## NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN: An open letter to all residents...

## Friends and neighbours of Great Horwood

When in July I heard that all but two of the Neighbourhood Planning Team (NPT) had resigned because they felt that some residents from the eastern side of the village would never be appeased, I realized immediately how vulnerable the eastern side of the village had become. As the flood gates of development have been opened due to Government housing plans, with a new Secondary school and the opening of the East-West railway station coming to Winslow, growth is inevitable.

Over the holidays myself and three friends went door-to-door to our own neighbours explaining that a large scale developer (who we now know to be Taylor Wimpy) wants to build behind The Close and Weston Rd and that with a village plan we'd at least have a say in how Great Horwood could benefit, for example the possibility of affordable housing for locals, monies for the school, Horwood Pece, sports and children's clubs etc. Also, hopefully the possibility of another site to spread the load rather than one large estate.

Many people signed a petition which we hoped would prove to our Parish Council that we feel to have a Neighbourhood Planning Team with a village plan in place (which we all have a right to participate), makes more sense than to do nothing, even though some people, myself included, may feel angry or upset as this is a significant blow, if for many years you've had the privilege of a beautiful view. Unfortunately, because of the holidays and the need to present this petition to the Parish Council meeting in early September, there was no time to visit the whole village.

In the meantime Councillor John Gilby says that the Parish Council cannot abdicate its responsibility to produce a plan. There is so much going on in the area over the next 20 years, for example a cycle path that could join us with Winslow. It's not all bad, but we do have to put our ideas forward, and if anyone would like to volunteer to help the NPT like myself that would be a great help to widen the views from all over the village. Remember, whatever type of house you live in, these are our homes and we have all chosen to live in Great Horwood not Buckingham or Milton Keynes.

As one resident to another please take an interest, follow the Focus and support the New Neighbourhood Planning Team.

## Jokers Get Sick

A conference centre in Newport Pagnell was the unlikely venue for Jokers Wild's latest 'production'. The village's amateur dramatics troupe, unable for a couple of years now to mount a full-scale production in Great Horwood, has been exercising its Thespian talents in an unusual way.
Recruited by a local NHS Healthcare Trust, Jokers has been helping to train General Practitioners. Nine members of Jokers were briefed in detail, and then were required to act out the part of patients with a variety of disorders and personality problems. Trainees, who had already qualified as doctors but not as GPs, examined each 'patient' under controlled conditions and in front of an assessor, and were then marked on their performance. The Jokers Wild actors had to present a convincing back story and to improvise where necessary, to respond authentically to the trainees' medical and welfare questions, and to repeat the performance consistently for each trainee throughout a single intensive morning.
Organised by Dr Claire Stewart, the Jokers Wild contingent comprised Debbie Kilkenny, lan Lamberton, Jane Moulding, Margaret Michalski, Nick Taylor, Peter Thornton, Phil Kilkenny, Rheya Brigden (standing in for Janthea), and Rod Moulding.
Disorders portrayed were many and various, ranging from the embarrassing to the potentially serious. Personally, I was cast in character (again) as a grumpy old man, this time with pneumonia. Other cast members had 'disorders' ranging from an abdominal aortic aneurysm to lesions on the leg (and an inability to stop chattering) and were similarly convincing - some so much so that I understand that at least one convinced himself that he actually had contracted the disorder he'd portrayed and made an immediate doctor's appointment.
It's time Jokers Wild was back on stage. We demonstrated at Newport Pagnell that we haven't forgotten how to act, but we need more participants - on stage, behind the scenes and front-ofhouse. The Village Hall now has new stage curtains, and Jokers has new lighting equipment. We're ready to go! Do contact any of the dummy patients listed above (or even me) if you'd like to know more.

Matthew was born in Great Horwood, lived there and attended the local school until the age of 7 . After many years living away, Matthew returned to Great Horwood in 2004 before moving to Milton Keynes in 2007.
When he was made redundant in 201 1, Matthew decided to work on his first book after always wanting to write one. He took inspiration from his very own stuffed monkey named George. He also chose to include sign language within the book as his own hearing is deteriorating and he wanted to show people that we are all special, no matter what. The book aims to revive the morals that Matthew was taught when he was a child.
The book is about a young boy called Max who is deaf. Max is just a normal boy who wants to make friends, have fun playing and work hard at school. Just like lots of boys and girls his age, Max struggles to make new friends until he meets George who has his own special skills.
George is a very special monkey. Unlike Max, he is not deaf. However, he can talk to deaf people using sign language. George is the best monkey-friend a young boy or girl could ask for. He knows what makes Max happy and what makes him sad.
George helps Max to bridge the gap between his world and the world of his hearing peers. He helps the other children to realise that, even though Max is deaf, he still has talents and skills which he can share with them.
The moral of the story is not to judge someone on first appearances.

