

WORK STARTS ON CHURCH ROOF



We are sure that you will have noticed that work started on the church roof in the summer, and we are pleased to say it is scheduled to complete in September.

We were very keen to undertake the work before the autumn as the temporary felt roof has already been damaged by high winds and we would have had to replace it to prevent further water ingress - putting back the final repair.

The work has not been without its setbacks with additional costs for rotten timbers and replacement of the flashings damaged when the lead was stolen which have utilised our contingency. We will have to defer the replacement of the felt on the South Porch and also need to find funds to redecorate inside the church which has been badly affected by water ingress at an estimated total cost of £30000.

So a massive thank you to all who have contributed to the roof fund – we think that to be able to replace in 3 years is a fantastic achievement and we hope that everyone will still be able to support our future fund raising for South Porch replacement and redecoration starting with the Quiz in September!



GARDENING TIMES

When September rolls around, sadness that summer is over mixes with happiness that life can slow down just a bit-even for a month-as my kids return to school and before my thoughts turn to Advent and Christmas. Out in the garden, plants heave a sigh of relief from summer's intense sun (especially this year) and visibly show signs of wear and tear, letting us know that they need a little extra tending to right now and would love help transitioning into cooler, calmer temperatures. Your garden may also be in the throes of its last hurrah, producing ripe edibles or pretty petals, but secretly eager to down-shift and get ready to be put to bed in the upcoming months. When I worked as a gardener, I used to love this time of year, the colours change, and the light softens, making things look even more beautiful than they were before.

Now is the time to be saving some seed for next year. If anything was particularly beautiful, then save some for 2023, especially if you have something that is unusual. Seed production is a multi-billion pound industry and it is one that we all take for granted, if we want something in our garden, we go out and buy seeds (I counted 6 packets of coriander that I have in my seed shoe box), each of those seed packets cost £2.50, even with my terrible maths I know that is £15 worth of seeds that I could quite easily have saved just by leaving my plants to go to seed.

Saving seed helps with all sorts of things, food diversity, growing what you want as opposed to what is available. It helps wildlife, some animals may help themselves to some of your seed and that is OK, a more diverse garden helps a wider array of wildlife and a healthy ecosystem is crucial to all living things. The U.S. Wildlife service estimated that losing one plant species can trigger the loss of up to 30 species of other insect, plant and animal species. You can save the seeds of a wide variety of plants in your gardens, anything that is an annual will produce plenty of seeds, I have grown tomatoes year after year from collecting a tomato and letting it overripen, then scooping the seeds out, washing them and drying them, ready for the next year. Sunflower, Echinacea, Poppy, primroses, celery, cucumber, runner bean, pumpkin, peas, chilli, basil, nasturtium, spinach (leave one plant that has bolted and you may get some delicious greens this year), corncockles are all incredibly easy to seed save. If you have too many, you can always give some away. Seed saving isn't just about saving money, anticipation and pleasure encapsulate the essence of doing it. Seeds are the source of life, it is resurrection writ large, filled with hope and dreams and that in itself is reason to do it. Just make sure that you label your envelopes!

Jobs to do in September

Scatter windfall fruit around the garden as food for wildlife. Plums are a favourite of butterflies - they adore the sugary juice.

Don't cut back perennials too hard in the autumn 'clear up'. Hollow stems, tussocky plants and piles of leaves swept under a hedge make perfect overwintering sites for a huge number of beneficial creatures

GREAT HORWOOD FOOTBALL CLUB 2021/22 AGM, 6TH JULY 2022 AT 7PM The Ravens 2020-21 Season.

Good evening ladies and gentlemen, madam President and welcome to this years AGM.

Thank you Sid for arranging tonight and our thanks to the Cricket Club for the use of their Clubhouse.

I'm delighted to report that after a couple of disrupted Covid related years, we finally had a full season and what a positive season it turned out to be. I will briefly run through activity both on and off the pitch, before handing over to Steve, who will take us through the very important financials.

Focussing on last season's team performance's and specifically the Junior section, the following updates come from the respective age group Managers.

U17's Ian Griffin

"After a difficult protracted 'post lock down' end to the 2020/21 season, the coaches and managers decided to remain with Saturday AM football, however in a NEW league!

The U17's joined the Bedford League, transferring from the MKDDL (Who currently play on Sunday, this clashes with local Rugby).

The Bedford league has both U17's & U18's teams – Our division mostly of the latter.

This resulted in a seriously tough season in terms of results, injuries and moral. To enable us to turn this around, we decided to cut the season short by two games and concentrate on friendlies and training.

The lads have reacted well to this, improved and as a result after a Spring/Summer of positive training sessions and recruitment we have made the decision to re-join the MKDDL, with a view to bouncing back and finding our form from the "Pre-covid" days.

Next, **Martyn Waggott, the U15s Manager** says "we had a mixed season but the highlight would be beating the local enemy (Moretonville) both home and away. Recruitment for next season looks very promising so expecting a really good season at U16s.

