

A REFLECTION FOR AUTUMN

As the air turns colder after the record-breaking warmth of summer and the days start to shorten, we may find ourselves reaching into wardrobes for warmer coats, scarves, and gloves before venturing outside. The arrival of autumn reminds us that the seasons are shifting, and with that, our clothing must change and adapt to meet the new conditions we are likely to face.

Wrapping up warm is a simple, familiar act which is as seasonal to many of us as our first warm bowl of porridge in the morning. We do it automatically as the winter approaches, but it also represents a profound spiritual metaphor; for just as we must prepare ourselves outwardly for the winter weather, we are also called to prepare ourselves spiritually for the coming of Advent and Christmas which, believe it or not, we are already preparing for in church, by being "clothed with Christ."

In St Paul's letter to the Romans, he urges his listeners, and us as well to, "Clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ, and do not think about how to gratify the desires of the flesh." Similarly, in Galatians 3:27, he says, "For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ."

These passages speak to more than just a change in our winter wardrobe. They invite us to allow the transformation of our whole selves by becoming more like Jesus, so that as we begin to draw inward, seeking warmth and comfort as winter approaches by donning extra warm layers to protect ourselves from the elements, we also "layer up" spiritually by putting on the fruits of the Spirit: love, kindness, compassion, humility, and patience (Colossians 3:12-14).

These are Christ's garments which protect our hearts, our minds, and our spirits, so that if we cover ourselves in them abundantly, they warm both ourselves and the other people we come into contact with; and it strikes me that we need that warmth more and more as time goes by.

As I watch the news and see how fractured and divided our nation and our world is becoming, I realise ever more acutely my own need for the full covering of Christ — his grace, his truth, his righteousness and his compassion which like body armour, protects me from the many assaults - both real and metaphysical I face each day in the modern world, and all of us face together.

But being 'clothed with Christ' means more than just looking like a Christian or going to Church on a Sunday. It means more even than wearing a dog collar (the ecclesial kind of course!) It means allowing God's life and grace to shape and warm our lives from the inside out - just as a certain winter breakfast cereal is reputed to do.

When we get dressed on a winter's morning we ask ourselves, 'what should I put on today? A coat for warmth, or a hat for my head, or boots to stop me slipping on the path perhaps?' But we should also ask ourselves, 'what spiritual clothing do I need today?' It might be patience for a difficult conversation, or peace in a moment of anxiety, courage to do what is right in the face of opposition, or compassion to help a stranger in need.

That doesn't mean we are invincible by any means. Our lips may still chap, our boots may leak, and we may fumble to open our umbrellas with mittened hands. But we will at least, be as spiritually prepared as possible, no matter what treacherous paths or icy roads lie ahead. And there are bound to be some, because we cannot insulate ourselves entirely from the world and its affairs no matter how tightly we draw our curtains. It is always better though, to be buttoned up with Jesus at our side, so that his warming presence can light the way through the worst of the winter's darkness.

It must be time to go back to school.

As we say goodbye to summer sun and hello to autumn leaves, we are delighted to welcome our wonderful children back to Great Horwood C of E School.

As we always do at this time of year, we are thinking fondly of the pupils who have left since the end of the summer term, most of them onto the new adventure of secondary school in Winslow, Buckingham and further afield. We wish them all the best in their new schools, confident that we have prepared them as best we can for this exciting step during their time in Great Horwood.

We would also like to extend a warm welcome to the new members of our school community, with both new staff and new pupils joining us at the beginning of this term. Great Horwood is a special place to go to school, as many of you reading this will know from personal experience, from the tight-knit teaching and support team to the large playing fields, superb woodland area and extensive countryside views. This September is particularly special as it has seen the opening of our new Seedlings Nursery and Pre School, located in the Victorian School building at the front of the school grounds. The Victorian building, built in 1861, has undergone a significant refurbishment this summer, and we are delighted with the results, and even more delighted to see young children once again learning and growing within its walls. It is a privilege to watch our children make their way into the nursery pre-school, knowing that hundreds of other children over the last 150 plus years have gone before them, many with lasting connections to the village. We would like to sincerely thank everyone involved in the renovation work – we are absolutely blown away with the finished results.

