# Friday 5th October: JULIE AND JULIA (USA, 2009, 123 mins)

With Meryl Streep, Amy Adams, Stanley Tucci

Julia Child introduced 1960s American suburbia to French cooking with her idiosyncratic tv shows. In post 9/11 New York, Julie Powell dealt with people whose lives have been damaged by the attack on the World Trade Center. Fed up with her job, she set herself the challenge of cooking all of the 500 recipes in Child's legendary cookbook in her pokey flat. Cue a domestic fallout, when her hitherto supportive husband discovered that she was recording every detail of her culinary and home life on her blog. In her best film since When Harry met Sally, Ephron coaxes tremendous performances from Streep (Child), Tucci (her diplomat husband) and Powell (Adams).

# Friday 19th October: EVEN THE RAIN (TAMBIEN LA LLUVIA) (Spain/Mexico/France, 2011, 104 mins, subtitled)

With Luis Tosar, Juan Carlos Aduviri, Gael Garcia Bernal

Scripted by Ken Loach's regular screenwriter, Paul Laverty, Even The Rain is a gripping, ambitious political drama about a Spanish film crew which lands in Bolivia to make a film about the arrival in the new world of Christopher Columbus. But the filmmakers' plans are derailed by a local battle to prevent the privatisation of the regional water supply. With powerful performances from Luis Tosar as a cynical as a cynical producer and Juan Carlos Aduviri as the local activist who leads the protests, this thoughtful and multi-layered film is based on real events in the Bolivian city of Cochabamba in 2000.



#### W.I News

As the leaves turn and the evenings draw in our autumn program got off to a cracking start. Riding on the coat tails of the Paralympic INSPIRING WOMEN Games, Keith Jansz came to our September meeting and showed what determination,

dedication, and inspiration can achieve. After a car accident in 1995 left Keith paralysed from the upper chest down he was persuaded to paint holding a brush between his teeth and joined the Association of Mouth and Foot Painting artists in 1998.

Keith spoke to us about the founding of the association in 1956 and its first president Arnulf Erich Stegmann, a polio victim who had lost the use of his arms and hands at the age of two. He explained how it works as a co-operative to help support its members by the direct mailing of Christmas cards to about 75 countries around the world. All the cards depict motifs of originals painted by the artists.

Since those early days his skill has grown and he now enjoys a worldwide reputation of capturing light in his paintings and exhibits all over the world. These exhibitions and regular visits to see patients at Stoke Mandeville Hospital pass on the message that painting has helped him regain his self esteem, given him confidence and that the disabled have purpose. His open radiant smiling face and enthusiasm for art will remain an inspirational memory for us all.

Only three days later we were in the village hall again when Rt Hon John Bercow MP spoke to a sell out audience of people from the village and surrounding WI's about his "life as Speaker of the House". The village hall was arranged as a tea room, with bright table cloths, potted plants and flowers. Each table had a scrumptious selection of sandwiches and cakes provided by members and friends of the WI.

He told us about the origins of the speaker, what the role encompassed and how he would like to see it develop for the current age. The talk was filled with funny anecdotes and impressions of his fellow politicians. The audience was then given the opportunity to ask questions which included his involvement in the Olympics and encounters with the Queen. We would like to thank everyone who helped make this event such a fantastic success.


At our next monthly meeting on 9th October, Helen Preston from Buckingham Canal Society will be telling us about the canals history and the plans for its future.

Many readers will remember the white Transit Dormobile Van that went around villages in the Buckingham and Winslow area using the tones from 'Close Encounters of a Third Kind' to announce the arrival of the mobile video library.

Things move on and the video library van went to the great scrap yard in the sky and Les & Elsie concentrated on the other side of their business – aerial and satellite system sales, repairs and installations.

With the demise of the library the name was changed to TV and Satellite Ltd and they are now able to offer many services from simple aerial repairs to large installations (the biggest completed so far being Lovat Fields Retirement Village in Milton Keynes - with some 400 plus points off a single dish and aerial array).

The advancement in technology has also created more opportunities with two way broadband internet services via satellite, fibre optic distribution systems, Smart TVs with internet access requirements and closed circuit television to name but a few.

They also do sub contract work for Village Networks (www.villagenetworks.co.uk), a Steeple Claydon company, which offers a wireless high speed broadband service in areas that cannot get it through the 'phone line.

In 1994 they joined 'The Confederation of Aerial Industries' (the main aerial industry trade association) and in 1997 Les was elected onto its Board of Directors.