U9's Darren Sirett (Sid)

First season for this team with a difficult start as other teams had been playing together for a few seasons. Also with over 60% of the team being U8's and playing up a year. But the team started to come together at the turn of the year and recorded some great wins in the second half of the season. We'll done to Frazer and the boys.

U8's Darren Sirett (Sid)

Again another new team with 3 U7's mixed in with the U8's. A few defeats early in the season never dampened their spirits and a first win would come in December followed by 3 more victories. All players gave 100% at all times and have been a credit to the club and themselves.

Further good news is that Sid and Jack continue to work at recruiting more youth teams and it looks

like we may have a new U8's next season. This is very encouraging, as we look to rebuild and grow our junior section of the Club. If you are new to the village or surrounding area and would like your child to play village football; do get in touch.

Within the senior section of the Club, I'm delighted to report that, the First Team defended and retained the North Bucks Premiership Title after Playing 20 matches, of which they Won 16, Drew 1 and Lost only 3 games all season. Total points achieved 49, 8 points clear of the runners up AFC Towcester and 10 points clear of 3rd place MK Irish Athletic. The Goal Difference was also significant at +15 over Towcester. Mark Broom, who managed the team last season said, "It was a very slow start to the season with us losing 3 out of the first 4 games. Once October hit, we started to find our form and went on a really good run. We were unbeaten at home all season in the league, which is a huge achievement. The home form was the base for us retaining the league and our main goal at the start of the season.

Reaching the quarter final of the county and the final of the league cup just showed how competitive we are.

There are certain people I would like to say thanks to: Darren and Jack for all their help on a Saturday. They are always there when I need a hand on the sidelines and they also make the pitch look amazing and a great surface to play on. I'd also like to say thanks to Derek and Sylvia for cleaning up the changing rooms after us at the weekend. Also thanks to everyone who came down to support us- myself and the lads really appreciate it".

Reserve Team 2021-22

Played 20, won 4, drew 4, lost 12 = 9th place in North Bucks Div 1

Sid quoted: "a difficult season at the start with no permanent manager. But things turned around with lan 'Chippy' Smith taking the reins assisted by Dylan and Connor Bingham. The team grew through the season and finished strongly to stay away from any threat of relegation. Some new and young players came into the team and all played their part with a great team spirit".

I would concur 100% with Sid's observations.

I watched this team play a number of matches this season and their end of season league position does not do the players justice. A combination of regular team players being selected for the Firsts and non availability of players, would be the two main reasons for finishing 9th. When the whole squad is available on match day, this team can play some very exciting, entertaining football.

Vets summary

A slow start to the 2021/22 season from the Veterans, we struggled initially with player availability and injuries. We had one stand out result in the first half of the season, with a 1-0 win in Extra Time in the cup, over a Premier Division Team.

In the second half of the season, we started to get

players back from injury and fielded a consistent team. We made significant improvements in our performances on the pitch, although results didn't reflect it. We did however towards the end of the season, pick up the points that reflected the performance with our most significant result of our league season being a 6-1 home win. We finished the season in 10th out of 11 with 9 points, 2 wins and 3 draws.

We already have 18 players confirmed to play for the 2022/23 season but are always open to new additions. We need some 'young blood'.....!

Finally, the Club was recognised by the League, for it's culture and approach to the game, with the presentation to Great Horwood Football Club, of the North Bucks Most Sporting Club Award. See picture Page10.

Now onto other matters.

As a result of Covid, all fund raising events were missed last year and this has impacted our finances. I hope that we will be able to re schedule the Race Night and Junior Tournament in-the future. Having said that, we are fortunate enough (through good forward planning)'s to be in a solid financial position as Steve will report on later. By being creative, we have managed to generate some additional funds this year, by letting out one of the pitches on a regular basis, which we are looking to do again next season. We were also successful in obtaining a couple of grants which have been invested into the ongoing maintenance of the pitches, new senior goal's, new double glazing throughout the clubhouse and a Worthy Cause payment from the Parish Council, which was invested into kit for the U8's youth team.

As we speak, I am in the process of finalising and printing c20 Sponsorship Banners that will be displayed at the club in time for the start of the 2022-23 season and am delighted to confirm that both senior teams have new kit sponsors, so many thanks to Phoenixme and Taylored Kitchens and to all our sponsors.

Moving onto non financial matters.

We continue to benefit from a small but dedicated team of volunteers, who carry out the vital behind the scenes work of attending committee meetings, cleaning the clubhouse, general maintenance and grass cutting....without whom, the Club would not be able to operate. My sincere thanks to all those individuals, but a special mention this year to Jack Trundell, who is following in the footsteps of his role model (Darren 'Sid' Sirett) and apart from playing for the reserves and coaching the junior section, is now a key member of the club management team and deservedly won the Clubman of the year award at the recent seniors, end of season awards presentation.

Whilst mentioning Jack, he is planning a 'Job's Day' at the Club...sometime this month, in order to paint the clubhouse, replace old goal posts with new and various other tasks. Please support him, invest a few hours and bring other players/friends with you.




