



However, here is a recap of our season.

The 2019-20 Season..... that Never Was!

Good evening everyone and welcome to this years AGM. Tonight will be a shorter meeting than usual, due to limited news to report because of the exceptional position we and all of UK sport, have found ourselves in over the past season.

As we all know, the 2019/20 season was a non event due to the arrival of Covid 19 and the subsequent, on going pandemic. A few games were played before Christmas but then as we entered the New Year, word began to spread of a nasty virus coming our way from China, which reached our shores late February early March.

As a result and with guidance from Government and the FA, all remaining fixtures for the season were abandoned and the season finished. As a result, there is very little to report in terms of games played and performances.

Two areas of concern that will come as no surprise to any of us, are the on going ability of the volunteers to continue doing their great work and the number of junior teams we are able to field. At this moment, I feel it appropriate that we remember Ray Reading, a great Club supporter and committee member for many years. On the volunteer front, its good to see some 'young blood' increasing their efforts behind the scenes, but I feel we will shortly need more. At time of writing, I'm aware going forward, that we are short of a Treasurer and a Reserve Team Manager. My sincere thanks to Steve and Jack for their great efforts over the past few years.

The other significant challenge we face, is the dwindling number of Junior Teams we are able to field. Over the past few years, we have suffered from a lack of new families moving into the area and the 'pinch effect' of Milton Keynes and Moretonville FC. Hopefully, with the surge in new houses being built locally, some new young players might come forward, but if we are not careful, we could end up with no Junior teams in the near future. This issue needs resolving and any ideas are welcome....even if that means coming to some agreement with Moretonville FC or another local Club.

In conclusion, let's hope we can have a full 2020/21 season (in some shape or form), that more volunteers step forward to help with the running of the Club and that we find possible solutions to our dwindling youth numbers.

DID YOU KNOW?

The Final Frontier

With everything going on right now, I think you could be forgiven for not paying particularly close attention to what NASA's been up to, but the astronautics industry is entering a new exciting era and while 2020 hasn't given us much to look forward to, man walking on the moon again is certainly something to cling to.

In 2019, NASA administrator Jim Bridenstine announced the Artemis program, building towards establishing a lunar base in 2024, and the first manned mission to Mars in the 2030s. What's different from the Apollo missions is that now NASA has an arsenal of private companies to support, innovate and lead throughout this decade long project. The biggest advancement is undoubtedly the reusable rocket boosters that are now standard on any rocket launch. Pioneered by Space X, boosters (the small white jets straddling the fuel tank) were once single-use only, and were left to fall into the sea after each launch, however new technology means that Space X's boosters can not only control their descent, but can be landed on company boats, ready to be refuelled and launched again almost immediately.

The scope of the Artemis mission, though, has forced engineers to rethink so much of how we've done things before. As the moon has no atmosphere, up until now rockets have only had to endure the scorching heat of reentry once per flight, which is as they come back to Earth. Therefore single use solutions like silica tiles have always been used to prevent the rocket overheating. Due to Mars' thick, gaseous atmosphere, these will no longer be practical if we want vessels to be able to make a return journey from Mars. Space X have devised a cunning solution, based on observations from the natural world. On Musk's Starship liquid methane is pumped between two steel panels, where it boils and evaporates away through small 'pores', just like sweating in mammals. This ingenious solution is one of many ways the rockets of the future are being revolutionised.

It is hard to get excited about probes landing on asteroids, or new photos of Saturn, or any of the Earth bound research that has so far dominated 21st century space exploration, but a new dawn is breaking on man's journey beyond the stars, backed by exciting new innovations and renewed competition and vigour. By the time England line up for the next rugby world cup, mankind will be mere months away from landing on the moon's South Pole. It almost makes you optimistic doesn't it?

Wednesday Winslow Market Service

We are now running the Wednesday Winslow Market Service. Due to government restrictions, and the need to keep yourselves and our drivers safe, we have put in place strict guidelines for our drivers and passengers.

To comply with current 1 metre + social distancing, we have removed some seats as we are only able to transport 6 passengers at any one time. It will also be impossible to use the tail lift while maintaining a socially safe distance, so you will need to be able to board the bus unaided using the main door. The bus has been professionally cleaned ahead of resuming our service and we will ensure that the bus will be cleaned by our drivers between each scheduled journey, using alcohol-based cleaning products.

We are providing this limited service on the strict understanding that passengers travel entirely at their own risk. While we have made every effort to make the bus as safe as possible to travel in, we ask that all passengers follow the below guidelines:

- Your place on the journey must be pre-booked by calling the WDCB Coordinator on 01296 715786 | 07483336440
- We will not accept cash on the bus, so any payment must be organised prior to the journey with the WDCB Coordinator
- You must complete a Contact Form prior to the journey and give it to the driver (you will only need to do this for your first journey). This will only be used as part of the track and trace process.
- Face coverings must be worn whilst boarding and travelling on the bus
- Hand sanitiser must be used before boarding the bus and when leaving your seat to exit the bus (sanitiser supplied on the bus)
- You must take the rear-most available seat when boarding the bus
- You must exit the bus one at a time, with the front seats exiting first

Passengers are not to travel on the bus if they or any member of their household are displaying any signs of the COVID-19 virus.

Should you develop COVID-19 symptoms in the days following your journey on the bus, you must let the WDCB Coordinator know.

Our aim is to restart all our scheduled routes over the coming months. Excursions and hires remain suspended for the foreseeable future.