He is now the Vice-Chairman and Technical Director as well as being a tutor for many courses including a distance learning course for the installation of large systems that gives a City & Guilds qualification.

Les has also been instrumental in writing codes of practice for the CAI that all members have to abide by. One such code is the Electrical Safety Code – did you realise that it is possible to get an electric shock from equipment connected to your aerial?

#### Local Games Maker at 2012 Olympics

The Olympics and Paralympics have provided a brilliant summer of sport and are widely seen across the world as a great success: superbly organised, spectacular venues and stunning performances.

Team GB amassed an impressive total of 185 medals across both Games, of which 63 were gold, and the whole country was treated to some memorable moments and breathtaking spectacles.

One reason for the success was the volunteers who made the whole thing happen: The Games Makers.

Recruitment began in September 2010 and 70,000 Games Makers were appointed out of the 240,000 who applied. They came from a diverse range of communities and backgrounds -from across the UK and abroad. Games Makers took on a wide variety of roles across the Olympic venues: from welcoming visitors; to transporting and looking after athletes; to helping out behind the scenes.

"I spent nine days (the duration of the Olympic tennis event) at Wimbledon doing a different role each day: from looking after the practice courts; to manning the players box entrance on centre court; to escorting Novak Djokovic off the practice courts when he was mobbed by autograph hunters and photographers!

Each day varied and was a fantastic experience basically welcoming the world to the Olympics. I met loads of different volunteers. I'd say half had given their time, others were part taking holiday pay, some were on company schemes where the corporates had decided to pay their staff to be Games Makers. The students, medical and forces personnel were amazing too"

# CHAIRMAN'S MONTHLY REPORT LAST MEETING - MONDAY 10TH SEPTEMBER 2012

Planning Matters

The application for an additional dwelling to be built in the grounds of 2 School End (12/01264/APP) has not yet been determined by AVDC.

An application was made by Sunnyhill Farm which requested permission not to demolish existing buildings although the planning permission from the previous application had specified this as a condition. This application has been refused by AVDC.

The Parish Council decided to oppose the application for an additional dwelling to be built on land to the rear of 11 The Green (12/01791/APP) and a detailed document setting out the reasons for its objection has been submitted to AVDC.

Movable Vehicle Activated Signs

Cllr. Porritt presented details of a project being developed by the Bucks County Council Winslow and District Local Area Forum to provide Movable Vehicle Activated Signs which will display the speed of vehicles exceeding the speed limit. The cost to the Parish Council is likely to be a little over £1000 provided that sufficient parishes in the forum area support the plan. This would provide for one sign which could then be used at up to 4 different locations in the parish. The Council unanimously approved the allocation of the funds. A final decision on whether enough parishes have signed up in order to enable the project to go ahead is expected by the end of October.

#### Conservation Area Review

Emilia Hands from AVDC gave a short presentation on the work that had been carried out to review the conservation areas within both Great Horwood village and Singleborough. A public consultation is due to start during the next two months where all residents who either live within the existing area or are affected by any proposed changes will be contacted to ask for their views.

The consultation will run for approximately 6 weeks before the final review is undertaken and proposed.

An explanatory article will be published in the next edition of Focus.

If anybody is unclear about the two current Conservation Areas which exist for Great Horwood and Singleborough maps and a brief description are available on the Parish Council website.

#### Telephone Poles in Pilch Lane

Many residents will have noticed telephone poles being installed along Pilch Lane and may have wondered how this was allowed without any formal planning consents. The Parish Council did receive notice that the works would be carried out and queried why no planning application had been received. We were advised that certain works by statutory undertakers such as BT are permitted development not requiring planning permission.

#### Neighbourhood Plan

Cllr. Scholtens reported that the draft vision and objectives was published in the September edition of Focus magazine and comments invited. To date only one response has been received with some valuable comments and a full reply has been sent. The Great Horwood Neighbourhood Planning Team (GH NPT) will by now have discussed the matter at its meeting on 19 September and the finally agreed vision and objectives will be forwarded to AVDC Forward Plans for comment. The GH NPT are currently performing neighbourhood environmental, historical and landscape sensitivity tests and defining the Neighbourhood Area strengths and weaknesses.

#### Footpaths

Robert Deuchar has reported that:

"All of the parish's footpaths have been inspected and pruned within the last fortnight. I am not aware of any major problems."

#### Horwode Pece

The short-term plan to resolve the issue with the boggy area between the two playgrounds is to install decking although this will still need draining.

The quality of the grass cutting team is poor. Liz Nicholls has asked them to take more care.

Quotes are being sought to put matting between the two goals as this area is very worn.






