



The Fallen Of World War I: The Men We Commemorate

Like most English villages, Great Horwood lost a number of its young men in the Great War, the "War To End All Wars". In giving their lives these men earned our undying gratitude. Accordingly, Great Horwood's casualties are commemorated on two memorials, one in the High Street and one inside the Parish Church of St James. Sadly, there are some discrepancies between the two memorials. What is more, for a number of years the distinction between those who served in World War I but survived and those who died was forgotten, the entire list of names on the High Street memorial being read out on Remembrance Day as if they were all casualties.

Now that Remembrance Day is again approaching, it is time we knew more of these ordinary but heroic men from the Great Horwood of almost 100 years ago. Accordingly I have delved into the records to find out who the people were behind those bare initials, and to attempt to resolve the differences between the two village memorials. Many records are missing and some diligent detective work has been needed to fill in the gaps. Here are the results so far:

Live Music - Thursday 15th November - Rondeau



First to make the ultimate sacrifice was **Joseph Henry Clarke**. Aged just 22 and a private in the Coldstream Guards, he died on 26 January 1915 of wounds sustained on the Western Front and is buried at Beuvry, France. He was a horseman on a farm and lived at Vine Cottage, Singleborough with his parents Emmanuel and Louisa Clarke.

Percival Jonah George was killed in action at Gallipoli, Turkey on 21 August 1915 while serving with the Royal Buckinghamshire Hussars. He has no known grave. Percival was the son of Jonah and Mary Ann George and worked on his parents' farm, now known as Great Furze House, Pilch Lane. Although only 21 when killed, Percival left £360 4s 4d, equivalent to about £32,000 today.

Cecil Thomas James Hancock died on active service on 25 June 1916 at the age of 26 and is buried in Bordighera British Cemetery near San Remo, Italy. Cecil had been in the Oxford & Bucks Light Infantry but at the time of his death was a private in the Gloucestershire Regiment. Before enlisting, Cecil was a farm labourer, the son of Thomas James and Sarah Hancock of Wigwell, Great Horwood.

Ernest William Ridgway was killed on 9 April 1917 in the Battle of Arras, France, and is buried at Tilloy British Cemetery near Arras. A private in the Oxford & Bucks Light Infantry, he was 22 years old. Ernest was a farm labourer and lived at The Common, Great Horwood with his parents Reuben and Ann Amelia Ridgway.

Alfred George Willmer is incorrectly recorded in the High Street as "A.C. Willmer" and does not appear on the St James memorial. He was the son of Alfred Emerton Willmer, the Great Horwood miller, and his wife Mildred Martha, later of Hampstead. Killed in action on 14 April 1917 at the age of 19, he was a rifleman in the 1st/9th Battalion, London Regiment (Queen Victoria's Rifles) and is commemorated on the Arras Memorial, France.

Harry Hall died of his wounds on the Western Front in France on 30 April 1917. Aged 26, Harry was the son of Samuel and Emma Jane Hall, had worked as a cowman on a farm, and lived at Singleborough. He had originally enlisted in the Oxford & Bucks Light Infantry, but had transferred to the Royal Warwickshire Regiment as a private. He is buried at Wimereux, France.

William Thomas Marks died of wounds in Salonika (Thessaloniki), Greece on 17 May 1917 and is buried there. He was a corporal in the Oxford & Bucks Light Infantry, aged 21. William was a cowman on a farm, the son of Jabez and Sarah Marks of Wigwell, Great Horwood.

Arthur George Marks, serving as a shoeing smith in the Royal Buckinghamshire Hussars, was killed in action in Palestine on 13 November 1917 at the age of 26, and is buried in Ramleh War Cemetery near Tel-Aviv, Israel. He too had been a cowman on a farm, and was the son of Mark and Emma Marks of Winslow Road, Great Horwood.

Harry Hancock, a private in the Oxford & Bucks Light Infantry and the eldest brother of Cecil Thomas James Hancock, was killed in action on 23 March 1918 aged 23. He has no known grave but is commemorated at the Pozières Memorial on the Somme, France. Harry was a farm labourer. His name appears on the High Street memorial but not as a casualty (i.e. not marked with a dagger †), and in some records as "Herbert".

Edward Jordan is recorded as a casualty on the memorial inside St James but not in the High Street. In 1911 his elderly parents, Samuel and Helen Jordan, were living at Ivy Cottage, Great Horwood having moved there from North London. Edward served in the 7th Battalion, East Surrey Regiment and by the time he was killed in action on 9 April 1918 aged 29 or 30 had attained the rank of Captain. He is commemorated at the Ploegsteert Memorial in Belgium but has no known grave.