## OPERATION ARCTIC

Operation Arctic is an operation between Thames Valley Police and Aylesbury Vale District Council to be launched late in October and run until February 2014 to combat burglaries and target those who commit these crimes during the darker winter months. It will also focus on tackling and raising awareness of these winter time burglaries.

The following simple steps will help in preventing you becoming a victim and target:

- Using timer switches help to give the impression that your home is occupied.
- Register your valuables on www.immobilise.com. It's free and takes just a few minutes and if your valuables are stolen will allow you to tell the police, your insurer, and the second-hand trade, to assist in recovering your property and catch the thief.
- Ensure that desirable items such as IPads, IPhones, Laptops, PlayStations and Jewellery are kept away from view so as not to attract attention.
- Invest in some additional locks for windows and back doors to improve security, remember if you have a UPVC door make sure you have double locked it, and turn the key in the door whilst in the house.
- A burglar alarm is still one of the best deterrents.

Insp. James Davies, said:"Aylesbury Vale has seen a seven percent reduction in dwelling burglaries since April 2013. However, as the nights draw in, we need to start to re-visit security and keep our homes safe and to deter opportunist burglars that intend to use the cover of darkness to commit crime."
If you see anything suspicious call the non-emergency 101 police contact number. But if you believe a crime is in progress call 999.

## Village Planters

The five village planters have thrived over their first season and we have agreed on appropriate plants for the winter and next spring to maintain the visual impact of these important structures as a reminder to road traffic of entry to the built up area of Great Horwood and Singleborough.

Importantly, before the winter season arrives, the handrails have now been installed.

## Footpaths Report

Discussions with the appropriate landowners are ongoing for the proposed kissing gates along the footpath from the A421 near Singleborough and the Nash Road near Manor Farm. Funding from Buckinghamshire County Council and a Lord of the Manor Award has been agreed. The bridleway running from the entrance to Singleborough near the A421 and the Thornton/Thornborough road has also been thoroughly cleared. Get your walking boots or running shoes on and explore our footpaths - they are the best of any parish in the northern Aylesbury Vale!

## Recreation Committee

There has been a significant amount of dog mess on the road towards Horwode Pece so an appeal is to be put in FOCUS for dog owners to bag and bin their dog's mess. A number of concerns have been addressed including noting the postcode on the noticeboard to assist emergency calls. Funds have also been secured to install a combination of boulders and beams to serve as both seating and an assault course, which it is hoped will be installed by the end of the year. The provision of Barbeque stands to reduce the temptation of cooking on picnic tabletops is being investigated. The picnic table has also been repaired, roses cut back and strimming/ mowing has taken place.

## Neighbourhood Plan

A useful meeting took place on 18 September between representatives of the Great Horwood Parish Council plus Neighbourhood Planning Team and Community Impact Bucks to explore a way forward for the Great Horwood Neighbourhood Plan. As a result of these discussions it was decided to have a follow-up meeting on 21 st October with the consultant who is producing the Winslow Neighbourhood Plan to discuss and cost the options concerning production of our proposed Plan. Ongoing efforts are also being made to attract volunteers from our community to join the Neighbourhood Planning Team. See also front page of FOCUS.

## AVDC Meet the Cabinet Meeting

Our Parish Council Chairman attended the meeting at the AVDC Gateway Centre in Aylesbury on 25 September. Overall attendance from Councillors in parishes and towns across the Vale was once again disappointing. Our Chairman's conclusion was that this was due to lack of interest and apathy even amongst
those who have chosen (or possibly coerced) into becoming parish councillors. The event started by having a number of information displays by various functions in AVDC and although all parishes were invited to put on their own display only 5 did so (Buckingham, Winslow, Stewkley, Quainton and Great Horwood). Our display included a number of copies of FOCUS, short notes on the Great Horwood Doctors Car Service, the Great Horwood and Singleborough Youth Club, the Pub Lunch Club and the new allotments in Willow Road. The main event then consisted of presentations by four AVDC Cabinet members:

- Planned Development Portfolio - the presentation mainly concentrated on the Householder Extension Local Development Order which has recently been introduced.
- Community Matters Portfolio - the presentation explained that this is a wide ranging portfolio and includes Housing, Health and Wellbeing, Older People, Voluntary Sector and Grants, Equalities and Cohesion, Partnerships, Customer services, Member Development and Community Safety.
- Community Planning Documents - including Village Design Statements and Neighbourhood Plans the only point of real interest was a restatement that a Neighbourhood Plans must be compliant with NPPF, EU regulations and strategic elements of local plan, and contribute towards sustainable development.
- Waste Recycling - further explanation of the scheme.


## Movable Vehicle Activated (Speed) Signs (MVAS)

There has been no update on MVAS despite both Cllrs Gilbey and Porritt chasing the matter. Local Cllr John Chilver who attended our Parish Council meeting stated that he believed that the delay was due to waiting for cable plans from utility companies to check the proposed installation sites. He agreed to lend his support to press for progress with the MVAS project.
