WORK PROGRESSES TO SET UP THE NEW COUNCIL FOR BUCKINGHAMSHIRE

It's now only 12 months until the new single council for Buckinghamshire goes live on 1 April 2020. It will be called Buckinghamshire Council and will provide all local government services for residents. The five current councils – the county council and the four district councils – will cease to exist from that date. Until then the county and district councils remain responsible for services as normal.

An interim 'shadow authority' is being formed to oversee the creation of the new council and all current county and district councillors will have a seat. However the first meeting can't be convened until the necessary legislation has passed through the parliamentary process. Currently we estimate this will be mid-May, but that is dependent on the necessary parliamentary time being available.

In the meantime, the county and district councils are working together to plan the work needed for the new council to come into operation. To help shape our plans, we'll be engaging with Parish and Town Councils in the next few months, more information to follow.

VALE OF AYLESBURY LOCAL PLAN UPDATE

The independent Planning Inspector has agreed AVDC's proposal to reduce by 1400 the number of new homes to be built up to 2033 in the Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan (VALP). VALP is the blueprint that will shape the size and locations of housing and other developments over the next 14 years and beyond in the Aylesbury Vale. This latest development brings the end of a thorough and complicated process in sight, with modifications to the plan being considered by the Inspector and, it is hoped, a public consultation to follow this spring.

The biggest change that the Inspector has agreed is to reduce the numbers of homes that need to be built within the Vale to 30,100 homes from the 31,500 he asked for previously.

AVDC is working on the detailed modifications to VALP, which involves gathering a significant amount of new evidence and revising large numbers of policies. When these alterations have been made and sent to the Inspector, AVDC hopes to quickly put in place a six-week public consultation. The council hopes that the plan will then be adopted for use by mid-2019, although this depends on the Planning Inspector.

AVDC is encouraging Aylesbury Vale residents to get involved in this year's Great British Spring Clean!

AVDC is proud to be taking part in Keep Britain Tidy's 'Great British Spring Clean', the country's biggest massaction environmental campaign, taking place between Friday 22 March and Tuesday 23 April. The aim of the campaign is to inspire people to work in partnership with community organisations, businesses and councils to collect and safely dispose of litter from Britain's streets, parks and beaches.

The Great British Spring Clean encourages local residents to organise a community litter picking event. From Monday 11 March, we'll be promoting the campaign and highlighting how AVDC can support community litter picks. This includes AVDC's arranging for all litter that is collected to be removed from a predetermined and agreed location, as well as supplying collection bags to support events, which community litter pick organisers can collect from the reception at AVDC's Gateway Office.

Last year we supported 25 volunteer groups, community groups and parishes in their litter picks and this year we're looking to beat that number to help keep the Vale clean and green.

MARKING THE DEATH OF A SENIOR NATIONAL FIGURE

AVDC has prepared a protocol for Marking the Death of a Senior National Figure, based on National Association of Civic Officers (NACO) guidance. Whilst the protocol sets out the action to be taken in the event of the death of H.M. The Queen, which involves the most detailed ceremonial duties, parts of the procedure can also be adapted for use in the event of the death of other senior local or national figures.

The AVDC protocol is part of the Buckinghamshire protocol which, in turn, is part of the national plan. It documents the formal ceremonial duties, including flag flying and reading of the Proclamation, in Aylesbury. For parish and town councils that want to make their own preparations, a copy of the NACO guidance and AVDC protocol is available on request via the Parish Liaison Officer.

The project has been carried out in phases to minimise disruption to customers. Phase one has been completed and the entire project is due to be finished by the end of May 2019.

Customers are already able to enjoy the new private showers and access the new disability changing areas whilst the Aqua Vale's unique tropical theme has also been updated. The next phase will see new toilet and shower facilities and new lighting to further improve the customer experience.

INCREASE TO MAXIMUM NEW HOMES BONUS MICRO GRANT!

Some good news for Parish and Town Councils and voluntary and community sector organisations! You can now apply for a maximum of £2,000 from the AVDC New Homes Bonus micro grant scheme.

Since the scheme launched in September 2017, 64 Town and Parish Councils and community groups have benefitted from these micro grants, using the funds for a variety of purposes for projects with total project costs of less than £10,000 and the purchase of equipment.

The total amount available in 2019/20 will remain at £80,000.

AYLESBURY GARDEN TOWN UPDATE

It's an exciting year for Aylesbury Garden Town (AGT), as we develop the Masterplan that will set out the framework for the future through to 2033. Alongside that, a longer term 'Vision' is also being drafted, establishing the key principals for the Garden Town, looking ahead to 2050. Both these documents will help to define what's special about AGT and will go to stakeholder consultation in May, at which Parishes within the Garden Town and adjacent to it, will be able to input.

A wide-ranging AGT public engagement process is continuing. At the end of last year a pop up exhibition was held in Friars Square shopping centre. More than 450 people dropped by and shared their thoughts on some of the key themes that are emerging, such as sustainable transport and green infrastructure.
