

A GREAT NEW BUS SERVICE FOR GREAT HORWOOD



After many months of trying Buckinghamshire Council have finally agreed with the Parish Council's request to provide a new additional bus service for Great Horwood. It will be a diversion of the current No. 60 route which runs from Aylesbury to Buckingham and vice versa via the villages. The proposed new service via Great Horwood will consist of 2 journeys each way each day from Monday to Friday.

The service towards Buckingham

Leave Great Horwood, High Street at 10.24am and arrive in Buckingham (Tesco) at 10.33am and Buckingham (High Street) at 10.38am. The return journey would leave Buckingham (High Street) at 12.45pm and Buckingham (Tesco) at 12.50pm, arriving back at Great Horwood at 12.59pm. (And will continue on to Aylesbury Bus Station via Winslow, Granborough, North Marston, Oving and Whitchurch)

The service towards Aylesbury

Leave Great Horwood, High Street at 10.59 and will arrive in Aylesbury at 11.38am. (via Winslow, Granborough, North Marston, Oving and Whitchurch) The return journey would leave Aylesbury Bus Station at 13.45, arriving back at Great Horwood at 14.24. (And continue on to Buckingham along the A421)


Journeys will operate as Service 60A to highlight this different route.

It is, of course, a new service in addition to the existing bus services for the village which will continue as normal.

This new service is planned to start on 4th January 2022 and will be on a trial basis, the complete timetable being published this November.

GREAT HORWOOD FOOTBALL CLUB 2020/21 AGM - 24TH AUGUST 2021

The Ravens 2020-21 Season.

Well, as we know, Covid continues to have a significant impact on our lives and sport in general, but I'm pleased to report that some football did get played last season and training has commenced for the forthcoming campaign. So here is a quick resume of what took place last year.

Focussing on last season's on the pitch performance's.

In the juniors section, the **U14s** started the season strongly but the Covid lockdowns interrupted their rhythm and the season finished disappointingly including a loss to the Dads! However the players have re-grouped and a strong showing is expected for the forthcoming season.

The **U12s** struggled to field a regular team and have unfortunately folded.

However, I will touch on some more encouraging Junior team news later.

Within the senior part of the Club,

The First Team, Played 11, Won 10, Lost 1 = 1st Place in the North Bucks Premiership. What a result...

After a stop start season, the team managed to finish at the top of the table and win the Premiership division. Credit must go to the lads for sticking with it and playing through.

There were three games that stood out this season and which gave us an insight into how good this team can be.

First was Towcester away, which is a place we don't usually do well at, but we came away winning 4-1 with Eddie Archer getting a nice brace and Ryan Lightfoot having a great game in the sticks.

Secondly was a 2-1 win at Pottersbury, a place no one likes to go to (similar to Silverstone....if I recall 2018, that after match fracas and their subsequent fine!!)

We conceded a goal within the first 10 minutes but then the boys managed to battle back and win by the odd goal.

Finally, it had to be the last game of the season where a win would secure the title. It was a nervy game but super sub Dom McCabe came on and made a cross at the back post to secure a 1-0 win and win us the league. The Chairman then, not to underestimate their performance, presented the players with a celebratory case ofBudweiser (due to Covid, one bottle each, not the normal Moet Chandon!!!)

A special mention must go to Darren and Jack (and team) for looking after the pitch all season. Also a special mention to Eddie, Sam Archer, Sid Hawkins & Ben Thickbroom for 100% records. Also to Sid Hawkins for finishing as top goal scorer with 10 goals, Andy Brunning finishing second with 8 and Eddie Archer with a total of 6.

I think you will all agree with me, that this performance continues to support my view that this small, quiet, quaint, quintisential English village Club, continues to attract some great local players, who play because they appreciate our Club values and ethos and that we deliver results, punching well above our weight.

Reserve Team 2020-21 played 11, won 3, drew 2, lost 6 = 8th place in North Bucks Div 1 (12 teams in Div)

In a truncated season the reserves finished in mid table with no matches being played between the end of December and the start of April due to Covid. The team stayed together during these exceptional circumstances and it was a credit to all the players for coming back and finishing the season in April. Thanks to Jack Trundell who after stepping down from the managers role before the start of the season helped out with the running of the side and also a mention to Chippy who was the only player to have a 100% appearance record, honourable mentions to James Baker, Dylan Bingham and Lewis Wilkes for only missing 1 match. Congrats to Harvey Kimble for finishing the season as top scorer on 7 goals with James Baker adding 4 from centre back and Dom McCabe scoring 4 in 2 matches before being promoted to the 1st team. A good season considering. with hope for improvement in 2021-22.

Vets summary

The Vets played 7 league and cup games up until the season was postponed at the beginning of December 2020 winning 2 and drawing 1.

The league restarted in April with each team playing each other once (11 games) and cup competitions being cancelled.

The reduced season meant that the Vets were scheduled to play 11 games in 13 weeks (mid April to the end of June)....which I personally felt to be unrealistic for the smaller clubs.

