SKATEBOARD RAMPS

Many people will have noticed the disappearance of the Skateboard Ramp on the Playing Field, which was the subject of some ill-informed gossip on Facebook.

The Parish Council have been aware for some time that there was a problem with the ramp and this was highlighted in at least one of our annual ROSPA reports. The problem was rust which was attacking the sheet metal surface from underneath. Small holes were appearing where the rust had eaten its way through. This was exacerbated by the foam which had originally been applied to the under surface, to deaden the noise. Once water had penetrated the surface through the small holes, it acted like a gigantic sponge which kept the under surface permanently wet and added to the rust problem. About 3 years ago, the Council had the holes welded over but this had little effect as new holes appeared.

Eventually the Council decided that on grounds of safety, the ramp had to be taken away before the surface collapsed (with some child on it). This decision was taken on a majority vote by the Council, not by an arbitrary action by the Chairman or Clerk.

The Ramp will be replaced. The Council will receive some 106 money from the new development which will take place at the Limes, and this has been allocated towards a new ramp.


On average 5, people are killed on Britain 's roads each day and speed is a contributing factor in around half of fatal road collisions.

There are those that believe that current deterrents, such as speed cameras, fines and points are not the best way to change driver behaviour.


Campaigners say education is key and that is the aim of Community Speed Watch.



I was extremely grateful that I had taken my walking poles with me !!

Whilst I felt an amazing sense of achievement I have vowed they are the first and last mountains I will ever climb !!


As I am chairman of the Gosfield Community Shop Building Fund I decided I would be sponsored and have raised about £800 towards the fund.

However the change of 'ways' began in the village with Rev Edward Burdon. He and his wife Joan were very much 'for' the village youth. I certainly recall MURDERS in the Old Vicarage....as part of the young communicants. We despatched him early so the game was all ours....the secret passage was great.....haunted ? No, but somewhere else was hmmmmm.

The Churchyard was not as large as it now is and I was fascinated by the glass domes with flowers inside ... they were everywhere. I have a picture of how it was and will search it out for a future edition. The Mausoleum can be seen but I cannot find that right now as my health is not good as yet again I have been left a month without medication. How I miss the days of Dr Rea from the Surgery giving a quick tap on the door and walking inMum used to say hello and to what do we owe this pleasure.....it continued into my own early married years but times change. So do the number of residents in villages etc. Halstead Hospital is hoping to survive and how we mourn the loss of Wm J Courtauld hospital and Black Notley Hospital so fingers crossed.

The Queens Platinum Jubilee will have happened when we get this magazine and I remember her Coronation celebrations and my mother explaining to me that is wasn't for me but I was allowed some friends to tea for my birthday that weekend and I was allowed to help make the cake my first. It was Doreen Jeggo's birthday weekend too. So Happy Birthday to us both but there will not be extensive celebrations at Gosfield Place for 400 or so villagers this year nor was there in '53 but there was in our village great celebrations of earlier times, greased poles across the Sparrows pond for the village men etc. and food for all.

Did you see the bit about our Windmill in the last magazine? I first learned of it decades ago whilst seeing a Chapman and Andre map as a teenager. Old Mr Vickers who lived in a tiny cottage that was later bought and renovated by the Osborne family and the plot next to them now owned by the Claydon family was once home of the Marven's he told me that their piece of land had 'bits' found on it relating to a previous century or even earlier when Sunnyside was built possibly a Mill he was told by an old builder I think that must be the location not quite the tennis courts

I am sorry to see that Joyce Lowe has passed away she was the widow of Ken Lowe who was evacuated to Gosfield during WW2 to live with Mr and Mrs Butcher neighbours to the Drury's. He loved the village and his hosts and his life was well lived with Joyce as Gosfield villagers. School children from the 70's will recall Mrs Lowe on their dinner breaks along with my mother and Eileen Woods. Games of rounders come to mind.

It is the month of May as I type and at school in my day we continued the village heritage of the May Queen and dancing the Maypole and so on. Memories of events are held fast and now children will hopefully remember what the Village has arranged for them. My Mum was happy that we didn't have to run to escape the geese roaming the road on the way to school as she did and my Aunt said she was terrified after being chased from the Lake by a Swan right up to the Church, so some things were better for mine and later generations. 
