

In June, the **D. Jack Smith Annual Charitable Grant** was launched. All Great Horwood village organisations were contacted and encouraged to apply for the grant. A front page article in the July issue of 'FOCUS' invited individuals as well as organisations to apply.

The grant is a donation of \$5,000 (approx. £3150) from Jack Smith, Lord of the Manor of Great Horwood, to good causes in the village. The selection criteria for the grant was *'SOMETHING WHICH BENEFITS THE RESIDENTS OF GREAT HORWOOD, WHICH IS FUN'*: something that is wanted but not necessarily needed

A committee was set up to review the proposals, consisting of a cross section of Great Horwood and Singleborough residents not involved in any of the applications. The members were Karen Francis, Ted Hadlow, Charlie Allen and Dean White (chairman); a mix of ages (teenager to 'somewhat older'), gender, and experiences. The committee made recommendations as to who should receive the grant and these were endorsed by Jack Smith.

On the 9th of September just before the monthly Parish Council meeting the awards for the grant were presented by Dean White, chairman of the review committee. Five awards were made as follows:-

Great Horwood School PTA (Parent Teacher Association): £850 for a chicken coop and a years' supply of food so that the children can raise and care for chickens and sell their eggs.

Great Horwood Silver Band: £195 for two lightweight musical instrument cases.

Great Horwood Football Club: £711 for new goals, spare parts for goals and fencing to assist in the funding of a major junior tournament that was held at the club at the end of August. It is hoped this will become an annual event.

Footpaths Warden: £1000 for 4 new swing-type gates to make an existing footpath between the north-eastern end of the village and Singleborough accessible. Opening up this footpath will have the added benefit of making a circular walking



route between Great Horwood and Singleborough because it will link up to two other footpaths. In all, 8 gates will be bought in order to fully open the footpath. Bucks Count Council promised to match Jack Smith's donation and will fund the other 4.

Youth Club: £400 for seating and paint to create an attractive outdoor area at the back of the village hall to be used by the Youth Club and other village hall users. Youth Club members and supporters will do the work.



This time we were successful, which is due to the efforts of Cathy Holland, who prepared the bid, and John Gilbey, who eloquently defended it with the County Council, so helping to secure the money. It helps that you all use the Rec. We now regularly get graded as 'a good and well maintained recreation ground' by ROSPA and have a team of helpers that keep it in good order; they cut the grass, strim and regularly inspect the equipment, the latter on a weekly basis. This all helps, because the Council likes to support facilities that are used and enhance the local community. Thanks to all of our dependable helpers.

These new pieces will promote the skill of balance as well as providing challenging fun; either on the triple balance beam or stepping from one pod to another, the next one just slightly higher, before working your way back to ground level.

Winslow Office is now open to the public 6 days a week due to a very supportive team of volunteers, also when the Winslow Farmers Market is on, the office will be open on the Sunday, so that particular week it will be open for 7 days

THAMES VALLEY POLICE ALERT:- Ask yourself: Is your home secure?

As the summer has drawn to a close and autumn is with us, it is important to keep your home secure. On the 27th October, the clocks will go back one hour and darker nights will draw in. Follow the Community Safety Partnership top tips and secure your home as the seasons are changing.

- Lock your doors and windows regardless of whether you are in the property or not. In more than 75% of cases the point of entry for a criminal into a home is through a door or window.
- Here's a bright idea: leave a light on! Timer switches activating a light upstairs are great at making your home appear occupied. Switches can be purchased for less than £5 from most hardware shops.
- Don't leave expensive items on display. Put valuable gadgets out of sight of windows and doors.
- Keys left near entry points can be 'fished' or 'hooked' out through the window, letter box or cat flap. Put keys away and out of sight.

- External automatic security lighting and household alarms are great ways to deter opportunists.
- Ensure any internal handle operated locks on UPVC doors are fully secured with a key. Do not leave the key in the lock.
- Property mark your valuables with UV Pens, Selecta DNA or Smartwater. When goods are marked it enables recovered property to be returned and improves the chance of conviction.
- If you see anything suspicious call the non emergency 101 police contact number. If you believe a crime is in progress call

If you have a problem on any of the above items ring:- 101 Also use it to report a crime, contact a police officer - all police officers have mobile phones so you can leave a message for them to respond to when next on duty - or contact your local police station. 999 can also be used and will connect you to the emergency services, namely fire ambulance and the police. If you have information about crime but do not want to speak to the police, you can call Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555

By the way, Thames Valley Police no longer use the 8045 8 505505 contact number so you must use the 101 number for non-emergency calls.

CHAIRMAN'S MONTHLY REPORT LAST MEETING - MONDAY 9TH SEPTEMBER 2013

Neighbourhood Plan

As I told you in my report in the September edition of Focus, 4 out of the 5 members of the Neighbourhood Plan Team had resigned and so the development of a Neighbourhood Plan for the Parish had been put into abeyance. At the Parish Council meeting on 9th September I advised that I did not think that the Parish Council can abdicate its responsibility for the production of a Neighbourhood Development Plan for the Parish and I presented a possible way to move on which was unanimously approved by the Council. Therefore David Saunders and I will be meeting with a representative of Community Impact Bucks (CIB) on Wednesday 18th September to see if they can offer any advice on helping us find a way forward. It was CIB who commissioned the consultants who have produced a well received draft plan for Winslow in a very short time.

In the meantime a resident of The Close has produced a petition which has been signed up to by 86 households in the village supporting the idea of producing a Neighbourhood Development Plan for the Parish. I would not say that the petition is fully representative of the parish as I understand that many areas of the village were not canvassed. However it does appear that there are enough residents who believe that a plan is necessary in order to ensure any development is controlled and not left entirely to property developers. This should ensure that there will be sufficient support for continuing with the work of producing a plan. I am hopeful that at least one other member of the Parish Council will join me if we can agree to a new team being put together which can be considered representative of the parish and this team will obviously need other volunteers from the community to join with us.

Movable Vehicle Activated (Speed) Signs Installation

Cllr. Porritt is now in touch with the contractors and is trying to ensure that the necessary training takes place as soon as possible and the installation at the proposed sites takes place shortly after.

John the Barber

As many of you know "John the Barber" has been visiting the village every Thursday for more than 6 years and parking his van on The Green. He pays the Parish Council a small monthly sum for this facility. From time to time there have been complaints about the noise of his generator from local residents. When such a complaint was made again I decided to survey the residents in the area to ascertain the degree of problem. A simple questionnaire was delivered to all the properties around The Green. We received 10 responses only 2 of which felt that the noise did constitute an unacceptable nuisance. The questionnaire also asked if any of the residents would be willing to allow John to plug into their electricity supply with a mutually agreed sum to be paid in compensation. One resident has volunteered to do this and John the barber has been informed of this offer.

Recreation Committee

No report was received from the Recreation Committee.

Hand Rail opposite 2/4 Nash Road

Cllr. Mayne has organised for this to be installed before the winter weather arrives.

Village Freighter

We have still never been able to obtain any information from AVDC on how many people used the freighter when it visited the

village. So it was agreed that we will request a visit to take place and ask the driver to record the number of villagers using the service before the Council makes a final decision on whether to continue to pay for further visits. The planned visit will be publicised in Focus and on the Parish Council notice board.

Footpaths Report

Robert Deuchar provided the following report for our meeting.

"All the Parish's footpaths have been inspected and pruned between 18 and 28 August"






