I am writing this article in the week of mourning since the death of Queen Elizabeth and I have been thinking about what plant do we see as being "the most British".

There will inevitably be a number of contenders but, no matter how I look at it, there is one plant that has been most influential on these islands and that has to be the Mighty Oak.

The qualities of this magnificent tree and the character of our nation have been intrinsically linked since at least the 1600's. The Victorian writer John Loudon wrote that the oak was, "the emblem of grandeur, strength and duration; of force that resists, as the lion is of the force that acts."

We can have a legitimate pride in our legacy of ancient oak trees, we have more of them in this country than the rest of Europe combined, but there is much more to them than just the past, and what they tell us about ourselves.

Here in the UK we have 2 species of oak that are native, the much more common English Oak (*Quercus robur*) and the rarer Sessile Oak (*Quercus petraea*), one of the main differences between them is the English oaks acorns are carried on stalks whilst the Sessile oak's acorns are on the outer twigs.

Many church parishes have a "Gospel Oak" where they would be a pause in the beating of the bounds (an annual procession around the edge of a parish beating the ground to signify the boundary), this would be done to proclaim the Gospel from under the shelter of the tree. It would be no accident

that an oak was chosen.

Since the Reformation of the monarchy there have been 8 Royal Navy warships called Royal Oak and 'Heart of Oak' is the official march of the Royal Navy.

But it is in our towns and country where they have the most impact. Either standing alone in a field, giving shelter on a green, just quietly getting on with things.

They are home to a staggering array of life, they are host to the largest number of organisms of any plant in the UK, partly because of their longevity, (38 bird species, 1178 insect species, 716 lichens, 31



mammals and 108 species of fungi). As they age and change the species of insects that are to be found on them will change also. We see them as being constant companions in our landscape, immovable and unchanging but the truth is that they are always growing, always adapting and always changing the world around them. A bit like Her Majesty the Queen.



GREAT HORWOOD ROAD CLOSURE - NOW OPEN



As everyone will know, the Great Horwood Road closure was originally posted to be in place for a period of nine weeks to facilitate the refurbishment of Buckingham Road Bridge and associated utilities works. This was of

course completely unacceptable since the road was to be used as a temporary lay down area and avoid a three-way traffic control system at the junction of the B4033 with the A413. The Parish Council wrote letters of complaint to Buckinghamshire Council Transport for Bucks and Network Rail and were pleased when a decision was made to reduce the closure to just one week.

We have all received notification from Network Rail that they may need to close Great Horwood Road for a short period of time in the coming weeks, although there will be access to properties as well as public and school buses. The two-way traffic lights will be in place on the A413 Buckingham Road until 11th November, so make sure you leave extra time for your journeys.