Bertie Royce was killed in action on 12 April 1918 but has no known grave. A private in the Coldstream Guards, he is also commemorated at the Ploegsteert Memorial. Aged 22 or 23, he was a farm labourer and lived at The Green, Great Horwood, with his parents Henry and Harriet Alice Royce.

Stanley George Viccars, the son of William Anderson and Mary Barfoot Viccars of Little Horwood Road, Great Horwood emigrated to Australia in 1912. He enlisted there as a private in the 1st Battalion, Australian Infantry. He served two tours of duty on the Western Front, earning promotion to Second Lieutenant and then in May 1918 to Lieutenant. Aged 28, he was killed in action on 21 July 1918 and is buried at Hazebrouck, France.

Francis John Marks, a younger brother of William Thomas Marks, was a private in the Devonshire Regiment. He died aged 18 on 2 November 1918 at home in Great Horwood, and is buried in the churchyard of St James.

The sole unaccounted-for name is **J. Dell**. Recorded as a casualty on the High Street memorial but not in St James, his identity remains uncertain. In 1911 a David Dell was the landlord of the Six Lords at Singleborough and a Sarah Fanny Dell lived in Nash Road, but I have been unable to link J. Dell to either. Research continues; readers of Focus may be able to help?

Finally, the St James memorial contains the name of **John Chevallier**. He was not a soldier but the Rector of Great Horwood. Wishing to free up a younger man for war service, he volunteered to go to Giggleswick School in Yorkshire to teach mathematics, but was knocked down and killed there in 1917 by "a cyclist using lights obscured against aircraft".

There is a memorial plaque to World War II casualties in St James, but no public High Street memorial. 67 years after the war ended, is it not time Great Horwood honoured these casualties too?

Advent Workshop



Neighbourhood Watch

Have your say meetings are your opportunity to speak with your neighbourhood officers to discuss any local issues of concern you may have. If you wish to have your say, the next meeting is at Henry's, High Street,

Do you own a Ford Galaxy or Seat Alhambra? These vehicles are currently being targeted by thieves who are stealing catalytic converters. Where possible, please park your vehicle inside a garage or in such a position that makes access to the exhaust more difficult. Offences are occurring overnight and at the time of writing 5 vehicles were attacked in Buckingham. It is believed that the offenders are ignoring other vehicles and are likely to be travelling around prior to the theft looking for vehicles to target. If anyone is seen in unusual circumstances, underneath vehicles, interfering with the exhaust system please ring 999 as this may well be a crime in progress.

If you take your vehicle to any one of the local garages shown below who are working with the Thames Valley Police in Aylesbury they will fit anti-theft number plate screws and etch your catalytic converter. Window stickers will advise potential thieves that your catalytic converter is marked. Hopefully this will deter any theft. This work will be carried out for free in addition to any other service you require from the garage.

Parish Council Budget 2013/14

Planning Matters

The application for an additional dwelling to be built in the grounds of 2 School End (12/01264/APP) was refused by AVDC. The application for an additional dwelling to be built on land to the rear of 11 The Green (12/01791/APP) has also now been refused by AVDC.

Movable Vehicle Activated Signs

At its meeting the Council decided that the most appropriate locations for the sites of the MVAS's would be:-

- On the Winslow Road approach to the village.
- On the Little Horwood Road just inside the start of the 30mph limit
- On the Nash Road just within the start of the 30mph limit.
- In Singleborough on the approach from the A421

By the time this edition of Focus is published we should know if enough local parishes have joined the project to make it feasible to proceed.





Conservation Area Reviews at Great Horwood and Singleborough

A Conservation Area is an area of special architectural or historic interest, designated by the local planning authority. At present Great Horwood contains one Conservation Area which covers most of the historic village core. Singleborough contains two very small Conservation Areas, which focus on clusters of listed buildings.

Aylesbury Vale District Council has undertaken a review of the Conservation Areas at Great Horwood and Singleborough. Both settlements have been surveyed, and those elements which are important to the character and appearance of the Conservation Areas (e.g. trees, buildings, open spaces) have been defined on maps and plans.

As a result of the Conservation Area survey, a number of alterations have been proposed to the Conservation Area boundaries. A leaflet outlining the proposed changes has been delivered to every property within the existing Conservation Areas, and to those which are proposed for inclusion within the Conservation Area.
