

GREAT HORWOOD PARISH COUNCIL RESPONSE TO CROUDACE HOMES PROPOSAL TO DEVELOP LAND NORTH OF LITTLE HORWOOD ROAD AND CHERRY LEAS

The proposal claims that the development will meet all local policy targets, which is clearly untrue. The Great Horwood Parish Neighbourhood Plan Policies Map: Inset A

(GHPNP) was made in 2015 and covers the period to 2031. It is thus still the key planning policy for the parish together with the Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan (VALP) which was adopted in 2021 and covers the period to 2033. These two policies will be the overriding ones for Great Horwood until the Buckinghamshire Local Plan is made. This is not expected until 2027 at the earliest.


Policy1of the GHPNP states that the Neighbourhood Plan designates a Great Horwood Settlement Boundary, as shown on the Policies Map (see below), for the purpose of containing the physical growth of the village over the plan period.

A further part of Policy 1 states that Development proposals on land outside the settlement boundary will not be permitted in the countryside unless it is necessary for the purpose of agriculture or forestry, or for enterprise, diversification or recreation that benefits the rural economy without harming countryside interests.

New development in the countryside should not result in the loss of open land that contributes to the form and character of Great Horwood and Singleborough.

So, as shown by the map, a Planning Application to develop the land proposed by Croudace contravenes the GHPNP. Given this it will be robustly opposed by Great Horwood Parish Council, and we trust that Buckinghamshire Council will refuse it.

We will let the residents know if such a Planning Application is submitted and you will all be able to make your own comments on the application direct to Buckinghamshire Council



1. Down Western Road and Joe Burns would like the cables under the field owned by Nick Hanson. Now considering Joe Burns ripped up the hedge belonging to Nick, Nick does not want the idea of electric cabling under his land and has said no twice.

2. Down Willow Road. The lovely residents of Willow Road have had to put up with an awful lot of disruption in these past three years what with huge lorries, noise and the last thing to come was the new home which took eight hours from the top of Willow Road down to where it is now sited. That's just the first home we have been told 16 altogether. Now they could see more if the electric come down Willow Road. We do feel for the residents as it has been just as disruptive

The BT lines for the broadband etc is all in the cabling but again we are not connected. As for water this is fun all homes except one is connected to the new water system and that home is one of the original 12. We have SOME of the so-called street-lights on, some have been taken away to allow the new house to be taken down through the park, some have no bulbs in them and in the early hours of the morning they go off.

Originally Joe Burns was going to rent the new homes now we hear he is going to sell them. We are still waiting for our new Site Manager to be named by the council as Joe Burns was deemed not a fit and proper person to run the site, not just by the council but also a Tribunal Judge.

Of course, Joe Burns has put a new park sign up that



shows the name of Willow Park! He has tried to change the name of the park without submitting an application to the council for change of name. The council are not happy, rightly so, as they would not allow Willow Park as it's so close to Willow Road and get very confusing. So, we are STILL NOOK PARK.


