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Minutes of an Ordinary Parish Council held on 12th February 2018 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall, Great Horwood.

Present:

1.	To receive apologies for absence Cllr JRH sent his apologies for absence.
2.	To receive declarations of interest ■ Cllrs NH and GL declared their interest in item 13b
3.	Confirmation of the Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on 11 th December 2017 • The Minutes were passed with the following amendment. Item 2 should read Cllrs NH, JRH and GL declared their interest in item 11b.
4.	To consider matters arising from the Minutes of the last meeting (not otherwise included in the agenda) • None
5.	 Public Participation A member of the public asked about the new wall on the corner of Spring Lane, commenting that someone had already knocked themselves on it. The Local Area Technician had been asked to inspect the wall as it encroached the public footway. The Clerk is awaiting a written report. Aylesbury Vale Planning Department's opinion was that the wall came within permitted planning development. (Action Clerk) A member of the public asked about the running water on Singleborough Lane. The Clerk was asked to contact the resident to enquire about their progress in addressing the problem. (Action Clerk) County Councillor John Chilver addressed a question posed by Cllr JWG expressing concern that Bucks County Council Children's Services were rated inadequate. County Cllr Chilver had requested a response from the Executive Director of children's Services which forms part of these Minutes. County Councillor John Chilver advised that Bucks County Council had approved and recommended their budget, the first without government

0.	The Horwode Pece Management Committee report is attached to, and forms part of, these Minutes.
7.	Footpath Report a). A footpath report was received from Mr Robert Deuchar and noted. b). Mr Deuchar previously suggested two locations on Footpath 5 where wooden stiles might be replaced with metal gates. He felt, after further inspection, that the stile at location A (Grid Reference: 75833195) was adequate as anyone accessing it must be fairly fit and could climb over. He contacted the landowner of location B (GR: 75653203) who expressed a preference for a wooden gate. Bucks County Council do not supply wooden gates as part of their scheme therefore the landowner would have to fund it. The landowner has asked whether a grant of £250 would be available for such a project. The PC will make a decision at the next meeting. (Action Clerk) • Cllr GL advised that the wooden gates on footpath 1 were rotting and that the new metal gate had dropped. (Action Clerk)
8.	 Roads Report a). the latest reported road works are Traffic control in use on A421 at Fair Lorna Cottage and Hillside 11th to 16th Feb for water main repairs. Traffic control in use on A421 near Park Hill Farm by Warren Road 19th to 23rd Feb for safety barrier repairs Anglian Water works on B4033 until 15th Feb opposite Mill Farm. Road incursion is unlikely. b).MVAS and Speed Watch Mr Mick Wood reported that the speed for 85% of the traffic recorded on Winslow Road was 41.8 mph or lower. The Clerk reported that the new sentinel camera kit had been ordered.
9.	Parish Maintenance a). The Village Sign is back in place on the Green. b). Cllr AM offered 4 quotes for the refurbishment of the Village Green. It was resolved to accept the quote from Stokes Landscapes and to ask when the work could commence. (Action AM)
10.	To consider devolution responsibilities It was resolved to review the contract with Walker Grounds Care to ensure the Council's responsibilities were being covered (e.g. siding out). (Action Cllr JWG) Other responsibilities include maintenance of street furniture and cleaning of road signs. The Chairman asked for a list of village road signs and trees for which the PC is responsible. (Action MS) The Clerk was asked to re-distribute the devolution map to councillors and to check responsibility for road signs in the 30 to 40mph zone. (Action Clerk)
11.	Planning report The planning report was ratified.
12.	Issues arising from the Planning Report 16/00877/APP Land of Nash Road. Concern was expressed about BCC highways comments requiring a 1.8 metre footpath and 158 metres of hedge removal for visual splays. 17/01442/APP Land at 3 Little Horwood Road. Cllr MS had received an email from the architect asking to meet representatives of GHPC to try to find a way forward. Cllr MS has asked them to suggest dates. 16/03527/APP 9A Little Horwood Road. It was

noted that amended plans did not address the problem of development outside the settlement boundary and it was resolved to object to the revisions. Cllr MS will draft a consultee comment for Aylesbury Vale District Council. (Action MS)

13. Other planning matters

- a). The Horwood Mill construction management plan directs construction traffic via Greenway Business Park and not Spring Lane.
- b). It was resolved to commission a professional junction study for Spring Lane from David Tucker Associates. (Action Clerk). Cllrs NH and JRH proposed the erection of a traffic mirror to improve visibility for traffic exiting Spring Lane. The Clerk was asked to contact the Local area Technician (LAT) for advice on siting. (Action Clerk) Cllr JWG and County Cllr Chilver will investigate help with funding from BCC and the Winslow and District Local Area Forum. (Action JWG)
- c). A meeting took place with the developers of Land South of Little Horwood Road on 2nd February 2018. The PC welcomed plans for 10 affordable homes, the reduction in height of all properties to 2 storeys, the provision of propane gas for heating and external electric sockets on all properties to facilitate electric car charging. Cllr. JWG has received a very positive response from Pitstone Parish Council on a development that Croudace Homes has carried out in that parish.

14. Reports from Meetings

a) North Bucks Parishes Planning Consortium meeting 10th January 2018. Cllr MS circulated a brief report on this meeting b) Village Hall AGM 18th January 2018. Cllr MS circulated a brief report on this meeting.

