GREAT HORWOOD NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN Information Statement



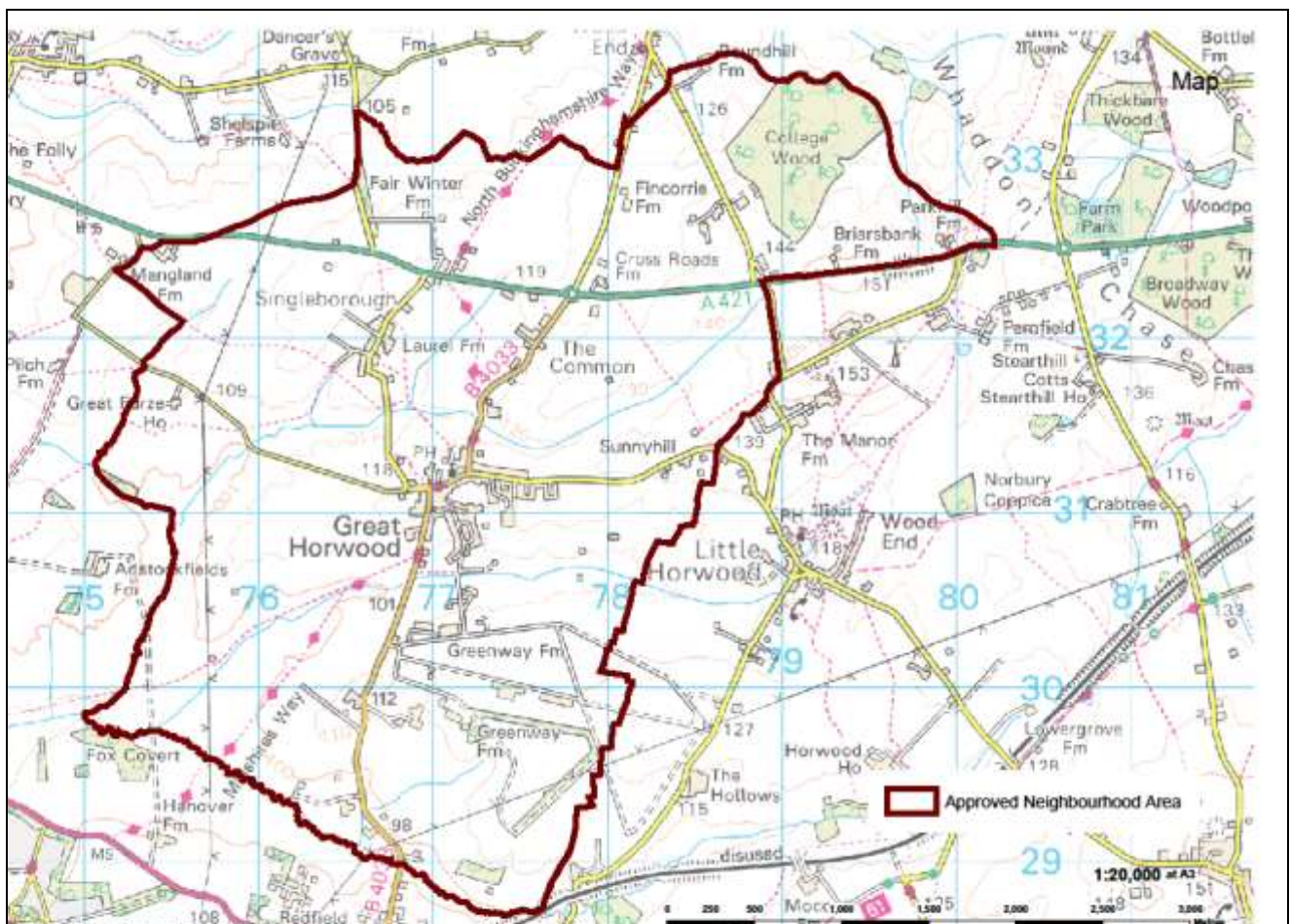
Referendum: 5 March 2015

A neighbourhood planning referendum will be held for the Great Horwood Neighbourhood Development Plan 2014 – 2031 on 5 March 2015.

The question which will be asked in the Referendum is:

'Do you want Aylesbury Vale District Council to use the neighbourhood plan for Great Horwood to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?'

The referendum area and the neighbourhood plan area covers the same area as the parish of Great Horwood (see map below).



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A person is entitled to vote in the Referendum if on 5 March 2015

- he or she is entitled to vote in a local government election in the referendum area; and
- his or her qualifying address for the election is in the Referendum area. A persons qualifying address is, in relation to a person registered in the register of electors, the address in respect of which he or she is entitled to be so registered.

The Referendum expenses limit that will apply (as at 26 January 2015) in relation to the Referendum is £2,410.97. The number of persons entitled to vote in the Referendum by reference to which that limit has been calculated is 830.

The Referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used at local government elections.