Whereas in prior years we welcomed children from three years old during term time only, our Seedlings nursery and Pre School is able to provide for children from the age of two years and is open from 7.30am – 6pm 48 weeks a year (closed one week at Christmas, one week in August and all bank holidays). We accept childcare vouchers, tax free childcare payments, and 15/30 hour government funding. Please do get in touch if you would like to find out more.

Winslow & District Community Bus Needs Volunteer Drivers

The Winslow & District Community Bus relies on volunteer drivers to run all our services, excursions and hires.

Volunteer drivers needed now. If you have a D1 licence and some free time, please consider helping your local Community Bus.

Our Scheduled routes are

Aylesbury Market Bus - runs every Friday and Saturday morning From Winslow, through Gt Horwood, Nash, Whaddon, Mursley and Swanbourne, arriving in Aylesbury Bus Station and parking in our reserved bay.

Winslow Market Service 54abc - runs every Wednesday morning Picking up in the surrounding villages and then into Winslow, (Swanbourne, Mursley, Great Horwood, Whaddon, Nash and The Claydons).

Buckingham Bus Service - runs on the first Tuesday of the month Picking up in Winslow and surrounding villages. 1 hour in town then 1 hour in Tesco, or 2 hours in Tesco.

Westcroft Shopping – runs on the 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month Picking up in Winslow and surrounding villages.

All of our scheduled routes start at around 9.00am and finish around 1.30pm. We pay out-of-pocket expenses.

We also run our own outings visiting all kinds of places, including garden centres, stately homes, shopping centres and countryside drives. The use of the bus is also available to local non-profit groups

We offer certificated training to MiDAS standard

MiDAS is the Minibus Driver Awareness Scheme and is administered by the Community Transport Association. The scheme provides a nationally recognised standard for the assessment and training of minibus drivers and has been designed to enhance minibus driving standards and promote the safer operation of minibuses.

WDCB provide free training to "MiDAS "standards for all our drivers. A certificate is awarded after successful completion of the course, which is valid for four years and is recognised UK-wide. Candidates must be aged over 21 and have category 'D1' on their licence. The course is usually completed in a day, the time being divided between classroom and practical work. The latter comprises coaching and assessment of driving skills plus a briefing on the use of the minibus wheelchair lift.

Recently, WI committee members Debi Gale and Dee Albiston visited the Medical Detection Dogs (MDD) to present a cheque for £225 which was raised at our Fashion Show. Charlotte Richardson Corporate Partnerships Manager for Medical Detection Dogs was very grateful. "Your donation will help us to continue our important and lifesaving work of training Medical Alert Assistance Dogs, who are partnered with people who have a complex and dangerous illness; giving them greater independence, a better quality of life and most importantly, saving their life on a daily basis," said Charlotte. "Your donation will also help us to continue advancing our groundbreaking research into the early detection of diseases such as Prostate cancer and Parkinson's, and infections such as E. coli and Pseudomonas, by our incredible team of Bio Detection dogs."

The MDD are also starting a trial with their Medical Alert UTI Detection Dogs which aims to detect dangerous infections in vulnerable and elderly patients in the community.



Aylesbury Market Bus - runs every Friday and Saturday morning — from Winslow, through Gt Horwood, Little Horwood, Mursley and Swanbourne, arriving in Aylesbury just after 10am and departing 12.15pm. FREE with a bus pass, otherwise only £4.50 return. Drop offs at Sainsburys and Broadfields on request.

Winslow Market Service 54abc - runs every Wednesday morning.

This service picks up in the surrounding villages and then into Winslow, (Swanbourne, Mursley, Great Horwood, Whaddon, Nash and The Claydons). Pick up times vary according to village. Bus passes accepted, otherwise £3.00 return.

Buckingham Bus Service – Picking up in Winslow and surrounding villages. 1 hour in town then 1 hour in Tesco, or 2 hours in Tesco. Door to door service. Bus passes accepted, otherwise £4.50 return.




