Minutes of the Ordinary Parish Council Meeting held on 11th November 2019 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall, Great Horwood.

Present:

1.	To receive apologies for absence ● Cllr David Taylor and Cllr Nigel Heywood
2.	To receive declarations of interest Clirs AM, CC and JG declared an interest at Item 19 Worthy Causes and Clir CC declared a further interest at Item 11 other planning matters
3.	Confirmation of the Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on 14th October 2019 The Minutes of the last meeting were approved without amendment.
4.	To consider matters arising from the Minutes of the last meeting (not otherwise included in the agenda) ● Item 16 – The Clerk has written to Mrs Smith giving details of the arrangements agreed by the Council for Horwode Feast next year. No reply received yet. ● Item 17 – Mrs Jane Holland has planted the trough at Singleborough and will plant the other troughs shortly. The Clerk had contacted Walker Grounds Care who have agreed to strim beyond the 30mph signs in future so the planters are more visible. Croudace have kindly agreed to move the Little Horwood planter when Highways move the 30mph sign. As the timescale is unclear, the trough will not be planted for Spring colour.
5.	Public Participation Period A member of the public mentioned that the last time the verge adjacent to his home was mowed, the contractor left the grass over the pavement, causing the ground to become slippery. The Clerk will contact the contractor and request they tidy up after themselves (Action Clerk) A member of the Council pointed out that due to works being carried out behind the Chapel in Little Horwood Road and the house next door to it, mud was often on the pavement which then became difficult to use. Cllr JWG offered to speak to the new owner. (Action Cllr JWG)
6.	Horwode Pece Management Committee Report. • The Report from the Horwode Pece Management Committee is attached to and forms part of these minutes.
7.	Footpaths Report a). To receive the Footpath Report Mr Deuchar reported that Bucks CC have stated it will inspect the rotten sleeper over a ditch on FB8 at Singleborough at the back of Laurel Farm. There is only one good sleeper left but it can be used with care if you hold onto the hand rail. He has strimmed the metal footpath gates on various FPs. He is not aware of any other problems.
8.	Roads Report a). To receive a report on local roads and any problems with signage. Ongoing works on Pilch Lane up until 10 January 2020. Full details will be posted on the roadworks.org website and signs will be placed on the affected road two weeks before closure. A member of the public mentioned that Pilch Lane has been deteriorating badly near the entrance with the A421. The Clerk will contact Roadworks requesting that this should now become a priority. (Action Clerk) b). To include a report on MVAS. The Clerk has contacted Swarco regarding the terms of the contract and exactly what it includes. Swarco are happy to speak directly to Mr Woods with regards to the light and battery problem. A conversation may help sort out the matter. (Action Clerk)
9.	Planning Report
10.	 The Planning Report was noted and ratified. Issues arising from the Planning Report None
11.	Other Planning Matters Application no. 16/00877/APP – Land off Nash Road. A discussion took place concerning several issues, namely the crossing of the highway in a diagonal fashion from the new development across to the parking bays; the fact that the area in question is within the 40mph speed limit and also the proposal that a new pedestrian crossing point at the northern end of the current parking bay will take land which is privately owned by the freeholder of Russets. It was agreed that the PC would propose a much more appropriate solution. Cllr JWG agreed to draft a letter to AVDC Planning and Bucks Highways. (Action Cllr JWG)

12. Great Horwood Neighbourhood Plan Review Committee

To receive a report from the committee meeting held on 6th November.

The GHNP meeting was rescheduled to take place in January and it is expected that a report would be circulated for the PC Meeting in February. Cllr CC reported that a member of the public had asked that his land be included in any revision of the Great Horwood Parish Neighbourhood Plan. However, as it would appear that the VALP housing allocation had been met, this would not be a consideration. It was agreed that Cllr CC would contact the landowner after the PC had adopted the Review Report. (Action Cllr CC)

13. Parish Maintenance

a). To report progress on the Willow Road Allotment fencing.

The Clerk reported that the quote received to do the works was £50. All agreed the contractor should start the work to include building a retaining structure, straightening the post and putting the fence back in place. (Action Clerk)

b). To report progress on pruning of ash trees at Church Lane Allotments

The contractor has looked at the works. The Clerk is awaiting a quote and will chase this up. (Action Clerk)

14. To receive a report from any meetings attended

- a). North Bucks Planning Consortium (NBPPC) held on 23rd October.
- b). Aylesbury Vale Association of Local Councils (AVALC) AGM held on 2nd November.
- c). Bucks County Council Parishes Liaison Meeting held on 6th November.
- Cllr JWG gave a brief summary of the meetings attended.

