

Medical Detection Dogs CHRISTMAS CARDS



Medical Detection Dogs is a Buckinghamshire charity based in Great Horwood, co founded in 2008 by Dr Claire Guest, a scientist and animal behaviour expert, and Dr John Church, a former orthopaedic surgeon.

The charity works in partnership with researchers, NHS Trusts and universities to train specialist dogs to detect the odour of human disease. It has two main arms: cancer detection dogs and medical alert dogs.

The Cancer Detection Dogs are trained to detect the odour of volatile substances in urine or breath samples. The cancer dogs have the capacity to provide second line screening for cancers that are currently difficult to diagnose reliably, such as prostate cancer. Two papers produced by the charity in 2004 (BMJ) and 2011 (Cancer Biomark) have shown dogs to reliably detect bladder cancer. Trials are currently under way into the dogs' ability to detect breast cancer on breath samples and to detect prostate from urine samples.

The Medical Alert Assistance Dogs are trained to assist individuals who manage complex medical conditions, such as diabetes, severe nut allergy, Addison's, POTS or narcolepsy on a day-to-day basis. The dogs are taught to identify the odour changes that are associated with certain medical events, such as a drop in blood sugar level for diabetics and to give an alert. There are currently 62 medical alert assistance dogs partnered across the UK and with more funding this number will increase.

The charity receives no government funding and relies entirely on charitable donations.

Thefts from vehicles and outbuildings

You may be aware of thefts from vehicles and outbuildings recently in the area. Thames Valley Police is investigating.



Vehicle crime prevention tips

- · Where possible, secure your car overnight in a garage.
- If you don't have a garage, park in a well-lit area.
- · Close all windows and lock your car.
- Don't leave anything on display in your vehicle.
- · Empty the vehicle of tools and equipment.
- · Take all your personal possessions with you.
- Remove sat nav holders and visible sat nav ring marks from windscreens.
- Leave the glove box open to show there is nothing inside.
- Park vehicles in a way which prevents doors being opened e.g. alongside a wall.

Tips to make your shed, garage and outbuilding more secure

- Garages and sheds are often full of expensive tools to steal or use to break into the house. Do not leave a garage or garden shed unlocked, especially if it has a connecting door to the house.
- Fit strong padlocks and hardware to shed and garage doors.
- Make sure that the doors are solid enough not to be kicked in.

- · Fit locks or bars to windows.
- · Lock ladders inside your garage or shed.
- Consider lockable steel boxes or anchor posts fitted to the floor to secure tools and equipment.
- Garden tools and machinery should be permanently marked with your postcode.
- Install a battery or mains-powered shed alarm, available from all good DIY stores at a reasonable price.
- For extra security, replace the screws in external hinges of your shed or garage side-door with 'clutch-head' screws (also known as 'anti-tamper' or 'coffin' screws).
- Secure your wheelie bin to stop an intruder using it to climb on.

HALLOWEEN and BONFIRE NIGHT

With Halloween comes 'Trick or Treating'. This activity should be a bit of low key fun but for some it can be frightening. Below is a bit of 'common sense' advice so please heed it:

- · Never let young children go trick or treating on their own.
- Make sure you accompany them and only visit people you know.
- Make sure teenagers do not have access to fireworks, alcohol, eggs or flour.
- Explain to them why they must not play tricks on strangers.
- Tell them that if nobody answers the door, or a 'No trick or treat' sign is on display, they must leave immediately, and finally...
- Remind them stay with their friends and make sure they know that they should never enter the home of a stranger.

The Winslow and District Neighbourhood team will be out and about in the area during the evening so will be around should an issue occur.

Samaritan's Purse and how the Shoebox scheme got started. 25 years ago the founder read an article about the plight of children in Romanian orphanages, and decided to help. In the first year 250 boxes were sent, in 2014 it was 1.8 million.

Samaritan's Purse is a Christian charity, but the boxes are sent to children in need in S. America, some areas of Africa and Eastern Europe, irrespective of race or religion, but victims of war, famine, poverty or persecution.

Mary told us about the range of things that could go in a box, such as stationary, clothes (eg. gloves and hats), toiletries and toys.

Chairman's Monthly Report Last Meeting – Monday 12th October 2015

arish Council

Introduction

Our Neighbourhood Plan faced its first practical test last month with the AVDC Strategic Development Management Committee deciding to approve the large-scale housing development planning application for land to the south of Weston Road, despite a concerted defence by the Great Horwood Parish Council and 10 objectors (the maximum allowed to speak).

It was clear that the assessed shortfall of around 2 years-worth in the 5-year housing land supply required by central government drove the decision by AVDC. Rest assured, we have not given up the fight and will do everything in our power to reverse this decision. A pre-emptive request for the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government to call in the planning application, originally submitted by David Saunders, was also submitted by John Bercow and myself before the AVDC committee meeting took place. Following that meeting, I wrote to John Bercow to apprise him of the findings and dire implications. He then wrote to the Secretary of State using this information and we await a decision from central government. The next few months will be critical and your parish council will take every possible step to try to ensure our neighbourhood plan is upheld and not undermined.

Parish Updates

Moveable Vehicle Activated Signs (MVAS)

Following receipt of the data from our MVAS, Thames Valley Police have assessed a speed enforcement operation site in Great Horwood and will mount speed enforcement action in the future. Hopefully, this will send out a clear message and help to reduce speeding through Great Horwood and Singleborough and with it, the potential for a speed-related accident.

We would be grateful if you all remain as great ambassadors of safe driving through our built-up area by ensuring you remain within the speed limits and also not fall foul of the speed enforcement operation!

Neighbourhood Plan

The Parish Council passed the following motion at its last meeting: "Great Horwood Parish Council is appalled by the decision of the AVDC Strategic Development Committee to approve the planning application 14/01540/APP for 42 houses on Land off Weston Road in direct contravention to the Great Horwood Neighbourhood Plan and will continue to oppose the decision in all possible ways."

Notwithstanding the Weston Road planning application, there are several other planning applications which fall outside our Neighbourhood Plan, including of course, the very contentious Willow Road application, that are currently awaiting decisions by AVDC. We will continue to oppose vehemently all significant housing proposals which go against the agreed wishes of our community as expressed in your Plan.

Clearly, the principle of local communities having a say in the future plans for their areas, which is the central tenet of the Localism Act 2011, is at stake. The battle lines between the commercial pressure of encouraging significant housing development and the clear wishes of local communities to only allow proportionate and appropriate development have been drawn. This is David and Goliath and hopefully the result will be consistent!

The Secretary of State for Planning and Local Communities when answering questions in Parliament this month, again

expressed his support for neighbourhood plans and the principle of empowering local communities. If the Weston Road Planning Application is approved in direct contravention of our Plan, thereby totally undermining it and coming into direct conflict with the principles of the Localism Act 2011, we believe that he would be extremely concerned and would intervene. There are grounds for optimism and rest assured, we will fight our corner vigorously and with every means at our disposal!

Great Horwood Parish Plan 2016 Consultation

You will see that handouts concerning our Parish Plan 2016 are included with this edition of Focus. To help the Parish Council agree the Plan and the associated Action Plan and budget requirements, the Parish Council is seeking your views. Please fill out the associated questionnaire and give us your thoughts, as we need to know the wishes of our community! The deadline for returns is Monday 30 November 2015.


