A GALLEYWOOD QUIZ.

I recently had to research some of the early issues of *Past Times*, the first issue (No 1) appeared in February 2003; three years after the Society was formed. All of the issues can be found on the Society's website, which is managed by Ken Edwards. They form a rich compendium of the village's history – celebrated residents, buildings, streets and many reminiscences of the village in other days. There is also an excellent and comprehensive index.

- I also noted that in the early days of the Society quiz nights were arranged, the last one was on 8th December 2004. So I thought, that almost thirteen years later, it was appropriate that I present a Galleywood Quiz, to test your knowledge of the village and its history.
- 1. In 1250 the village was known as 'Gavelwode', what does this Anglo-Saxon word mean?
- 2. When was The Heritage Centre officially opened, was it (a) November 2008 or (b) November 2009?
- 3. In 1838 a building, which later became the village's first school, was erected for what original purpose?
- 4. Who was the celebrated singer of the 1930s 1960s, who lived in the village at various times during this period?
- 5. What was the first Christian name of Mrs L. C. Keene, and when did she officially open The Keene Hall?
- 6. Who was fondly known as 'Mr Galleywood'? He has one building in the village named after him.
- 7. Where was the first Village Sign erected, and in what year?
- 8. Which Park was officially opened in March 1971?
- 9. In which road was the first Post Office sited?
- 10. Who was known during his lifetime as 'Galleywood's Poet'?

- 11. Why is the date 29th September 1873 so important to the village?
- 12. What was the name of the landlord of the Admiral Rous Inn, who was executed for murder in December 1899?
- 13. In July 1993 The Common was granted the status of what?
- 14. Which was the only Galleywood road to be bombed in WWII?
- 15. Where is the replica Village Pump sited and when was it placed there?
- 16. Who was the owner of the first Galleywood garage in Stock Road?
- 17. When was the first three-day race meeting on the Common reported. Was it on 21/23rd August 1763 or 21/23rd August 1764?
- 18. In what year was the first Grandstand built on the Race course? Was it 1776, 1778 or 1779?

NUDIST COLONY IN BAKERS LANE.

It has nothing to do with the above quiz, but did you know that there was once a Nudist Colony quite near to Galleywood? Well in the late 1940s there was one such Colony in *Bakers Lane*, which is the first turning to the left off *Stock Road*; that was before the days of the A12 by-pass. The Nudist Colony was on the site of the now Temple Grove Park. It would seem that it was a very popular weekend haunt for Londoners and maybe some locals as well. Many cyclists went to the site to see if they could glimpse the fence; the Colony was guarded by security men or 'bouncers'. There was even a small brick-built shop that sold fresh vegetables and fruit and one of the caravans was used as a Spiritualist Chapel.

This information has not appeared in any previous issues of *Past Times*, but a note about the Colony was written In *St Michael's Church Magazine* in April 2008 by the Vicar — Rev. Andy Griffiths. He did mention that "a few of the children from the Naturist Community even attended the Junior School in Galleywood — in school uniform, of course." I also believe that two people, who have been interviewed for our Oral History project, did recall the Nudist Colony.