Out of the 11 league games the Vets drew 1, lost 8 and forfeited 2 due to holidays and injuries in June.

Andy is stepping down as 'Manager' with Simon Phillips, Adrian Faithful and Steve Bennett taking on the running of the team for next season.

Andy Cooke is one of those unsung village heroes, who is involved in lot's of village activities including football and the Brass Band and we thank him for his significant contribution to the success of the Club over many years, both on and off the pitch. I'm pleased to say he has agreed to remain involved in Club activities.

Now onto other matters.

As a result of the pandemic, all fund raising was cancelled last year and this has impacted our finances. I hope that we will be able to re schedule the Race Night and Junior Tournament in the near future. Having said that, we are fortunate enough to be in a solid financial position as Steve will report on later. We were also successful in obtaining a couple of grants which have been invested into the ongoing maintenance of the pitches and a Worthy Cause payment from the Parish Council. Steve has also done a great job at fraud recovery.

We continue to benefit from a small but dedicated team of volunteers, who carry out the vital behind

Parish Council sad passing of Robert Deuchar, the Parish Council's Footpaths Warden. He did an invaluable job, voluntarily maintaining the footpaths and bridleway for the past ten years. He was also involved with organizing the removal of many stiles that have been replaced with kissing gates, thereby making walking the countryside much more accessible for all ages. He will be greatly missed.

RESURFACING VILLAGE ROADS



The resurfacing of the side roads has now been completed. The Parish Council are not satisfied with the works and residents affected have either complained to the workmen

directly or written a report on fixmystreet.com concerning works that need to be rectified.

Parish Council have complained The to Buckinghamshire Council with the following observations:

1.The wrong roads were resurfaced but our request that the High Street and Little Horwood Road were resurfaced as a priority over the side roads was met with a negative bureaucratic response.

2. Road closed signs were put in place causing residents much inconvenience and then nothing happened for more than a week.

3. The standard of work was poor and when we complained, we were told that the contractor had delivered a leaflet to all affected households explaining how the methodology used provided the best long-term cost effective solution. No such leaflets were delivered.

4. When we complained about lack of supervision we were told we do our best.

5. Many areas of pavement were left covered in stones thrown up from the road surfaces.

6. A report on fixmystreet.com says the drains in Spring Lane are now blocked by all the excess stones.

7. The level of some drain covers is now well below the new road surface level causing serious hazards.

8. Signs were erected boasting how

Buckinghamshire Council is spending £100 million on an Improvement Programme This caused considerableamusement among the residents living in the affected roads.

9. Minimal responses received to complaints.

The Parish Council have waited over a year for two litter bins to be delivered and installed, one in Little Horwood Road and one at Horwode Pece. Both bins were positioned in the wrong place, even though Bucks Council had been given specific instructions. We wait for this problem to be rectified.

Townsend Cottages are the only street in the village with high level street name plates fixed to residents' properties. The Parish Council has arranged for the name plates to be replaced with ones at street level, but still we wait for the work to be done.

There are currently over thirty outstanding planning applications still to be determined in Great Horwood. We are told that there is a lack of staff to take on the Case Officer positions that look after this work. We assume this outstanding list will only get longer.

The Parish Council will continue to chase outstanding issues on a monthly basis until all matters reach a satisfactory conclusion.

How does it feel to be back at school? That is a very difficult question. Some may feel distraught, although others may be excited. Personally, I feel exhausted. Although, it is good to be back seeing all of my friends and learning lots of new information that I can put to use in life. Being in Year 6 feels abnormal, but I know I need to do my best as I will not get this chance again. Each year only comes once, so you must ensure you are prepared for every obstacle it tries to put in your way. We are now running the following services:

Aylesbury Market Bus (See left)- runs every Friday and Saturday morning -- from Winslow, through Gt Horwood, Nash, Whaddon, Mursley and Swanbourne, arriving in Aylesbury just after 10am and departing at 12.15pm. Bus passes accepted, otherwise £4.50 return.

Winslow Market Service 54abc - runs every Wednesday morning

This service picks up in the surrounding villages and then into Winslow, (Swanbourne, Mursley, Great Horwood, Whaddon, Nash and The Claydons). Pick up times vary according to village. Bus passes accepted, otherwise £3.00 return.

Buckingham Bus Service - runs on the first Tuesday of the month

Picking up in Winslow and surrounding villages. 1 hour in town then 1 hour in Tesco, or 2 hours in Tesco. Door to door service. Bus passes accepted, otherwise £4.50 return.

Asda - we offer this trip on the last Monday of the month.

Picking up in Winslow and surrounding villages. Asda Shopping with the option to drop at Stadium MK1 for M&S, Primark, Next and more. Bus passes are not accepted on this trip. £4.50 return.

Despite the government lifting restrictions, we still have the following guidelines in place to help keep yourselves and our drivers safe:

• Please call and reserve your seat in advance. All 16 seats are back on board but the double seats are still for single occupancy only unless agreed in advance with the coordinator.


- We ask that all passengers wear a face covering while travelling on the bus.