15. Electricity Substation

Cllr CC informed the Council that the landowner had not come back to Cllr DT with a further proposal for the purchase price of the land. The member of the public interested in crowdfunding to purchase the land had not started the process. Cllr CC has contacted Western Power for an update on timescales and is awaiting a reply. This will be an agenda item for next month's meeting.

16. Worthy Causes

There were eight applications for grants this year (two from the Cricket Club). After a discussion, the following decisions were made: St James' Church – could not receive money because the Local Government Act of 1894 prohibited councils from spending any money on maintaining or improving Church property.

Football Club - football kits for Vet's team - £460

School - gazebos - £500

WI – coach for trip -£495

Scouts - outdoor equipment - £500

Winslow Community Bus - new seat belts - £566.40

Cricket Club - contribution towards patio - £478.60

Cllr CC informed the Council that the Cricket Club Lease states under para. 31: Trees – The Landlord shall keep all trees and hedges situate on the boundary of the Property cut and maintained. The Council will therefore not contribute to the Cricket Club's other Worthy Causes application requesting funds for the hire of a hedge cutter, as the Parish Council will maintain the boundary with alternative funds.

17. Increase for devolution grass cutting including Horwode Pece

Walker Grounds Care have increased their costs for grass cutting as follows:

Village verges - increase of 2.5%

Horwode Pece – 14 cuts per year at £80 per cut. Cllr JWG commented that with the mounding of soil around the play areas, the grass cutting could be somewhat more difficult and could require more strimming. There has not been an increase for four years. The Council agreed to the increase.

18. Allotment Agreement

It was agreed that the Clerk would incorporate the suggestions and circulate before the next PC Meeting. (Action Clerk)

19 Review of Risk Register

Cllr CC has looked at the Risk Register and thought that nothing needed amendment at this time. She did point out, however, that items 21 and 22, Councillor and Clerk training should be kept up to date. The Clerk will look for appropriate courses for Cllr JD and herself in the New Year.

20. Budget

After a discussion, it was agreed that amendments should be made to the Budget before agreeing to next year's Precept. However, the Council did agree that no funds should be allocated to the Horwode Pece account this year as it has a large reserve in a separate bank account which is more than adequate to cover the next year's planned expenditure.

21 To receive and note correspondence

A poster about starting school for the first time has been sent by Bucks CC. The Clerk will display on the noticeboard.

Horwode Pece Management Committee - Report to Parish Council November 2019

The major activity in October was the Autumn Working Party and in early November 'Fireworks on the Pece'.

The Working party was held over a long weekend 18th-21st October, first the three oak benches were treated with a weather proof resin (on the 18th), then on the 19th these were installed down the Rec. cemented into the ground with metallic anchor fixings attached to each leg. On the 20th the woodwork of the shelter was 'surformed' to remove any sharp splinters, the hedges were cut back and the Zip-wire adjusted to the correct seat height, removing slack from stretch of the Zip-wire. On the 21st additional pruning, bulb planting and groundwork completed a successful weekend maintaining our Rec. Thanks to all who helped.

The remaining work to complete this Autumn was a second resin coat on the oak benches and replacing the wood facia on either side of the tunnel. The pretreated wood for this has been purchased but these facia boards still need to be constructed and installed. Also, I have received a plaque from AVDC acknowledging the micro-grant sponsorship which we need to laminate and install on the notice board down the Rec. It was pleasing to see that the grass had taken and is growing well. The landscaping work has significantly improved the condition of the play areas.

The Rec. continues to be checked weekly. Issues reported in October relate to 'posts missing/rotten supporting the tunnel earthworks' (actioned above) and perished rubbers on the toddler swings, which has been noted for repair. All who inspect the Rec. have commented on the improvement that the landscaping has made. A number of them have commented that the woodchip level being low; it is still above the minimum level needed, but is definitely low, this is deliberate as the aim is to replace the woodchip with rubber chippings in the spring, when finance allows. Quotations for the work have been requested from local landscape contractors.

The most recent activity was the Fireworks, held on Sunday the 3rd November. Originally planned for the 2nd, it was postpone one day because of the rain and high wind. It was enjoyed by all who attended; fireworks, mulled wine, hot drinks, burgers, hot dogs and cookies.
