always protracted) but the site will have 15 houses.

Mr David Grainge outlined his plans for a suckler herd of up to 80 beef cows on Little Horwood Road. An application has been made for temporary accommodation on site as the herd will require close supervision. Calves will stay with their mothers until they are weaned at about 9 months of age and this will be followed by a further 6 - 8 months (ish) of husbandry before the inevitable has to happen. Mrs Vicki Grainge confirmed that she is currently painting a small handcart. She has permission to place it on The Green and her home grown cherries will be ready to sell towards the end of June for about five weeks. An honesty box will be available for people to place their money in (removed daily and not left out overnight).

Mr David Saunders spoke of the need to consider a Neighbour Hood Plan review as required by the original NHP (at the five year point). A list was made available for anyone in the village to join a Neighbourhood Planning Review Committee and three residents signed up. The committee will be chaired by Cllr Caroline Cousin and Mr Saunders has kindly agreed to act as secretary. The first meeting will probably have taken place by the time you read this but if any resident is interested in joining the committee, please contact Cllr Cousin.

Representatives of the groups awarded grants from the PC in 2018 outlined how the money had been spent (see Worthy Causes below). Helen Grimditch, one of the Focus editors, gave thanks on behalf of the magazine for the £500 annual grant which helps towards the cost of colour printing.

All in all, this was a very successful evening, helped in no small measure by the provision of tea and cake by the WI. Many thanks for your attendance and we hope to see you at future PC meetings with any questions you might have for the Council.

WORTHY CAUSES

The Parish Council is offering another round of grants to local causes for 2019. Notification is earlier than in previous years as this year's cut-off date – 31st October 2019 - is **FINAL**. No applications will be considered after this date. Awards will be made to local groups and organisations through their Committee, Governing Body, Head of Trustees etc. and not to individuals. Up to £3000 will be available to help local projects. In 2018, the village helped the Scouts and Guides to purchase cutlery and crockery, the School to fund outdoor educational boards, the Church Fete to provide 2 larger attractions and the Winslow & District Community Bus used their funds towards a new step for the bus. Applications forms will be available from the Clerk or from the GHPC website.

EARLY REMINDER HORWOOD FEAST

The Horwood Feast dates for 2019 have been approved. The fair will arrive on Saturday 4th August and leave on Tuesday 7th August, and will be open for business on Sunday 5th and Monday 6th August. A GH Silver Band concert and hog roast is planned on the Sunday. Residents' views both positive and negative were carefully considered before approving these dates, together with representations from the Feast organisers for making the Feast viable.

RECYCLING CENTRE CHARGES

The Yonder Slade recycling centre charges for nonhousehold waste are on the GHPC website and on the noticeboard in the High St. Further details can also be found on the Bucks CC website www.buckscc.gov.uk/HRC. The charges cover a comprehensive range of items and one wonders what effect this will have on fly tipping. Pilch Lane has been a favourite place for fly tipping and if you see any, please report it to the Clerk at the contact details below or to Aylesbury Vale district Council.

DATES FOR YOUR DIARY

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Monday 13th May 2019 in the village hall at 7.30 pm. An agenda will be placed on the PC notice board and on the website a week before the meeting. A public participation period is always held at some stage during the proceedings if residents have any issues they would like to raise. Parish Council meetings always take place in the village hall at 7.30 pm on the second Monday in the month (excluding August and January).


These will be free to attend so please watch out for the dates of these and please come along and support us.




