We hope the glorious summer that we have had has meant the Rec has been used to its full potential, it certainly appears that there were many picnics taking place.



In the July Focus I raised the issue of damage down the Rec., possibly the result of vandalism, though some in the village think it may be damage caused by animals, roebuck deer, foxes and squirrels have been suggested. In July work was undertaken to repair this damage. Later in July and further in August Rec. inspections reported further damage, believed to be a result of vandalism; parts of the log-surround of the toddler and teenage areas had been kicked off, the second rose trellis had been pushed over - possibly to provide access to the Mill building site. Also, for the first time, graffiti was scribed onto the uprights of the shelter - this is most recent and we have yet to try to remove it without damaging the uprights.

May I please remind dog owners to put the dog poo in the designated red Poo bin at the entrance of the Rec, not in the normal waste bin. The normal one is emptied by two volunteers who have to put the rubbish in their own bins as the bin-men won't empty it as it is situated within the Rec. In an attempt to be environmentally friendly we try to separate the recycling from the landfill but this is extremely unpleasant when there are multiple poo bags and even dirty nappies unbagged.

We are planning ahead for Working Parties and are always very grateful for any volunteers to come along and help us on those days, notices will go up at the Rec stating when these days are, as well as notice in Focus.

Our next organised event at the Rec will be the Fireworks Display which will take place on SATURDAY 3rd NOVEMBER, gates open 5.30pm, Display starts at 6.15pm. There will be hot food, Mulled Wine and soft drinks available to buy. Please come along and support our 3rd Year of this spectacular event, all proceeds go towards the self funding of the display and will eventually help to add funds to the upkeep of the Rec. VANDALISM IN HORWODE PECE

The PC was very sorry to hear of more vandalism on Horwode Pece. Someone has even used the shelter for graffiti. GHPC abhors the damage caused to this valuable asset. Large amounts of residents' money have been invested in this wonderful facility and a very few (probably non-residents) spoil it for the many. If you see any suspicious behaviour on the Rec, please report it to John Nicholls or Jane Holland on the Management Committee.



DUSTBIN COLLECTION DAY & RECYCLING CENTRE SURVEY

Everyone should have received a letter from Aylesbury Vales District Council (AVDC) about

dustbin collection day. Our dustbin collection day remains the same. The only change to the current pattern of alternate waste/recycling is that garden waste will now be collected on a Tuesday rather than a Monday.

Bucks County Council (BCC) is undertaking a consultation on household recycling centres such as Yonder Slade in Buckingham. Residents can take part by going to www. surveymonkey.co.uk/r/G9WPW5J. Non-internet users can request a survey form from the clerk and then post it to County Hall. I also wonder whether one could go to the local library and ask for help completing the survey on line? The consultation closes at midnight on Monday 22nd October 2018. Please try and take part as this is a very valuable asset for North Bucks and needs your support.

BCC have made the following comment about the Yonder Slade site:

Buckingham - Yonder Slade - Visits per year: 107,000. Buckingham is the most remote site in the network, serving the North of the county. It is in a light industrial estate on the outskirts of the town. It is one of the most expensive to run, and is a small site with a narrow entrance. Despite its size, it is in a good location for the housing growth planned in the North.

Removing this site would give residents in North Bucks around 35min extra journey time, above the recommended maximum of 30min in a rural area.

STREETLIGHTS

I have been asked to say a few words about GH streetlights. The network is being privately funded by the Parish through a Public Works Loan Board (PWLB) loan. We finally finish paying for the lights in 2022. We have an annual maintenance contract, currently with Eon. Any requests for repair need to be made through the Clerk (contact details below) - if possible using the two digit light number so I can pinpoint its location on the lighting map for the engineer (copy on the GHPC website). We currently have 30 lights (numbered from 01 to 30) but this will increase as new developments are completed. Please note that BCC has no responsibility for GH streetlights.

OXFORD TO CAMBRIDGE EXPRESSWAY

It has been announced that the preferred option for the Oxford to Cambridge expressway will broadly follow the line of East West rail. GHPC has been reliably informed that it will go "via Winslow". Deep joy - three huge transport projects in the area over the next 10 years! Theoretically the road will be open in 2030 but if you believe that

East West rail was planned for 2017 and this has been delayed until 2023... My bet is 2030 for EWR and 2040 for the new road.

VAN THEFTS



Police Community Support Officer Rachel Found kindly gave a short, well attended,

question and answer session on thefts from vans in the village. It appears to be a county wide problem with 64 reported van break-ins, plus caravan and trailer thefts. The culprits appear to be crossing county borders. One arrest has been made as part of a wider investigation and two more offenders are being sort. This is of great concern to residents as it affects livelihoods. A suggestion was made about having village CCTV and GHPC is conducting a fact finding exercise looking into the implications, practicality and cost of having a camera in the village. I must stress that there is too much to consider to make any plans at all at this stage. Residents buying their own cameras must ensure they are focused entirely on their own properties. It is an offence to have them trained on public land e.g. pavements and roads or on their neighbours property. Such misuse of cameras will be reported to the Information Commissioners Office.

THAMES VALLEY POLICE (TVP) SCAM WARNINGS

TVP issue scam warnings on a regular basis for the Aylesbury Vale area. There is currently information on a drainage scam where workman purporting to be from Thames Water or Dyno-Rod persuade residents that their drains are blocked and they need to hire drain unblocking equipment at £500 a pop! There is also a Netflix scam which asks you to update

SPEEDWATCH

Volunteers continue to operate Speedwatch with offenders being reported to TVP. For example, in June, 36 letters were sent to speeding drivers of which 1 was a second offender and NONE were locals (good news!). The MVAS, ably monitored and cared for by Mick Wood (TY x), records the speed of all cars passing the sign. Mick reported that the average speed on Winslow Road has reduced from 43 to 41 mph. The irregular appearance of the police monitoring camera is also an asset (TY TVP). A little bird tells me that Great Horwood is getting a reputation as a speed monitoring hotspot (Yes!) What residents may not know is that all cars registered on the camera have their tax and MOT status checked. More volunteers please.


HORWOOD FEAST




