



RECTORS VOICE

This summer has been a busy time for those of us in St James', starting with the Great Horwood Fête and Dog Show in July, which, despite a dubious start weatherwise, turned out to be a great success, following on from the earlier plant sale which raised much-needed funds for repairs to the north porch roof and further restoration to the church in coming months. We have been blessed by the return of many old friends to the church on Sunday mornings, and for overseas visitors too, including Spain this morning.

It never ceases to amaze me that many often assume that August is a quiet month in the Church, and go so far as to wish me a restful summer as the school year ends, not realising that across the benefice, we have celebrated 4 weddings and 5 baptisms in the month of August, and taken the funerals or burial of ashes for several others as in every other month of the year. 
