

Chairman's Monthly Report: Last Meeting - Monday 11 September 2017



September marks the beginning of a new academic year for schools and colleges. Although Great Horwood technically the Parish Council's Parish Council year runs from April, in many ways September seems like a

new beginning too. We are beginning to think about the budget for next year and what activities the Parish Council wishes to undertake and support. This includes the annual programme of grants to local organisations - please see elsewhere in FOCUS the Clerk's invitation to apply.

If you make use of the footpaths in the parish, you will come across two new gates replacing stiles., making footpaths easier to use. The Parish Council is grateful to the donors who enabled this to happen We are considering which other stiles might be replaced - and if you would like to donate a gate, perhaps in memory of some person or event, please contact the Clerk. The Parish Council is also grateful for the continuing maintenance of footpaths undertaken by Robert Deuchar.

The Parish Council considered at length a number of planning applications, including possible expansion of Nash Park where unauthorised activity took place over the Bank Holiday. Delays are still being experienced in relation to some of the more complex cases, but one significant application has now been decided.

At the beginning of September AVDC granted outline planning permission for up to thirty new homes on land south of Little Horwood Road, beyond Townsend Cottages. This is land that was allocated for housing in our Neigbourhood Plan, which we supported in a referendum in 2015. The details of the scheme are not yet fixed, and the developer will need to provide details in a further application to AVDC sometime in the next three years.

One important feature is that a "Section 106 agreement" has been signed, specifying certain community benefits that will have to be provided by the development. The most important is that ten of the new homes will have to be "affordable housing", which means that either they will be available for social rental, or for shared ownership. We know from our housing survey that there is a demand for housing from people who have

a connection with our village and would like to live here, but who find market prices out of reach. At present we expect that seven of the ten affordable homes will be available to rent, although this might be subject to change.

At a time when there is considerable uncertainty in Aylesbury Vale about the extent and location of new development, and with the publication of the VALP (Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan) expected in early October, it is important we can show that our own Neighbourhood Plan can - to use the words of Government policy - "shape and direct" development around our village.

The next meeting is to be held at 7.30 pm on Monday 9 October 2017 in the Village Hall.





The Verney family have lived in the area since 1620. The house we see today is a fraction of its original size, what remains is the West Wing. We were shown slides of the Rocco architecture.

Luke Lightfoot, was the most talented wood carver of the era, his work can be found on the ceilings and niches in the walls, dado rails and the Corinthian columns. 




