ST JAMES CHURCH ROOF





As I think most people in the village are aware the lead on St James Church roof was stolen earlier in the summer. Unfortunately the insurance does not cover the cost of repair as so many churches have had lead stolen the amount paid out is only a fraction of the cost. We don't know the final cost yet but early estimates are in the order of £100,000 and although we have had tarpaulin fitted this is not sufficient to stop water ingress so we will need to replace this soon.

More shocking pictures inside.

All the Church's funds are being diverted to this project; including the Harvest Supper, Harvest Auction and Annual Giving Day (see back page for more details). The planned redecoration of the inside of the church has been cancelled as the funds have now gone towards the cost of the roof.

Around 8 centuries of history and tradition are in danger of being washed away. Can you help?

We are looking to get grants from the Lottery Heritage Fund, The Bucks Historic Churches Trust. Does anyone know of any other funds or grants we can apply for? Are there any local businesses who may be able to help sponsor the roof?

We are also launching the St James Church Roof appeal.

The AGM 2018-19 Season, Chairman's report