15. Cricket Club Lease Renewal

The Cricket Club insurance is due for renewal and covers Trustee liability. Progress on the renewal of the lease is expected by the next PC meeting. (Action JRH & JH)

16. To update plans for a litter pick in March 2018

- a). The litter pick will take place on Sunday 18th March.
- b). Hi visibility jackets will be borrowed from the School and the Clerk would purchase 8 litter pickers from Amazon. (Action Clerk & JH)

17. To discuss arrangements for the 2018 Annual Parish meeting

It was decided to hold the 2018 Annual Parish Meeting on Monday 30th April. (Action Clerk) Cllr AM confirmed that the WI would provide cakes and refreshments in return for a donation. The lay out would be the same as last year but efforts would be made to ensure the display area is less crowded

18. To consider plans for the Battle's Over

- Cllr MS confirmed that the Craft Group were knitting poppies for the event.
- An exhibition in the Village Hall was considered but a request for material would need to be placed in Focus. (Action Clerk)
- GHSRT are planning a short fireworks display for the 10th November and suggested that children might be invited to decorate tea light bags for the occasion. (Action JH)
- It was suggested the PC approach the School and the Church and invite them to participate, as a sub-committee would be needed to organise the event.

19. To receive and note correspondence

- The General Data Protection Regulation is the source of much correspondence. GHPC is required to prepare for its introduction before 25th May 2018. In response, councillors have arranged dedicated email addresses, the Clerk is attending courses and councillors are being invited to attend courses. Guidance is awaited from Bucks County Council, Aylesbury Vale District Council and other agencies.
- Expressions of thanks have been received from GH Combined CE School, GH Silver Band, Winslow and District Community Bus, the Scouts and the Football Club for grants received from GHPC.
- Cllr JRH asked that the Fun Run on 25th March be publicised. The event starts at noon, however, marshals and timekeepers are need from 11.45 to 1.00pm. Volunteers were asked to contact Cllr JRH.
- Volunteers were requested to help the Buckingham AED project collect money on 17th & 18th February at Tesco's Buckingham Store.
- The Community Funding Fair will be held on Wednesday 14th March at The Gateway Conference Centre (12.30pm to 5pm)
- Details of the latest round of grants from the New Homes Bonus is now available and will be placed on the GHPC website. (Action Clerk)
- Cllr JWG regretted that he had receive no response from the School regarding the "Walk to School" scheme.

Item 5 - RESPONSE FROM TOLIS VOUYIOUKAS, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, CHILDREN'S SERVICES, BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The council is determined to improve its children's services and accepts the findings of this inspection. Whilst the overall judgement remains inadequate, the report does acknowledge improvements since 2014. This includes the judgement of our adoption service as Good. An action plan was produced during the inspection to address issues raised by the inspectors. Ofsted were confident in both elected members and senior leaders of the council to prioritise children's services. We will work very hard with our staff to implement the recommendations made by Ofsted so that children and young people receive a better service. This in turn should improve the outcome of the next inspection.

Horwode Pece Management Committee - Report to Parish Council February 2018

January is always a quiet month for activities down the Rec. maintenance wise. Noted repairs from the weekly Rec. checks are areas of the log-surround for both the toddler and teenage areas. These will be completed at the Spring working party, as arranged below. The concrete/paving of the bottom section of the ramp to the toddler area is a notable improvement, as is building the replacement ramp on a stone base. This helped to keep the new wood work above the water level, following flooding over the Christmas/New Year period. The path to the toddler area and the region between the toddler area and the teenage area were completely flooded, highlighting the need for improved drainage in this area – a task for 2018. Also, some large puddles were present in the middle of the football ground, following the worst of the rain.

The 68th Management meeting was held on 16th January at 8 The Green, Great Horwood. It was recorded that the autumn working party was very successful with all planned maintenance tasks completed. It was noted that the Parish Council had agreed to the management committee buying an electric generator, with the costs from existing funds allocated in the 2017 budget. It was reported that the Firework display made a small surplus – thanks to Jane Holland and team for organising this, the display was excellent and enjoyed by all who attended. The Recreation Trust Firework Display team are to organise a Jumble sale on the 24th February, in the village hall, with the aim of raising sufficient surplus that should the fireworks not be well supported one year the event would have sufficient funds to cover such an eventuality.

At the management meeting, two 'Spring working parties' were agreed. An early spring working party, for the weekend of 17th-18th March, and will aim to install the three picnic tables purchased late autumn, to undertake repairs to the log-surround, install new goal nets and complete some on-going maintenance to the zip-wire and other equipment.

Later, a 'Late-Spring working party' is planned, 12th-13th May, to concentrate on the soakaway and drainage issues. Also for the diary, Giocoso have agreed to play for 'Picnic on the Pece' on 10th June 2018.

One last item to note, Western Power Distribution Ltd (WPD) has requested permission to lay an electric cable on Recreation Trust owned land, down the side of the Rec., near the Mill, to the entrance-way of the Rec (this is to supply electricity to the planned housing development on the Mill land). The management committee was happy to support this, provided when installing the cable they would dig us a soakaway, whilst they have their diggers on site and also would allow the Recreation Trust electric access, without a standing charge, from the cabinet to be installed. Jane Holland will take this forward to the Recreation Trust, for their agreement, and once agreed contact WPD. We hope that the Parish Council can also support this idea.
